FEDERAL FUNDS

The Mississippi Insurance Department was awarded an Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program - Fire Prevention and Safety Grant (FP&S) which is under the purview of the Grants Programs Directorate in the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). FP&S grants support projects that enhance the safety of the public and firefighters from fire and related hazards. The primary goal is to target high-risk populations and mitigate high incidences of death and injury. This grant was used for a statewide Smoke Alarm Installation Program. It has provided free installed smoke alarms to nearly 10,000 households that are at or below poverty level. The total amount of the grant award is \$497,025. During FY 2009, reimbursement for federal grant funds totaling \$393,600 was requested and received. The remaining \$103,425 will be expended and reimbursement requested during FY 2010.

The Mississippi Insurance Department was awarded federal funds through Mississippi Development Authority's 2009 Katrina Community Development Block Grant (CDBG). This cost reimbursement grant will fund a project that will assist in the development of the Mississippi Wind Hazard Mitigation Program. The grant will be used specifically to perform a cost-benefit analysis for wind retrofit techniques, create a Mississippi Building Stock Model, evaluate Mississippi Building Code requirements, develop cost-effective wind mitigation techniques specific to the Mississippi Gulf Coast, and to develop a conceptual model building rating scale. During FY 2009, the Mississippi Insurance Department executed a request for proposal for development and implementation of a comprehensive and coordinated approach for hurricane damage mitigation. On April 6, 2009, the Mississippi Insurance Department entered into a one year contract for \$883,000 with Air Worldwide Corporation to perform a cost-benefit study relating to the development of hurricane wind damage mitigation program specifications. During FY 2009, the Mississippi Insurance Department expended \$110,000. The expenditures were paid with funds from the Mississippi Insurance Special Fund 3501. In FY 2010, \$883,000 in federal funds will be requested for reimbursement.

STATE SUPPORT SPECIAL FUNDS

The Mississippi Insurance Department does not receive State Support Special Funds.

OTHER SPECIAL FUNDS

The Mississippi Insurance Department has been totally special funded since 1991. The Insurance Department collects statutory fees, insurance company assessments, and penalty fees for violation of statutes and regulations. These funds are deposited into the MID's Special Fund 3501.

The Mississippi Insurance Department's Special Fund 3503 represents the funds collected from a tax of one fourth (1/4) cent per gallon levied upon any person engaged in retail business as a distributor of liquefied compressed gas.

The Mississippi Insurance Department's Special Fund 350C was established for the Residential Electronic Protection Licensing Act created in Senate Bill 2742, 2006 Regular Legislative Session. The REP Licensing Act allows for collection of licensing fees from Alarm System Technicians, Installers, Salespersons, and Apprentices.

The Mississippi Insurance Department's Special Fund 3500 was established by House Bill 1500, 2007 Regular Session, to assist the Mississippi Windstorm Underwriting Association with defraying expenses and costs for reinsurance under Miss. Code Ann., Section 83-34-1. These funds are to serve as a subsidy to assist the insureds in the Windpool.

The State Tax Commission shall deposit into the Mississippi Windstorm Underwriting Association Reinsurance Assistance Fund \$20,000,000 annually each fiscal year, beginning with fiscal year 2007 and continuing through fiscal year 2010. These funds are derived from insurance premium tax revenue collected by the State Tax Commission as allowed under the provisions of Miss. Code Ann., Section 27-15-103.

The Mississippi Insurance Department's FY 2010 Appropriation, House Bill 32, included an additional \$20,000,000 in funds derived from the Hurricane Disaster Reserve Fund 37SS to be used in conjunction with the \$20,000,000 from the Mississippi Windstorm Underwriting Association Reinsurance Assistance Fund for the purpose of assisting the

To date, the Mississippi Insurance Department has transferred a total \$9,205,263 to the Budget Contingency Fund. Senate Bill 2912, the Budget Reconciliation Act of 2008, required the Mississippi Insurance Department to transfer \$2,400,000 to the general fund in FY 2009. House Bill 40, 2009 Second Extraordinary Legislative Session, requires the Mississippi Insurance Department to transfer an additional \$1,500,000 to the Budget Contingency Fund in FY 2010.

