#### FEDERAL FUNDS

This agency receives federal funds in majority from the US Forest Service. These funds are used in support of our technical assistance and educational programs provided to the landowners and citizens of this great state.

Funds received for Forest Stewardship enable the agency to provide technical information and educate forest landowners for the purpose of maintaining sustained and profitable forests. Urban & Community Forestry Funds provide financial assistance, help build partnerships by working with non-profit groups and other agencies and enable the agency to provide technical assistance on a one on one basis.

We also receive federal dollars in support of fire detection, suppression and prevention. These dollars support protection of life and property, annually many structures and forestlands are saved from destruction.

A portion of Fire Protection funding is utilized in assisting rural Volunteer Fire Departments in becoming prepared to safely protect rural urbanized areas.

#### STATE SUPPORT SPECIAL FUNDS

#### OTHER SPECIAL FUNDS

Severence Tax - MS Code Section 49-19-201 through 227 restricts the use of these funds for the cost share payments to qualifying landowners for reforestation and forest improvements. These funds are expended in the Subsidies, Loans and Grants Category.

Forest Acreage Tax - MS Code Section 49-19-115 restricts the use of these special funds for the purchase of fire related equipment. These funds are expended in the Equipment Category.

### TREASURY FUND/BANK

This agency has consolidated our petty cash funding from 14 to 10 accounts in a effort to control funding and monitor efficiency. This consolidation effort has resulted in a savings of \$6,000.00, reduced expenses and better utilized manpower concerning this area of resonsibility. In 1926 MS Legislature mandated that the MS Forestry Commission protect the state's forestland from wildfire. At that time, wildfires were consuming more than five million acres of timberland each year. Since 1926, great strides in wildfire prevention, detection and suppression have been taken. However, wildfires still continue to plague Mississippi. As an average, there are about 3,200 wildfires each year in Mississippi. These fires burn over 56,000 acres. As the financial value of timber continues to increase along with the increasing acreage of forestland, the Forest Protection Program remains a vital investment to the state's timber resource.

Forest Information program suppports all MFC programs by providing public information, program prmotional activities and program publicity. Urban and Community Forestry (UCF) assistance is included in Forest Information. UCF provides technical and financial assistance throughout the state in regard to the planting and management of community trees and forested acres. The goal is to manage and protect trees in and around cities and towns for the benefits they provide to people.

#### II. Program Objective:

Providing assistance to the state's Volunteer Fire Departments has had a great impact on improving wildfire protection in Mississippi. The MFC administers the Federal Excess Personal Property Program. This program allows the agency to acquire fire-related equipment for volunteer fire departments throughout the state. In addition, the MFC administers the VFD assistance program, which provides matching grants to rural volunteer fire departments for the purchase of firefighting eequipment.

Within the Forest Information program, our goals are as follows:

- \*Educate youth and adults about forestry, related issues and MFC services and programs
- \*Inform citizens of Mississippi of the threat to forest health
- \*Be liaison with other organizations and agencies in order to present forestry and related programs and information

I. Program Description:

Mississippi has more than 313,000 private, nonindustrial forest landowners who own 75 percent of the state's forestlands. The agency's Forest Stewardship Program is designed to provide motivation, limited on-the-ground services, technical assistance and advice to these landowners to help them make their lands more productive.

II. Program Objective:

The FRDP(Forest Resource Development Program) provides cost-share assistance to eligible forest landowners for establishing and/or improving their timberland as recommended and approved by the MFC. The MS Forestry Commission also administers the federally funded Forest Stewardship Program and Forest Land Enhancement Program. These programs provide limited financial assistance to landowners implementing specific forestry practices.

A strong, dependable source fo seedlings is necessary for reforestating land that has been harvested, as well as for converting marginal cropland to timber production. The MFC produces genetically superior seedlings grown from seed gathered from Commission-owned and operated seed orchards.

In addition to management responsibilities, this program includes prevention, detection and control of insect and disease epidemics on nurseries, seed orchards, and all ages of trees from seedlings to maturity.

