## I. Program Description:

The Board of Bar Admissions administers the rules of admission of the Mississippi Bar as adopted by the Mississippi Supreme Court. The Board's responsibilites include the preparation, administration, and evaluation of two (2) bar examinations given bi-annually in order to determine the fitness and qualifications of persons seeking to practice law in the State of Mississippi.

#### II. Program Objective:

The overall objective of this program is to provide efficient and timely application of the rules, testing and evaluation procedures to persons seeking membership in the Mississippi Bar for the purpose of practicing law in the State of Mississippi.

III. Current program activities as supported by the funding in Columns 6-15 (FY 10 Estimated & FY 11 Increase/Decrease for continuations) of MBR-1-03 and designated Budget Unit Decisions columns of MBR-1-03-A:

#### (D) Printing Exam Answer Bookl:

An increase of \$2,000 is requested for additional costs for printing Multistate Essay Exam answer booklets. The National Conference of Bar Examiners develops the Multistate Essay Exam and questions for this exam are purchased through them. Until July 2008, answer booklets were provided with the purchase of the questions. Because answer booklets are no longer included with this purchase, the Board must now absorb the printing costs for these booklets. This additional cost is approximately \$2,000 per year and was not fully funded in FY 2010.

#### (E) Information Systems Equipm:

\$4,800 is requested in the equipment category. Replacement purchases include two (2) desktop computers (\$2,500) and two (2) printers (\$500). New purchases include one (1) laptop computer (\$1,500) and a portable printer (\$300) for use at Board meetings, Character and Fitness hearings and national meetings. There are currently four (4) desktop computers provided to the staff. The remaining two (2) desktop computers are scheduled to be replaced in FY 2010. An increase of \$2,300 is requested for this purpose.

The Board of Bar Admissions has the primary obligation to administer the laws and rules governing admission to practice law in the State of Mississippi. The Board's efforts are primarily directed at the preparation, administration and evaluation of two (2) Bar Admission examinations (February and July) each year and the investigation and evaluation of the character and fitness of each person who applies to become a member of the Bar. The Board of Bar Admissions is funded from 100% special funds derived from Bar Admission fees. To date, the Board has been able to maintain its efforts from the fees it collects.

For FY 2011, an overall increase of \$4,300 is requested for the continuation of the Bar Admissions Program. A summary this request is as follows:

Personal Services - Salaries

A total of \$165,840 is requested in the salary category. This represents full funding for three (3) full-time positions; one (1) Administrator and two (2) Administrative Assistants. No increase is requested in this category.

Personal Services - Travel

A total of \$15,500 is requested in the travel category. No increase is requested in this category.

\$8,000 is requested for in-state travel to reimburse Board members for meals, lodging, and mileage for attending meetings in Jackson, as well as periodic meetings at law schools. Holding meetings at law schools enhances communication between Board members and the academic community, Bench, and Bar. The in-state travel request also includes Committee on Character and Fitness travel for attending meetings and hearings, which were previously budgeted as consultant travel in the contractual services category, as well as character and fitness investigator travel to conduct investigations, depositions, etc.

\$7,500 is requested for out-of-state travel for exam graders to attend multi-state essay and performance test grading seminars, and for Board members, Committee on Character and Fitness members, and staff. Board Members attend an annual bar exam Drafting and Grading Workshop, character and fitness investigators travel to conduct investigations and depositions, etc., and the Administrator serves on three committees of the Council of Bar Admission Administrators and attends an average of three meetings each year.

#### Contractual Services

A total of \$176,348 is requested in the contractual services category. No increase is requested. A summary of this request is as follows:

#### A. Tuition, Rewards and Awards

\$500 is requested for employee training for registration fees at out-of-state seminars and conferences and for computer related classes that will be attended by administrative staff.

#### B. Communications, Transportation and Utilities

A total of 14,000 is requested in this category. \$12,000 is requested for postage for mailing application packets

to Bar applicants, applications to the National Conference of Bar Examiners for out-of-state character investigations, rule booklets, certificates of eligibility and exam results, applicant's files to Character and Fitness Committee members for review, Board agendas to members, and general office correspondence; \$2,000 is requested for freight charges on commodities and equipment.

