NARRATIVE OF FEDERAL FUNDS AWARDED TO MCVS

MCVS ADMINISTRATIVE FUNDS (50% cash match requirement)

MCVS is awarded administrative funds annually by the Corporation for National & Community Service (CNCS) for the operation and management of national service programs in Mississippi.

MCVS is required to match 50% (pursuant to the 1993 National & Community Service Trust Act) from state monies for the administrative functioning of the agency. Federal funds allocated to Mississippi for January 1 - December 31, 2009 total \$177,367 which includes \$15,763 in supplemental funds.

PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE & TRAINING (PDAT) FUNDS (no match)

MCVS is awarded annually by the Corporation for National & Community Service funds designated for technical assistance, training events, conferences, and other educational activities. These funds are specifically targeted for AmeriCorps programs. Training is offered on a wide variety of subjects-i.e., grant writing, stress management, financial management, volunteer recruitment and retention, etc. Annually the number of participants ranges from 500 to 1,200 or more. MCVS received \$139,512 in PDAT funds plus an additional supplemental award of \$28,500.

LEARN & SERVE AMERICA (Community-Based) FUNDS (50% match)

Learn & Serve America Community-Based funds were awarded to Mississippi by the Corporation for National & Community Service based on three year funding subject to renewal after each three-year period. MCVS utilizes Learn and Serve monies to sub-grant to local nonprofit agencies for initiating service learning projects. Funds are dispersed to programs based on a Request For Proposals selection process performed by independent reviewers. MCVS was awarded FY 2007-2008 annual federal funding of \$87,217 for local projects. The match requirement for these funds is 50%. This funding ended September 30, 2008.

AMERICORPS COMPETITIVE & FORMULA FUNDS (33% match requirement)

CNCS allocates funds to MCVS annually for sub-granting projects throughout the state. MCVS is awarded funds on a population-based formula and through competitive application to CNCS. Funds are dispersed to programs based on a Request For Proposals selection process performed by independent reviewers. For FY 2008, MCVS has been awarded \$6,900,243 (\$837,892 in formula funds and \$6,062,351) in competitive funds), 99% of which is sub-granted to nonprofit organizations and governmental agencies to address unmet community needs in the areas of education, human needs, public safety/homeland security, and the environment. MCVS was awarded an additional \$2,665,238 in formula funding to support additional disaster recovery AmeriCorps programs. These funds can be used in FY2007-FY2010.

DISABILITY FUNDS (no match)

MCVS is an equal opportunity agency with a vested interest in furthering the ADA provisions as they relate to national service (PL 103-82) and volunteerism in general. With the availability of federal CNCS funds (\$72,000), MCVS is able to provide a continuum of services and technical assistance (reasonable accommodation) for individuals with disabilities and their host programs. MCVS is charged with providing individuals with disabilities in local communities the skills, resources, and knowledge necessary to assure the successful integration and retention of AmeriCorps members with disabilities.

During FY2009, MCVS received \$45,000 from CNCS for its Volunteer In Service to America (VISTA) project whose focus is disaster preparedness and response.

MCVS receives 1% in administrative funds for oversight of AmeriCorps grants. These funds are utilized for program monitoring, training and other related program charges.

Other special funds accounts are utilized for conferences, training or matching.

TREASURY FUND/BANK

TREASURY FUND/BANK ACCOUNTS

MCVS, in the past thirteen years, has generated funds through registration fees, donations, sponsorship of events, and private business support. MCVS hosts three annual training events which generate funds from registration and exhibitor fees. MCVS is also charged with hosting the annual Governor's Initiative for Volunteer Excellence (GIVE) Awards honoring exemplary state volunteers. This event attracts private businesses to donate and sponsor activities.

I. The funds generated from these events are accounted for and recorded in two separate fund accounts (1% Collections #3487, GIVE # 3478, and Donations/Contributions #3540). For FY2010, MCVS is expected to have a balance of \$99,291 in the two accounts. Since IHL is the fiscal agent for MCVS, the funds are maintained in the following account(s):

- II. MCVS, with the passage of House Bill No.1549 in the 1997 Legislative session, established a "Mississippi Commission for Volunteer Service Income Tax Check-Off Fund." The fund consists of monies obtained from contributions made pursuant to Section 1 of HB #1549. Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the end of the fiscal year shall NOT lapse into the State General Fund, and any interest earned on amounts in the fund shall be deposited into the credit of the following fund: DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION/STATE TREASURER ACCOUNT #3262 Special Funds (Agency #251). Current balance is \$59,601.24. This fund is intended to promote charitable giving/donations to help local communities implement service activities to address unmet needs and implement the State Volunteer Income Tax Check-Off funds as stated and approved by HB #1549 of the 1997 Legistlative session.
- III. MCVS established a Mississippi "Volunteer Y'all" specialty car tag fund." The fund consists of monies obtained from the purchase of the specialty car tags. Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the end of the fiscal year shall NOT lapse into the State General Fund, and any interest earned on amounts in the fund shall be deposited into the credit of the following fund: DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION/STATE TREASURER ACCOUNT #3277 Special Funds (Agency #277). Current balance is \$14,280.00.