TREASURY FUND/BANK

The General Account is a clearing account for Agency collections.

The Publishing Fees account is a clearing account set up to receive and disburse funds collected for publication of insurance companies' annual financial statements.

The Surplus Lines (Lock Box) account is a clearing account for Surplus Lines Premium Tax.

The Bail Bond Account receives and disburses funds deposited with the Agency by a professional bondsman as qualification bond under the provisions of Miss. Code Ann., 1972, Sect. 83-39-7.

I. Program Description:

The Mississippi Insurance Department, created by virtue of Miss. Code Ann. Section 83-1-1, is charged with the execution of all laws now in force, and those enacted subsequent to this budget request, which in any way affect or are relative to all insurance companies, corporations, associations, agents and other entities involved in the insurance business within the State of Mississippi.

As State Fire Marshal, the Commissioner of Insurance appoints the State Chief Deputy Fire Marshal who is charged with the duty to investigate, by himself or his deputy, the origin of every fire occurring within the State to which his attention is called by the Chief of the fire department or other law enforcement authority of any county or municipality. His duty is to investigate any case requested by any party in interest wherever, in his judgment, there is sufficient evidence or circumstance indicating that such fire may be incendiary in origin. Regulations governing the operation of this office are enumerated in Miss. Code Ann. 1972, Section 45-11-1 and 45-11-103. The State Chief Deputy Fire Marshal, regulates fireworks pursuant to Miss. Code Ann. 1972, Section 45-13-11; fire alarm systems for hotels, Miss. Code Ann. 1972, Section 45-11-29; training of county arson investigators, Miss. Code Ann. 1972, Section 83-1-39 (5) (b); and inspects private correctional facilities and buildings as well as private sororities and fraternities on state campuses upon request from interested persons, as stated in Miss Code Ann. 1972, Section 45-11-101.

By virtue of his designation as State Fire Marshal, the Commissioner of Insurance, through his State Chief Deputy Fire Marshal, is charged with promulgating the Mississippi Fire Prevention Code. These guidelines apply to all buildings owned by the State or by state agencies utilized for public assembly upon complaint, except in counties and municipalities that have adopted a fire prevention code. The Commissioner is charged with the enforcement of the Mississippi Fire Prevention Code and any other ordinance or regulation made under his authority, including the institution of actions or proceedings to prevent unlawful construction and to restrain, correct or abate any violation, and to prevent the occupancy of any building in violation of the Mississippi Fire Prevention Code.

Miss. Code Ann., Section 45-11-9, required the Fire Marshal's Division to develop and implement a Fire Safety Education Program for the State of Mississippi. This Program was developed and implemented in 2007.

Under Miss. Code Ann. 1972, Section 75-49-1 through 75-49-19, the State Chief Deputy Fire Marshal is charged and directed to investigate and examine engineering and construction practices as well as the techniques and properties of materials used in the construction and assembly of manufactured homes. It also allows the Commissioner of Insurance to establish rules and regulations on the bonding and/or insurance requirements as part of the licensing requirements for manufactures, modular contractors, retailers, and transporters of factory-built homes. Furthermore, the Fire Marshal's Division is charged with the examination and inspection of the electrical, plumbing, heating appliances, anchoring and blocking systems and techniques, fire prevention, as well as the promotion of the safety of persons and property and the protection of the health of the users of such manufactured homes. The Mississippi Insurance Department can contract with HUD to conduct installation inspections of factory-built homes and to charge a fee for said service provided by HUD.

The Commissioner of Insurance is responsible for the distribution of Fire Insurance Rebate Funds and Rural Fire Truck Acquisition Program Funds as mandated by Miss. Code Ann., Sections 45-11-7, 83-1-37, 83-1-39 and 17-23-1. Miss. Code Ann., Section 17-23-11, creates the Supplementary Rural Fire Truck Program which is administered by the Insurance Department's Fire Services Division. House Bill 1465, 2008 Regular Legislative Session, amends Miss. Code Ann. 1972, Sections 83-1-37 and 83-1-39 to establish funding through the Municipal and County fire rebate programs to assist counties with training of personnel to conduct building code inspections.

