Explanation of Funding - FY 2011 Formula Implementation : On Campus

Instruction:

Previous appropriations have allowed us to lay the foundation for fulfilling our first responsibility and top priority in providing a credible education to students from every segment of Mississippi's population. This responsibility can only be carried out by increasing appropriations for instruction. In doing this, we will be able to hire 73 additional faculty members (\$6,073,600 salaries and benefits) and 30 clerical positions (\$1,036,800 salaries and benefits) to provide adequate administrative support. To fully provide credible education and improve instruction, budget lines for out of state travel (\$25,000), contractual services (\$250,000), commodities for supplies and materials (\$875,000) and instructional equipment (\$750,000) must also be increased in order to adequately enhance instruction with technology and facilities that enable the highest level of learning.

Research:

As a land-grant university, MSU has a fundamental responsibility to pursue research that is useful to Mississippi and the nation, building on existing strengths in engineering and agricultural sciences and pursuing emerging opportunities in other fields that match the university's areas of expertise and the needs of the state. Increasing the budget allocation for research will allow expansion of graduate research assistants (33 positions for \$ 719,000 salaries and benefits) and graduate teaching assistants (50 positions for \$ 1,033,200 salaries and benefits) by supporting the institutional components and infrastructure that enable beneficial discovery and application of new knowledge and by identifying emerging opportunities. Additional general support is requested for out of state travel (\$25,000), professional contractual services (\$410,000), scientific supplies (\$740,000) and scientific equipment (\$440,000).

Academic Support:

The most important thing Mississippi State can accomplish for Mississippi and the nation is to prepare our students to be productive citizens and effective leaders. We are committed to recruit qualified students from a diversity of backgrounds and economic conditions and provide mentoring and support in order to maximize their chances of success. Increased appropriations for academic support will be used to support these initiatives for success. Additional general support is requested for professional (16 positions for \$757,760 salaries and benefits) and clerical support (6 positions for \$230,400 salaries and benefits). Out of state travel (\$75,000), contractual services (\$590,030), professional materials (\$875,000) and instructional periodicals (\$425,000) are also requested.

Operation and Maintenance:

Flat-to-declining budgets over the past several years have resulted in deferred maintenance at Mississippi State University. An increase in allocations for operation and maintenance would be used for travel (\$20,000), contractual services (\$375,000), construction materials (\$900,000) and to replace outdated equipment (\$725,000) and provide adequate maintenance of campus buildings and structures. The ultimate goal will establish more sustainable buildings and facilities with improved environmental safety.

Scholarships and Fellowships:

Declining state support and increased expenses for higher education in recent years has led to a need to provide additional scholarships and fellowship opportunities. Increases in appropriations for need-based and merit-based scholarships in the amount of \$6,000,000 can help offset the negative impact of our recent economical status that is greatly affecting students' access to the quality education provided.

2011 Capital Renewal Request

Streets and Parking lots. Mississippi State University has a 20 year Plan for their streets and parking lots to ensure continual maintenance, however the need is now. Funding for maintenance in many lots and streets have not been adequate in years past and they are breaking down. Our maintenance and repair request is \$5,393,260.

Sidewalks. Many of our sidewalks are over 30 years old and many older than that. They are damaged, unlevel, sized improperly to meet today's student population and many are nonconforming to current American Disabilities Act standards. Maintenance and repair request is \$453,700.

Grounds and landscaping sustainability. For the past few years we have concentrated on improving our landscaping and grounds. Many areas of our campus that are not easily seen contain old, and dying shrubbery, and trees that are dying. We have experienced a draught for the past two summers and many of our trees died. When we replace or replant trees and shrubbery we will replace then with those that are indigenous to this area and require less maintenance. As well we will plant them in a fashion that the buildings that they surround can benefit from an energy standpoint. Our maintenance and repair requirement is \$400,000.

Roofs and exterior waterproofing. Like most universities, our facilities are aged and deteriorated. We have band-aided, patched and repaired to the point that the attempts no longer work. With all the equipment that is housed inside the facilities we must aggressively obtain funding for the exterior waterproofing and roofs for our facilities. Our facilities exterior waterproofing and roofing repair and replacement request is \$4,131,921.

Water and waste water system. Our underground infrastructure in many areas is the age of our campus (established in 1878). Our ability to support the needs of the campus is dependent upon our ability to ensure adequate utility systems are provided. Our request for water and waste water systems maintenance and repairs is \$1,200,000

Building systems. Our mechanical systems in our facilities are antiquated, noisy, inefficient, and do not perform as they were designed simply due to age and wear and tear. Many are repaired daily just to keep them running. Our HVAC, Elevators, Generators, Air Handling Units, and many other building systems need immediate replacement. Our request is for \$4,160,000.

Energy Management Controls Systems. Many of our old facilities have aged, non efficient non-existent controls systems With the skyrocketing energy cost and increase in total building square footage we have a constant need to improve upon our ability to control our energy cost while maintaining occupant comfort. Our request is for \$1,550,000.

Fire and Sprinkler system Maintenance. Many of our fire systems are in need of maintenance, repairs and upgrades to meet the requirements of today's Fire Safety needs. We have panels that are not modern, sprinkler heads that need replacements, pumps, detectors, and alarms that are in need of testing and repairs. Our need is \$1,150,000.

Restroom Repairs to meet ADA requirements. Many of our facilities that are in current use were designed and built before the ADA became into existence. While we strive to meet all the ADA Accessibility requirements, many of our building restrooms are not adequate. Some require ADA students to travel up or down floors to find an accessible restroom. Some are so small that there is no room for assisted students, faculty and staff. Our request is for \$ 500, 000