I. Program Description:

In January, 1994 the Mississippi Commission for National and Community Service was created by Executive Order to promote community service and volunteerism as a way to meet local needs more effectively. Through the enactment of Senate Bill 2447 in the 1996 legislative session, the Commission officially became the state office of volunteerism, to be known as the Mississippi Commission for Volunteer Service (MCVS).

The mission of the Mississippi Commission for Volunteer Service is to engage and support Mississippians of all ages and backgrounds in service to their communities. MCVS is the official grantmaking and service agency to volunteer and community service organizations in Mississippi. It administers federal funds under the National and Community Service Trust Act which supports national and community service activities focusing on the four national/state priorities of education, health and human needs, public safety/homeland security, and environment.

To achieve this mission, the MCVS promotes coalitions and collaborative efforts among public, private, nonprofit, state, and local agencies. Also, through the advancement of community service programs and resource sharing initiatives throughout the state, MCVS addresses state and local needs in education, public safety/homeland security, health, and the environment. Since Hurricane Katrina, MCVS has also played a large role in volunteer programming for the recovery of the Gulf Coast. Direct and demonstrable results are being achieved through fostering civic responsibility, strengthening the ties that bind us together as Mississippians, and providing educational opportunities for those who make a substantial commitment to service.

II. Program Objective:

MCVS-IHL FY2011-2015 goals as outlined below will establish a foundation on which to build a unified service delivery approach which will enhance the educational, economic, and societal outcomes of the state of Mississippi. The IHL Goals and FY2010 priorities that MCVS will foster and implement are as follows:

Goal 1 - Secure stable funding from the state.

This goal will be implemented through collaboration with IHL during the Legislative Budget Hearings and 2009 Legislative Session. Funding coordination with IHL will enhance a unified approach to the Legislature.

Goal 2 - Implement the Ayers settlement.

This goal does not apply to MCVS.

Goal 3 - Provide high quality instructional programs that are affordable, accessible and student-centered.

This goal will be implemented through our AmeriCorps Education Awards, which provide \$4,725 scholarships for a full year's service in AmeriCorps.

Goal 4 - Provide support programs and services that enhance student recruiting and retention, timely completion of degrees, and attainment of student goals.

This goal will be implemented through our various national service programs in the state that foster student service initiatives and the AmeriCorps Education Awards.

Goal 5 - Encourage research and creative activities to enhance instruction, generate new knowledge, and contribute to economic development.

This goal will be implemented through our various national service programs and the numerous training and technical assistance workshops conducted by our office.

Goal 6 - Provide informal education, technical assistance, and other public services that respond to societal needs. This goal will be implemented through our various national service programs, the numerous training and technical assistance workshops conducted by our office, and the network of community-based volunteer centers across the state.

Goal 7 - Promote accountability, efficiency, productivity and effective utilization of technology.

This goal will be implemented through a series of training and technical assistance workshops, increased program monitoring/records review, and expansion of the use of technology in reporting and evaluation to include a process for electronic filing of reimbursement requests from subgrantees.

Goal 8 - Promote ethnic and gender diversity.

This goal will be implemented with MCVS' existing outreach efforts through public service announcements, media advertisements, state and local presentations, newsletters, website (www.mcvs.org), and other promotional activities that comply with the federal and state acts in relation to employment and service access. MCVS also has an active disability inclusion component which assists subgrantees in recruiting participants with disabilities.

Goal 9 - Enhance programs and utilization of resources by development of cooperative efforts and partnerships. This goal will be implemented through MCVS' existing policy of creating local partnerships, fostering joint ventures/programs, leveraging human and fiscal resources amongst partners, and building a unified service delivery approach. This approach has proven effective in hurricane recovery efforts on the Gulf Coast.

Goal 10 - Enhance public awareness and support of IHL programs and services.

This goal will be implemented with MCVS' existing outreach efforts through public service announcements, media advertisements, state and local presentations, newsletters, website (www.mcvs.org), and other promotional activities.

As a grantmaking entity, MCVS administers federal dollars devoted to AmeriCorps, the domestic Peace Corps program, which provides full-time members who work to "get things done" in local communities and who receive a living stipend and an education award of \$4,725 upon completion of 1,700 hours of service. In the 2008-2009 program year, there will be over 750 AmeriCorps member slots in communities all over the state. MCVS is awarded funds on a population-based formula and through competitive application to The Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS). Funds are dispersed to programs based on a Request for Proposals selection process performed by independent reviewers. For FY 2009, MCVS has been awarded \$9,200,033 (\$762,188 in formula funds, \$6,171,417 in competitive funds, and \$2,266,428 in additional formula funds for post-Katrina recovery programs), 99% of which is subgranted to nonprofit organizations and governmental agencies to address unmet community needs. The remaining 1% is used to administer, monitor, and support these local programs. The additional disaster recovery funding will be available for use through FY 2009.