Miss. Code Ann., Section 45-11-251 mandates administrative support to the Mississippi Fire Personnel Minimum Standards & Certification Board.

Miss. Code Ann., Section 73-69-1, established the Residential Electronic Protection Licensing Act to license & regulate the Residential Electronic Protection Industry.

Miss. Code Ann., Section 17-2-1, requires Jackson, Harrison, Hancock, Stone and Pearl River Counties, and municipalities to enforce wind and flood mitigation requirements prescribed by the 2003 International Residential Code and the 2003 International Building Code. Miss. Code Ann., Section 17-2-3, created the twenty-six (26) member Mississippi Building Codes Council. The State Fire Marshal or his designee is required to serve ex officio, to convene the first meeting of the council and to serve as the temporary chairman. House Bill 1465, 2008 Regular Legislative Session, amends Miss. Code Ann. 1972, Section 17-2-5 to establish that any county or municipality adopting building

codes after July 1, 2008, must adopt at a minimum the Mississippi Building Codes. Any county or municipality that had adopted a version of building codes earlier than January 1, 2000, must adopt the Mississippi Building Codes by July 1, 2010.

Miss. Code Ann. 1972, Section 83-21-21 has been amended to allow the Mississippi Insurance Department to contract with a third party to assist with the regulation of surplus lines companies in lieu of the Mississippi Surplus Lines Association.

Miss. Code Ann., Section 83-1-191, established a Comprehensive Hurricane Damage Mitigation Program within the Mississippi Insurance Department. The program is to develop and implement a comprehensive and coordinated approach for hurricane damage mitigation that includes: a cost-benefit study on wind hazard mitigation construction measures; wind certification and hurricane mitigation inspections; financial grants to retrofit properties; education and consumer awareness; an advisory council consisting of a representative of lending institutions, an agent selected by the Independent Insurance Agents of Mississippi, two (2) representatives of residential property insurers, a representative of homebuilders, a faculty member of a state university, two (2) members of the House of Representatives and two (2) members of the Senate, the Executive Director of the Mississippi Windstorm Underwriting Association, and the Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency; and rules and regulations governing the Program.

House Bill 777, 2009 Regular Legislative Session, amends Miss. Code Ann., Sections 27-15-85, 27-15-87, 27-15-89, 27-15-91, 83-17-1, 83-17-25, 83-17-53, 83-17-61, 83-17-63, 83-17-65, 83-17-251, 83-17-253, 83-17-255, 83-17-257, 83-21-19, and 27-15-101, and repealed the following Miss. Code Ann., Sections 27-15-95, 27-15-99, and 83-17-43. The objective of House Bill 777 is to provide national uniformity with regard to insurance producer licensing. It implements new license periods and requirements for all newly created license types and a majority of existing license types issued by the Mississippi Insurance Department.

Senate Bill 2249, 2009 Regular Legislative Session, known as the "Mississippi Fire Safety Standard and Firefighter Protection Act", requires cigarette manufacturers to certify with the State Fire Marshal's Office that the cigarette paper used in manufacturing meets the adopted lowered permeability bands requirements. The State Fire Marshal's Office shall conduct certification testing to ensure compliance. For each brand family of cigarettes listed for certification, a manufacturer shall pay a fee of \$1,000 to the State Fire Marshal's Office which will be placed in the Cigarette Fire Safety Standard and Firefighter Protection Fund. During FY 2010, the Mississippi Insurance Department was appropriated \$250,000, of which \$200,000 in the commodity category to be used for fire prevention supplies and materials, and to fund the purchase of smoke alarms, and \$50,000 in the contractual category to be used for public announcements providing fire prevention information. The same is being requested for FY 2011.

