I. Program Description:

The Minority & Small Business Development Division (MSBDD) works to facilitate the success of small, minority and women entrepreneurs throughout the State, identifying potential business and procurement opportunities. MSBDD promotes its programs statewide ensuring an increase in awareness, availability of resources, and activities to the small, minority and women business community. To stimulate entrepreneurship and job growth among small, minority and women-owned businesses, MSBDD provides business and educational assistance to its clientele through workshops and individual sessions.

- * The Certification Program identifies capable minority and women-owned businesses for participation in procurement activities of educational institutions, governmental agencies, and private entities.
- * The Minority Business database contains records of Mississippi's certified minority and women-owned businesses. MSBDD creates a directory, serving as a clearinghouse for information and resources, identifying these businesses for procurement opportunities.
- * The MS Procurement Technical Assistance Program (PTAP) is a statewide network of procurement technical assistance centers. This network, which is partially funded by MDA, the U.S. Defense Logistics Agency (DLA), local municipalities and economic development organizations, is hosted by MDA under a cooperative agreement between DLA and MDA. The network functions as an integral element of MSBDD. The network aids all Mississippi businesses seeking contracts with federal, state, local governments and commercial organizations.
- * The Minority & Small Business Development Division's Model Contractor Development Program is designed to educate emerging contractors, entrepreneurs, and those thinking of starting a small business the importance of good business practices. It provides a series of targeted educational workshops presented by industry experts and a bond readiness component. The Division offers this training free of charge to residents of the State of Mississippi with the assistance of local area sponsors. The goal of the program is to assist companies in building their capacity and capability which promotes bond readiness.
- * Mississippi's Minority Surety Bond Guaranty Program strives to increase minority participation in construction and building trade contracts with State agencies, local units of government, and their subsidiaries.
- * The Minority Enterprise Loan Program, along with the Micro Loan Program, is administered through the Financial Resources Division and promoted by the Minority & Small Business Development Division. These programs provide a funding source for small and large projects.
- * MSBDD promotes the Mississippi Capital Access Contract Loan Program that increases the availability of financing for borrowers, who for various reasons might have difficulty in obtaining working capital for a public construction related contract. A reserve account is established at lending institutions to act as a credit enhancement, inducing the financial institutions to make a loan. The program is open to small, minority and women-owned businesses, and provides interest free contract loans to eligible small contractors that have been awarded construction contracts on public projects or those having public incentives.

- Identifying and developing plans to expand capital resources and make capital more accessible to minority and small entrepreneurs

Funding allows the division to administer 30+ programs geared toward promoting economic development in the state. The Entrepreneur Center (TEC) provides Mississippi's entrepreneurs and small businesses with the knowledge and skills needed to build and maintain a successful business. TEC coordinates existing centers of excellence throughout the state in developing entrepreneurial ecosystems, which provide the resources to rapidly incubate new and growing businesses. TEC offers specialized training to retail businesses, and hosts seminars and workshops around the state to provide small companies and prospective business owners with technical assistance and "know how" needed for success.

Maintain contact and dialogue with industry and enable state and local developers to identify and meet the needs of industry in a timely manner. Promote growth in the state's business sector by providing management and technical services to improve company profitability, increase jobs and payrolls, and foster investment in Mississippi businesses and industry.

II. Program Objective:

The objective is to provide services that result in expansion and retention of existing in-state industries and the creation of new industries and to ensure that the needs of Mississippi businesses and economic development practitioners are met.

Name of Agency Program Name

I. Program Description:

The Energy and Natural Resources Division develops and maintains comprehensive energy management plans and programs for the State of Mississippi. The Division's programs are designed to ensure an affordable, adequate, secure, and dependable supply of energy, while promoting economic development and energy management in Mississippi.

The Energy and Natural Resources Division continues to explore energy technology commercialization and energy efficiency strategies to support its efforts to promote economic development, energy conservation, achieve environmental quality, and accomplish increased employment opportunities. Energy management is an effective strategy for many of these objectives. As Mississippi businesses become more energy efficient, their competitive position will improve. Practical results can reduce heating/cooling demands in public buildings, provide alternative fuels for private and public fleet vehicles, and aid cost-control techniques for commerce and industry.

Efforts are targeted to make industrial processes in Mississippi more energy efficient via plant modernization activities, deployment of new energy technology and energy awareness education. Free technical and competitive financial assistance is provided as an incentive to make community, public, and residential buildings more energy efficient. Education outreach activities promote energy efficiency practices through K-12 schools and civic/community organizations. Energy efficient transportation practices are encouraged to decrease fuel consumption, address environmental issues, alleviate traffic congestions and emissions pollutants, as well as, demonstrate the importance of alternatively fueled vehicle methods.