In August, 2006, MCVS was awarded an additional \$140,000 in Program Development Assistance and Training funding to be used for disaster preparedness and response training for national service and other volunteer programs. These funds expired on March 31, 2008. Also following Hurricane Katrina, MCVS was awarded \$2,266,428 for disaster-related AmeriCorps programs, and these funds will expire on August 31, 2009. For this reason, MCVS anticipates having fewer AmeriCorps member slots for the period of this plan.

Until October, 2006 MCVS had also operated the Learn and Service America Program with funding from CNCS, which provided for subgrants to four community-based organizations to involve young people in service-learning and funding for the very successful YES! (Youth Engaged in Service) Program, a service leadership program which involved students from across the state. MCVS was not awarded these funds in 2006, but we were allowed to continue using the remaining funds in the grant through September, 2008. MCVS has contracted with a consultant who has developed a proposal to redesign the YES! program and to seek additional funding.

In late 2004, MCVS launched a new initiative to develop ten pilot Volunteer Centers across the state. Requests for Proposals were issued, proposals were reviewed by MCVS staff and Board members, and eight sites were chosen and began their partnership with MCVS in January 2005. The effort is a partnership among MCVS, which is providing funding for training and materials; the Points of Light Foundation/Hands On Network, which is providing training, evaluation, and other resources; and the Mississippi Program Office of CNCS, which is making available an AmeriCorps*VISTA volunteer for each Volunteer Center. Currently there are 10 Volunteer Center Development projects located in Hattiesburg, McComb, Columbus, Starkville, Cleveland, Hernando, Jackson, Gulfport, Vicksburg, and Marks. MCVS plans to expand the network Volunteer Centers to a total of 15 or more locations over the next five years. This work will grow larger as the volunteer center network increases. In addition, MCVS has helped develop Volunteer Centers on 5 college/community college campuses across the state.

Following Hurricane Katrina, Governor Barbour assigned to MCVS the operation of the Hurricane Recovery Hotline call center. MCVS staff, other volunteers, St. Louis AmeriCorps members, and AmeriCorps*NCCC teams staffed the center from September-December, 2005. Since that time, MCVS has worked on the Gulf Coast assisting with volunteer coordination, working with Long Term Recovery Committees, brokering resources for communities, developing plans

for reactivating the call center and other response activities in the event of another disaster, and bringing together the many groups providing volunteers for recovery efforts. It is anticipated that this work will be ongoing for at least five years, providing there are no more natural disasters which impact the Gulf Coast. CNCS also provided ten "special needs" AmeriCorps*VISTA members to work with Gulf Coast and other agencies involved in recovery programs.

CNCS routinely selects a certain number of states each year to undergo an audit by its Office of the Inspector General. The audit includes not only examination of the State Commission systems, but those of its subgrantees as well. MCVS was selected for an audit which began in late 2006 and concluded in May, 2008, with MCVS receiving a clear management decision.

AmeriCorps*NCCC (National Civilian Community Corps) is a branch of AmeriCorps which is a residential program at three campuses across the country. Members travel to communities in their region, performing services in a wide variety of areas including environmental projects, tutoring, housing, and disaster response. Since Hurricane Katrina, NCCC members have maintained a constant presence along the Gulf Coast and have been invaluable to those communities.

Since early in its history, the MCVS Executive Director has advocated strongly with Congress to create a campus in Mississippi, primarily because its proximity to the Gulf would allow members to be available for disaster response literally within hours. In the 2008 Labor-HHS Appropriation, Congress did include \$2.5 million in renovation/constructing funding for a campus to be located in Vicksburg. Staff will be hired in the fall of 2008, and the first members will arrive in March, 2009. The campus will receive an annual operating budget of \$1.5-2 million.

In FY 2008, MCVS brought on three new staff members to assist with the program management of the greatly increased number of AmeriCorps programs, to assist with the additional financial management duties related to the increase in subgrantees, and to coordinate MCVS' training programs so that current staff may devote full time to publications, public relations, and marketing.