Senate Bill 2841, 2009 Regular Legislative Session, enacted the Interstate Insurance Product Regulation Compact. This compact means joint and cooperative action among Compacting States to: promote and protect the interest of consumers of individual and group annuity, life insurance, disability income and long-term care insurance products; develop uniform standards for insurance products covered under the Compact; establish a central clearinghouse to receive and provide prompt review of insurance products covered under the Compacts, in certain cases, advertisements related thereto, submitted by insurers authorized to do business in one or more Compacting States; give appropriate regulatory approval to those product findings and advertisements satisfying the applicable uniform standard; improve coordination of regulatory resources and expertise between state insurance departments; create the Insurance Product Regulation Commission; and to perform these and such other related functions as may be consistent with the state regulation of the business of insurance.

Senate Bill 2843, 2009 Regular Legislative Session, amended Miss. Code Ann., Section 83-1-191, extending the repealer to July 1, 2012, on the provision which establishes a Comprehensive Hurricane Damage Mitigation Program, and establishes additional requirements for an entity to be selected as a provider of wind certification and hurricane inspection review services. In FY 2009, Air Worldwide Corporation through the bid process was selected as the provider.

II. Program Objective:

The mission of the Mississippi Insurance Department is to provide the proper regulation of the insurance industry while creating an environment conducive to a competitive marketplace for the sale of insurance products while providing the maximum amount of consumer protection to the State's citizens and policyholders. Our aim is to facilitate the highest degree of economic security, quality of life, public safety and protection for the State's citizens at the lowest possible cost.

The State Fire Marshal's Division implements programs to decrease the number of fires across the State, particularly arson related fires. The office ensures that manufactured housing is safe and meets required quality standards. The Fire Marshal also works to ensure a safe building environment, free from fire hazards, and collects fire loss data to assist in the development of improved standards. The State Fire Marshal's Division implemented a Fire Safety Education Program during Fiscal Year 2007. The Fire Marshal regulates and licenses the Residential Electronic Protection Industry.

Within the State Fire Marshal's Division, the State Fire Services Development Coordinator takes a proactive role in fire prevention by assisting fire departments across the State in confronting and overcoming problems related to manpower and funding resources. These reductions translate into economic benefits by reducing the cost of residential, commercial and industrial insurance coverage for all of the State's citizens.

- III. Current program activities as supported by the funding in Columns 6-15 (FY 10 Estimated & FY 11 Increase/Decrease for continuations) of MBR-1-03 and designated Budget Unit Decisions columns of MBR-1-03-A:
- (C) Non-Recurring Expenses:

All non recurring items reflected are one-time federal funding grants awarded to the Mississippi Insurance Department.

(D) Continuation of Existing A:

Continuation of existing activities for this program reflects an overall increase. This request includes a SPB approved auto reclass totaling \$58,398, and thirty-two (32) educational benchmarks totaling \$65,421. Nine (9) upward reallocations totaling \$62,527 are requested as follows: One (1) Administrative Services Division, One (1) IS Division, One (1) Statutory Compliance Division, and Six (6) Licensing Division. Special compensation/experience benchmarks are requested totaling \$21,435.

The Contractual Category is requesting an increase to cover increased rents on permanent record storage, repairs and service items including maintenance for a replacement folder/inserter, fees, professional and other services including increased costs for both actuarial and legal services. Data Processing has an increase associated with Cellular Usage Time - Outside Vendor due to a request for ten (10) additional Blackberry Smartphones for members of the Legal Division and the Financial and Market Regulation Division who will be out of the office to perform examination and investigative functions for the Agency.

The Commodities Category has an increase request of \$20,000 due to the need for additional educational supplies used in the Fire Safety Education Program created by the Mississippi Legislature in 2004.

The Equipment Category has an overall increase of \$17,278, including a request for replacement desks/credenzas, a replacement folder/inserter machine, and seven (7) new Hydrocarbon detectors for LC Gas Inspectors. A decrease in IS Equipment and handgun replacement allows for the small increase.

The vehicle category has decreased as five (5) less vehicles are requested in FY 2011.