Mississippi's climate and soil conditions yield some of the most productive forests in the South. These forests provide numerous benefits including a multitud of forest products, clean water and air, abundant wildlife, natural beauty, and unilmited outdoor recreational opportunities.

With forestland covering nearly two-thirds of the state, it is no surprise that Mississippi's economy depends heavily on the forest industry. Over 123,000 jobs in the state are forestry related. These jobs range from planting, managing, and harvesting timber to the manufacturer and sale of quality forest products. The total economic impact of the forest industry to Mississippi's economy is over \$17.4 billion each year.

Due to aggressive reforestation efforts, Mississippi has more forestland today than ten years ago and is a national leader in tree planting. Mississipp's abundant forestland supports a thriving hunting and fishing industry, which generates over a half-billion dollars annually to the state's economy.

The economic value of Mississippi's forestland has been steadily increasing, especially over the past ten-year period. This trend is expected to continue. In fact, it is possible to more than double forestry's economic contribution through applying sound forest management and protection practices on unmanaged forestland.

The Forestry Commission is responsible for several programs that are essential in protecting and managing Mississippi's valuable forest resource. In an effort to streamline main program areas, thereby improving the efficiency of the agency's management of primary functions and associated budget, the commission developed a new direction in program delivery. These programs are:

### (1) FOREST PROTECTION AND INFORMATION

In 1926 Mississippi legislature mandated that the Mississippi Forestry Commission protect the state's forestland from wildfire. At that time, wildfires were consuming more than five million acres of timberland each year.

Since 1926, great strides in wildfire prevention, detection, and suppression have been taken. However, wildfires still continue to plague Mississippi. As an average, there are about 3,200 wildfires each year in Mississippi. These fires burn over 58,000 acres. As the financial value of timber continues to increase along with the increasing acreage of forestland, the Forest Protection Program remains a vital investment to the state's timber resource.

Providing assistance to the state's volunteer fire departments has had a great impact on improving wildfire protection in Mississippi. The Forestry Commission administers the Federal Excess Personal Property program in Mississippi. This program allows the Forestry Commission to acquire fire-related equipment for volunteer fire departments (VFD) throughout the state. Over 1,000 pieces of federal excess rolling equipment have been located, refurbished, and transferred to local VFD since this effort was launched. Benefits of this program are evident through the lowering of insurance ratings for rural Mississippi and faster response to rural fire calls by local VFD. In addition, the Forestry Commission administers the Volunteer Fire Assistance Program, which provides matching grants to rural volunteer fire departments for the purchase of firefighting equipment.

The Forest Information Program supports all MFC program areas by providing public information, program promotional activities, and program publicity. The Public Outreach component utilizes mass media outlets (e.g., radio, television, and newspaper) to release forestry and agency information to the public at large. Local events and personal appearances are used to reach individuals at the community level. A variety of delivery methods are used in order to reach the public in the most effective manner.

Special events and projects provide the MFC the opportunity for promoting the agency's programs and messages and to co-promote with other natural resource agencies and organizations. Examples of special events and projects include: forestry field days, arbor day ceremonies, workshops and seminars in which the MFC has a key role, Teacher Conservation Workshops, natural resource summer camps, arbor day and wildfire prevention poster contests, etc.

The Minority Outreach Program provides assistance to minority and underserved landowners in Mississippi. This program has three primary goals: provide outreach support and technical assistance to underserved landowners, encourage young people to seek careers in forestry, and to work with Alcorn State University to develop and/or enhance projects of mutual forestry interest.

The Urban and Community Forestry Program provides technical and financial assistance throughout the state in regard to the planting and management of community trees and forested areas. The goal of the Urban and Community Forestry Program is to manage and protect trees in and around cities and towns for the benefits they provide to people. The MFC provides technical and financial assistance to state and local units of government, non-profit organizations, and educational institutions, as well as local citizens and businesses. The program also serves as the conduit, in partnership with the Mississippi Urban Forest Council, for information and outreach activities about tree care and benefits.