Energy focus areas include specifically: technical assistance to public entities, development and marketing of an Energy Efficiency Lease Program for public facilities, revolving loan program for deploying renewable energy technologies and upgrading energy efficiency in Mississippi facilities, assistance to agriculture and aquaculture sectors of the economy in sustainable development, energy education outreach and workforce development, energy policy development and strategic planning, innovative technology initiatives, alternative transportation fuel development and other transportation efficiency projects. The Division coordinates its efforts with the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency, Mississippi Public Utilities Staff, Mississippi Public Service Commission to ensure the security of the state's energy infrastructure and supplies.

Current services include assistance with oil and gas mineral leases, and rural business opportunities.

The Energy and Natural Resources Division will provide loans and other available incentives for the purchase and installation of energy efficiency and renewable energy measures to both public and private entities. The Energy and Natural Resources Division will enhance and establish programs to promote workforce development, increase the use of alternative fuel vehicles in the state, and install energy efficient building retrofits for public facilities. Funds will also be directed to towns and counties for their use with energy efficient and sustainable programs.

II. Program Objective:

The mission of the State Energy Program is to provide leadership to maximize the benefits of energy generation and consumption, energy efficiency and renewable energy through communications and outreach activities, technology deployment, and accessing new partnerships and resources. The Division works to promote that state's natural resources for energy development, encourage energy efficiency, support energy workforce development and enhance energy security. The overall basic objective of the Division is to ensure an environmentally acceptable, adequate, available, secure and dependable supply of safe, affordable energy by:

- Encouraging a diversity of energy sources in Mississippi with emphasis on indigenous source fuel development;
- Positively altering energy usage patterns in all energy consumption sectors;
- Improving the reliability of electricity, fuel, and energy services delivery;
- Promoting the transfer of energy efficient technologies to all energy consuming sectors of the state's economy;
- Promoting and sustaining economic development growth with improved environmental quality; and
- Impacting areas in: Economic Development, Education, Efficiency, Environmental Awareness, Energy Security, and Emergency Management.

Mississippi Development Authority 6 - Community Services
Name of Agency Program Name

I. Program Description:

The Community Services program helps Mississippi communities build their capacity to foster economic/community development by providing public infrastructure funding with related technical assistance and training. Through several grant and loan programs, the program provides funding to communities (municipalities and counties) for basic public infrastructure needs for economic development and certain community development projects.

The program's federally funded Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program provides grants to local units of government for water/sewer, or other public infrastructure that will benefit low- and moderate-income persons. The program also administers the HERA Act of 2008 Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP) and serves as the Basic State Agency for the Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC).

State funded grant and loan programs include the Local Governments Capital Improvements Revolving Loan (CAP Loan) program, which provides low interest loans to local units of government for capital improvements leading to economic/community development. The Freight Rail Service Projects Revolving Loan Program (RAIL), which provides loans to local units of government for freight rail service improvements. The Development Infrastructure Program (DIP) provides public infrastructure grants to local governments to support economic development projects. The Rural Impact Fund (RIF) Program provides grants to local units of government for economic development projects is rural areas. The Small Municipalities and Limited Population Counties Grant (SMLPC) program provides grants to small and rural local units of government for economic/community development related activities.

This program also includes activities for the ARC office housed in Tupelo as well as the Asset Development Division. The staff of Asset Development provide leadership training and require benchmark activities ensuring community leaders are working together toward common goals, and host economic development forums for pilot project counties to bring awareness of new trends and to encourage community involvement with the local economic development efforts.

The Disaster Recovery Division is responsible for administering Mississippi's share of the Federal Hurricane Katrina CDBG funds. The Division has worked with HUD to develop plans and submit for approval all aspects of the State's recovery program that is funded by CDBG funds.

NARRATIVE 2022 BUDGET REQUEST

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Name of Agency

The Mississippi Development Authority requests a \$2.411 million increase in General Fund operating dollars for a total General Fund request of \$22.5 million. This increase will restore General Fund reductions MDA received for FY2021 and provide an additional \$1.0 million increase, which will allow MDA to expand it's recruitment and marketing services, and increase promotion of the state of Mississippi as an economic development destination for companies considering locating or expanding in Mississippi.

An increase in General funding would allow MDA to promote Mississippi to site development consultants, as well as companies considering locating or expanding in Mississippi. With the assistance of the Legislature, MDA has been able to create a large number of careers and significant private investment around the state through the various programs administered by the agency. With no additional funding, MDA could experience a severe decrease in our effectiveness, potentially impacting job recruitment and creation efforts. Additionally, the ability to retain employees or attract new employees to the agency could also impact economic development efforts.

The MDA is requesting elimination of all State Support Special Funds (SSSF) for FY2022 in the amount of \$306,697,880. This is comprised of \$976,274 in Capital Expense Funds (CEF), \$179,827061 in Back to Business MS Grant Funds, \$30,207,000 in MS Covid-19 Relief Payment Funds, \$10,000,000 in Independent Schools' Covid-19 Assistance Grant Funds, \$65,687,545 of Gulf Coast Restoration Funds (no GCRF funds have been spent as of September 2020) and \$20,000,000 in Rental Assistance Grant Funds. These eliminations are reflected in Decision Unit: Non-Recurring Items, all major commitment groups.