I. Program Description:

Section 75-57-3, Miss. Code Ann., vests the Commissioner of Insurance with the sole and exclusive power and authority to administer and enforce such laws which include inspecting any liquefied compressed gas containers, systems, pump equipment, tank cars, storage tanks, or vehicles in which any liquefied compressed gas is present. The Agency is required to enforce the rules of L. P. Gas Code NFPA 58, 2004 edition, National Fuel Gas Code, NFPA 54, 2002 edition, and The Mississippi Liquefied Compressed Gas Rules and Regulations dated August 22, 1996.

The L. C. Gas Board is created to regulate matters pertaining to Liquefied Compressed Gas. The L. C. Gas Division inspects schools that use propane and places where the public meets or gathers. In addition to this, the L. C. Gas Division inspects annually propane bulk plants, cylinder dispensing plants, cargo vehicles and public, commercial, and domestic installations as deemed necessary. The division holds safety and code training seminars throughout the year.

II. Program Objective:

To administer and enforce the Liquefied Compressed Gas Equipment Inspection Laws, Miss. Code, Sections 75-57-1 through 75-57-119, L. P. House Bill 1500, 2007 Regular Session, known as the "Mississippi Economic Growth and Redevelopment Act of 2007, created a special fund known as the "Mississippi Windstorm Underwriting Association Reinsurance Assistance Fund". This fund was created to assist the Mississippi Windstorm Underwriting Association, which was created by Chapter 450, Laws of 1987, with defraying of expenses and costs for reinsurance under Miss. Code Ann., Section 83-34-1.

The State Tax Commission shall deposit into the Mississippi Windstorm Underwriting Association Reinsurance Assistance Fund \$20,000,000 annually each fiscal year, beginning with fiscal year 2007 and continuing through fiscal year 2010. These funds are derived from insurance premium tax revenue collected by the State Tax Commission as allowed under the provisions of Miss. Code Ann., Section 27-15-103.

The Mississippi Insurance Department's FY 2010 Appropriation, House Bill 32, included an additional \$20,000,000 in funds derived from the Hurricane Disaster Reserve Fund 37SS to be used in conjunction with the \$20,000,000 from the Mississippi Windstorm Underwriting Association Reinsurance Assistance Fund for the purpose of defraying the expenses of windstorm reinsurance.

The Mississippi Insurance Department's objective is to assist with the reduction of premium rates charged for insuring property through the Mississippi Windstorm Underwriting Association for the coastal area counties including Hancock, Harrison, Jackson, Pearl River, Stone and George. OVERVIEW OF BUDGET REQUEST

In order to fulfill the Mississippi Insurance Department's mission and effectively implement laws and regulations necessary for the oversight of the insurance industry, the Agency is requesting the funds necessary continue providing the services mandated by law.

The Mississippi Insurance Department became a lump sum agency in FY 2009, and is requesting to remain a lump sum agency for FY 2011.

The Mississippi Insurance Department's estimate of funds needed for the continuation and expansion of existing activities for this program reflects an overall increase of \$703,563, in Personal Services, Contractual, Commodities, and Equipment.

I.A. - PERSONAL SERVICES: INCREASE \$ 652,909

I.A.1.a. - PERSONAL SERVICES: (Additional Compensation)

NEW POSITIONS Increase \$ 111,892

Two (2) new positions are requested:

- One (1) Insurance Examiner I for the Internship Program authorized in House Bill 32, Section 12, of the Mississippi Insurance Department's appropriation.
- One (1) Insurance Examiner IV to perform on-site examinations of small insurance companies. The Regulation Division will invoice the small insurance company for the cost of the exam, as prescribed in 83-5-207, thus offsetting this position's salary.

UPWARD REALLOCATIONS: Increase \$ 62,527

Nine (9) upward reallocations are requested:

- One (1) Administrative Services Division due to material changes to position responsibilities. (Approved in FY 2010 / No Funding)
- One (1) IS Division due to increased duties, responsibilities, complexities of multiple technologies and different methodologies meet the growing demands of the Agency. (Approved in FY 2010 / No Funding)
- One (1) Statutory Compliance Division due to material changes to position responsibilities.
- Six (6) Licensing Division due to expanded workload and changes required by NAIC.