The Forestry Commission administers the following two financial assistance programs. The Urban and Community Forestry Assistance Challenge Grants provides matching-grant financial assistance to communities and qualifying organizations for starting or enhancing tree management programs and associated practices. Funding is provided by the USDA Forest Service. The Transportation Enhancement Tree Planting Program provides matching grants to any unit of state or local government for the purpose of planting trees to enhance transportation corridors. The Mississippi Department of Transportation is a supporting sponsor of this program.

### (2) FOREST MANAGEMENT

Mississippi has more than 313,000 private, nonindustrial forest landowners who own 78 percent of the state's forestland. Two-thirds of the land owned by these private owners is capable of producing more wood than it is now growing. The commission's Forest Management Program is designed to provide motivation, limited on-the-ground services, technical assistance and advice to these landowners to help them make their lands more productive.

In order to bring privately owned stands of timber into full production, it is vitally important for landowners to carry out necessary forestry improvement practices. The Forest Resource Development Program provides cost-share assistance to eligible forest landowners for establishing and/or improving their timberland as recommended and approved by the Forestry Commission. The Forestry Commission also administers the federally funded Forest Stewardship Program and provides forestry technical assistance for other federally funded programs. Some of these programs provide limited financial assistance to landowners implementing specific forestry practices.

The State of Mississippi owns over 500,000 acres of public forestlands. The majority of this acreage is found on School Trust lands (Sixteenth Section lands), most of which has been managed by the Forestry Commission since 1958. Many forestry improvements have been made on these school lands, increasing the productivity of the land and value of the timber resource. It is the aim of the Mississippi Forestry Commission to maximize timber production on a sustained-yield basis on School Trust lands classified as forestland by the local school boards. In addition to timber production, management considerations also include wildlife, soil and water quality, aesthetics, and other appropriate benefits of forestland. Timber sale revenue from 16th Section lands is used for the support of local schools.

Monitoring the health of the state's forests is a component of the Forest Management Program. The goal of Forest Health is to provide protection from insects and diseases affecting the forests of the state. In addition to protection responsibilities, this program includes prevention, detection, and control of insect and disease epidemics on all ages of trees from seedling to maturity. The Forestry Commission monitors forestland for insect and disease activity, providing assistance to landowners and homeowners in regard to forest pest identification and control measures. In an effort to promote economic development in regard to the state's forest resource, the Forestry Commission provides forest resource information and maps for economic development. A statewide assessment of forest resources

is maintained utilizing satellite imagery to estimate forest removals, regeneration and developmental stages. The assessment is also available for use in dispatching fire suppression crews. The MFC works jointly with the Mississippi Institute for Forest Inventory (MIFI) to inventory the state's forest resources. In addition, the Mississippi Forestry Commission is responsible for performing spot checks on timber cruising data compiled by private contractors working for MIFI.

The Mississippi Forestry Commission monitors the use of forestry best management practices. Findings are reported to the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality. It is estimated that some type of forest activity occurs on nearly 850,000 acres annually in the state. The Mississippi Forestry Commission works with landowners, forest industry, loggers, and others to help ensure that forestry practices do not cause water pollution as defined by the federal Water Quality Act and applicable state laws.

#### **SUMMARY**

Mississippi is beginning to feel the effects of changes in federal forest management policies in regard to timber cutting on national forestlands. The net result of these changes is increased pressure on privately owned forestland to supply more of the timber resource needed to meet the nation's demand for forest products. The programs listed above allow the Forestry Commission to better serve the public of Mississippi in regard to protecting and managing the state's forest resource.

The forestland in Mississippi has increased by two million acres over the past ten years. The value of the timber resource has also increased during the same period. The forest industry is vital to the state's economy; the Forestry Commission is vital to the future of the timber resource. Funding this budget request will allow the Forestry Commission to continue delivering important services and programs to the citizens and landowners of Mississippi.