For the next five years, the MCVS' priorities will focus on the six current major categories of Finance & Administration; Program Management & Development; Communication & Training; Resource Development; Volunteer Center Development; and Disaster Preparedness, Response, and Recovery. These areas are defined as follows:

Finance & Administration will include conducting subgrantee fiscal monitoring and evaluations; preparing quarterly financial reports on program activities in a timely and accurate manner; maintaining appropriate financial management systems to disburse funds and track commission and program expenditures according to legal and grant requirements; processing and reviewing monthly program reimbursements; evaluating whether programs comply with legal, reporting, financial management, and grant requirements and ensuring follow through on issues; reviewing audit reports on programs and ensuring that programs take appropriate and timely action; providing ongoing fiscal training and technical assistance to programs; ensuring grant compliance with federal, state, and local guidelines; and other grant administration duties.

Program Management & Development will include coordinating the grant review process to select high quality national service programs utilizing peer and staff grant reviewers; conducting subgrantee programmatic monitoring and evaluation; assessing impact/outcome results of programs' goals and objectives; writing and disseminating progress reports of program activities; conducting program site visits and review of records at least annually; providing ongoing technical assistance to programs; ensuring grant compliance with federal, state, and local guidelines; acquiring and disseminating national, regional, and local "best practices," innovative service models, and/or information to Mississippi programs; and other program management activities.

Communication & Training activities include coordinating observances of national volunteer recognition days on a statewide level; strengthening volunteer service infrastructure and maximizing resources in the state by collaborating with other governmental, private, and nonprofit organizations; developing and distributing a quarterly newsletter and a quarterly e-newsletter on service activities in the state; developing and implementing communication and marketing strategies; creating high-quality communication and marketing materials; assisting national service programs, Volunteer Centers, and other partners in identifying and accessing local and national training and technical assistance resources; establishing and maintaining a comprehensive updated website (www.MCVS.org) for resource sharing,

information dissemination, data collection, and training opportunities; and coordinating conferences and other training and technical assistance events for national service programs and other volunteer groups.

Resource Development activities include developing and implementing Board governance policies and plans; securing and sustaining corporate sponsors for MCVS programs such as the Governor's Initiative for Volunteer Excellence (GIVE) Awards, conferences, and other MCVS efforts; strengthening volunteer service infrastructure and maximizing resources in the state by collaborating with other governmental, private, and nonprofit organizations; building strong and lasting relationships through personal contacts with the traditional volunteer sector, the nonprofit sector, (local, state, and national) government, businesses, foundation communities, and the public; promoting the income tax checkoff to benefit MCVS as provided by the Legislature in the 1997 session; marketing the newly-available "Volunteer Y'all" license plates which also benefit MCVS; and acting as a catalyst for positive community change, encouraging innovative ideas and programs that address community needs through service and volunteerism.

Volunteer Center Development will include marketing the concept and benefits of community volunteer centers to nonprofit and government entities across the state, assisting interested entities in developing proposals for new volunteer centers, coordinating training and technical assistance for volunteer center staff and AmeriCorps*VISTA members, assisting volunteer centers in meeting standards set by the Points of Light Foundation/Hands on Network's Volunteer Center National Network, assisting volunteer centers with implementation of the 1-800-Volunteer.org volunteer management system and the Volunteer Mississippi.org website, and conducting site visits and program review to assure the development of high-performing volunteer centers.

Disaster Preparedness, Response, and Recovery centers on the appropriate use of volunteers and donated goods in times of disaster in Mississippi. Activities include ensuring that all volunteer agencies working in a disaster setting comply with all state and federal regulations, working in a coordinated and collaborative effort, and efficiently and equitably distributing donated goods and funds; ensuring that MCVS is internally prepared for a disaster that debilitates primary personnel, office space, equipment, data, and services; working in other states through the Emergency Management Assistance Compact should disaster assistance be requested; and ensuring that all AmeriCorps State programs are compatible with any disaster deployment plans of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency (MEMA). To this end, MCVS has been designated by MEMA to serve as the lead agency for donations and volunteer management in a future disaster.

During the past year, MCVS has seen reduced federal administrative funding as a result of with the depletion of PDAT Disaster grant and the suspension of the Learn & Serve grant. MCVS was able to regain use of the Learn & Serve grant later in the fiscal year. More general funding has been relied upon for MCVS administrative activities.

The Mississippi Commission for Volunteer Service is requesting \$1,208,233 for FY 2011. This reflects an increase over FY2010 in the amount of \$692,020. The additional funding will be utilized for the continuation of existing activities and expansion activities as follows:

Maintain the level of staffing to adequately support the programs of MCVS. Travel costs increased by \$19,570 in general funding. This increase will support additional travel costs as a result of higher fuel prices and the additional travel costs associated with staff training. Contractual costs increased by \$204,130 to fully support agency utilities and to fully support major program operation and member training events statewide. MCVS will have the responsibility of designing and implementing an electronic database system to track the program and financial activity of its subgrantees. Commodities costs increased to fully support staff needs and training events. A reduction in federal administrative dollars (Katrina supplementals) and the support the state mandated Disaster Coordinator position contributes to our FY2011 Request.