RECLASSIFICATIONS: Increase \$ 58.398

Ten (10) auto-reclassifications:

- Four (4) Fire Marshal I, Deputy to Fire Marshal II, Deputy
- Five (5) License/Registration Agent I to License/Registration Agent II
- One (1) Insurance Examiner III to Insurance Examiner IV

The auto-reclassifications above are currently approved by SPB's authority list.

EDUCATIONAL BENCHMARKS: Increase \$ 65,421

Thirty-two (32) Educational Benchmarks are requested. The NAIC accreditation requires the Examination Division staff to obtain & maintain the designation levels of Accredited Financial Examiner (AFE), Certified Financial Examiner (CFE), Accredited Financial Examiner (ACIEX), & the Certified Insurance Examiner (CIE) in order to function in their positions. These positions will acquire certifications during FY 2011. All additional benchmarks are requested in order to award staff for obtaining the necessary educational and training levels needed to perform in their current positions. Benchmark designations are already approved in SPB data base. (Nine were approved in FY 2010 / No Funding)

SPECIAL COMPENSATION: Increase \$ 21,435

Seven (7) positions in the Information Technology classifications will be eligible to receive a five (5) percent award of Special Compensation pay in FY 2011 in accordance with SPB Policy Memorandum No. 5. (Three were approved in FY 2010 / No Funding)

I.A.2. - TRAVEL: NO INCREASE

I. B. - CONTRACTUAL SERVICES: DECREASE \$ 632,324

NOTE: Due to a reduction in federal grant funding for the Mississippi Wind Hazard Mitigation Program a decrease of \$773,000 in contractual services is requested for Fiscal Year 2011.

Detailed below is an increase in this request for special funds in this category totaling \$140,676.

d. Rents: Increase \$ 2,000

Funds are requested to cover the anticipated increase in rents for permanent record storage.

e. Repairs & Service: Increase \$ 3,800

Funds are requested to cover the maintenance agreement for a replacement folder/inserter being purchased in Fiscal Year 2011.

f. Fees, Professional & Other Services: Increase \$ 130,876

SAAS production charges have been increased \$350 due to MMRS projection. Actuarial services will increase; Merlinos & Associates contract will increase \$18,990, Actuarial Resources contract will increase \$29,576, and Bickerstaff & Whatley contract will increase \$385. Attorney General's contract has been increased \$59,000 for additional compensation as the Agency has been given additional responsibilities and duties with the passage of new legislation. The passage of this legislation creates additional workload for all attorneys assisting the Agency with the Hurricane Damage Mitigation Program and the Interstate Insurance Product Regulation Compact. Additional temporary staff is requested to assist with the document management system for permanent records totaling \$11,530. The Insurance Department will provide the citizens of Mississippi with insurance information through educational forums, seminars, and other conferences, increasing contract worker fees to \$10,765. Additional funding for two (2) new positions is requested for SPB Charges totaling \$280.

h. Data Processing Increase \$4,000

A \$4,000 increase in Cellular Usage Time - Outside Vendor is for ten (10) additional staff members in the Legal

Division and Financial and Market Regulation Division who will be out of the office performing examination and investigative functions for the Agency.

I.C. - COMMODITIES: INCREASE \$ 20,000

d. Professional & Scientific Supplies & Materials: Increase \$20,000

An increase of \$20,000 is requested for educational supplies used in the Fire Safety Education Program which was created by the Mississippi Legislature in 2004. This program is designed to increase awareness and reduce fire deaths in the state by providing information to the citizens of Mississippi through nationally recognized standards.

I.D.1. -CAPITAL OUTLAY - OTHER:

No increase or decrease in funding is requested in this category for Fiscal Year 2011.

I.D.2. - EQUIPMENT: INCREASE \$ 17,278

An overall increase in equipment is requested for Fiscal Year 2011.

c. Office Machines, Furniture, Fixtures & Equipment: Increase \$ 26,718

An increase is requested for replacement desks and credenzas.

d. IS Equipment: Decrease \$ 52,900

A decrease in IS Equipment is requested in FY 2011, due to one-time costs associated with the document management system being purchased in FY 2010.

f. Other Equipment: Increase \$43,460