#### D. Rents

A total of \$42,400 is requested in this category. \$10,000 is requested for renting office equipment (copy machine, fax machine, postage meter, etc.); \$24,100 for Capitol Facilities office rent at the Gartin Justice Building; \$8,000 for renting conference rooms for administering the bi-annual Bar exams; and \$300 for water cooler rent.

#### E. Repairs and Services

\$1,000 is requested for repairs and maintenance agreements on office equipment such as typewriters, fax machines, calculators, and mail room equipment; postal rate updates; etc.

#### F. Fees, Professional and Other Services

A total of \$99,448 is requested in this category. \$1,000 is requested for support costs to Finance and Administration for the SAAS accounting system for charges associated with processing receipts, warrants, payment vouchers, and purchase orders; \$2,900 for MMRS Revolving Fund fees; \$300 for Department of audit fees for state-wide test work and anticipated annual financial and property audits; \$3,600 for fees to the Supreme Court for accounting and computer services; \$1,800 for legal counsel support provided by the Attorney General's Office; \$3,000 for physician services to evaluate the psychiatric/medical status of applicants; \$8,000 for exam proctors; \$13,500 for contract office workers to assist with processing applications, administration of the Bar exam and for general office duties; \$4,000 for court costs for criminal record checks on Bar applicants and court reporter/transcribing fees; \$24,316 for exam graders; \$32,000 for payments to the National Conference of Bar Examiners for purchasing the multi-state essay, multi-state performance test, and multi-state bar exams; \$3,700 for Character and Fitness investigations; \$300 to the Department of Archives and History for document shredding; and \$1,032 for employer social security match on contract payrolls.

#### G. Other Contractual Services

A total of \$600 is requested in this category. \$200 is requested for the annual tort claims assessment, \$200 for the surety bond on the Bar Admissions administrative staff, and \$200 for membership dues to the National Conference of Bar Examiners.

#### H. Data Processing

A total of \$18,400 is requested in this category. \$15,000 is requested for IS fees for web site development; \$3,000 for local telephone service, a telephone data line and conference calls; and \$400 for long distance telephone calls. The web site development will allow electronic applications via the internet, which will be interfaced with data bases for the Board of Bar Admissions and the National Conference of Bar Examiners.

#### Commodities

A total of \$15,600 is requested in the commodity category, which is an increase of \$2,000 over the 2010 appropriation.

#### B. Printing and Office Supplies and Materials

A total of \$10,300 is requested in this category. \$8,350 is requested for printed materials to include envelopes, stationery, Bar certificates and mailers, and exam answer booklets; \$300 for duplication and reproduction supplies, primarily toner for the copy machine and laser printers; \$900 for routine office supplies; \$600 for paper supplies as needed for the copy machine, laser printers, rule booklets, exam questions, etc.; and \$150 for office equipment that is not on inventory

An increase of \$2,000 is requested for additional costs for printing Multistate Essay Exam answer booklets. The National Conference of Bar Examiners develops the Multistate Essay Exam and questions for this exam are purchased through them. Until July 2008, answer booklets were provided with the purchase of the questions. Because answer booklets are no longer included with this purchase, the Board must now absorb the printing costs for these booklets. This additional cost is approximately \$2,000 per year and was not fully funded in FY 2010.

#### E. Other Supplies and Materials

\$5,300 is requested for food for persons and business meetings. This includes meetings of both the Board of Bar Admissions and the Committee on Character and Fitness.

#### Equipment

\$4,800 is requested in the equipment category. Replacement purchases include two (2) desktop computers (\$2,500) and two (2) printers (\$500). New purchases include one (1) laptop computer (\$1,500) and a portable printer (\$300) for use at Board meetings, Character and Fitness hearings and national meetings. There are currently four (4) desktop computers provided to the staff. The remaining two (2) desktop computers are scheduled to be replaced in FY 2010. An increase of \$2,300 is requested for this purpose.

## Funding

This budget is funded by 100% SPECIAL FUNDS derived from Bar Admission fees and interest earned on idle funds in the treasury. Effective July 1, 2009, these fees increased by \$200 per applicant. It is anticipated that approximately 350 applications will be received annually, which will generate an additional \$70,000 per year. The anticipated revenues for FY 2011, along with the carry forward from FY 2010, are adequate to fund this budget request.
