OTHER SPECIAL FUNDS

FEDERAL FUNDS

The Mississippi Gaming Commission is a participant in a Federal Equitable Sharing Agreement with the U.S. Department of Justice. When the MGC participates in a law enforcement activity in conjunction with the U.S. Department of Justice, we are entitled to an equitable-share of the federally forfeited assets. To remain in compliance with the agreement, the Commission must use such funds for law enforcement purposes only, in accordance with the statutes and guidelines that govern equitable sharing. It is further stipulated that these assets may only be used to augment the law enforcement budget and not to supplant it. Therefore, the fund balance due to seized and forfeited funds can only be used above and beyond our normal operating budget.

3187 Investigations

The Mississippi Gaming Commission has adopted regulations that authorize the Commission to charge monies for various work products that are necessary to carry out the duties given to the Commission and to comply with Statutes set forth in the Gaming Control Act. The MGC exclusively relies on Special Fund Revenues to fund the agency. These special funds are derived from each licensed casino paying an inclusive investigative fee on a quarterly basis. This inclusive fee covers all investigations, field verifications and audits of current casino operations. The MGC was given the authority to levy the above mentioned fee, beginning with FY 2011.

During the 2010 Regular Legislative Session, House Bill 1147 amended the Mississippi Code of 1972, Section 75-76-81 as follows: "The Mississippi Gaming Commission shall assess and collect all fees imposed under Section 75-76-33(2)(f) and shall deposit the funds received from the fees into the Mississippi Gaming Commission Fund. Unexpended amounts remaining in the special fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the State General Fund."

Any other special funds are derived from laboratory fees, work permitting fees, self-exclusion forfeitures and investigations conducted outside current casino operations. The investigative fund balance at the end of each fiscal year is comprised of many different elements such as carried over fund balances, unused investigative deposits, revenue in excess of estimates and balances created from budget cuts over original appropriations.

HB 1059 allowed for the transfer of \$1,208,932 from the Budget Contingency fund to the MS Gaming Commission. This amount was needed to allow the MGC to comply with the 2010 budget cuts. The MGC repaid the amount in full during FY 2011.

3188 Charitable Bingo

In the Gaming Control Act, the MGC is also tasked with the oversight & enforcement of the Charitable Bingo Laws. Along with this task, the Commission was given the authority to assess various fees associated with this oversight. These fees include but are not limited to License Fees, Bingo Revenue Fees, Pull-tab Fees, and Machine Fees.

Section 97-33-101 of the Charitable Bingo Law states:

"All fees and fines collected by the commission pursuant to Sections 97-33-51 through 97-33-203 shall be deposited into a special fund to be known as the "Charitable Bingo Fund," which is hereby created in the State Treasury. The monies in such fund shall be used exclusively to support the activities of the commission related to the regulation of the Charitable Bingo Law, upon appropriation by the Legislature. Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the State General Fund, and any interest earned on amounts in such special fund shall be deposited to the credit of the special fund."

NARRATIVE 2013 BUDGET REQUEST

The Mississippi Gaming Commission (MGC) requests a continuation budget of \$10,130,576 for Fiscal Year 2013. This request reflects an overall increase of \$130,576 from our Fiscal Year 2012 appropriation. The MGC does not foresee any expansion of activities or services, but seeks to maintain the level of regulatory services necessary to carry out the responsibilities placed on the MGC in the Gaming Control Act. At the MGCs current level of funding, there are areas which need to be enhanced in order to maintain the level of integrity the State of Mississippi has established in the gaming industry's regulatory environment. A lack of funding leads to staffing shortages, limited travel and contractual funds to adequately train and develop law enforcement and auditing staff, and limited commodity funds interrupt the continuation of business.

No General Funds are requested for Fiscal Year 2013. The MGC exclusively relies on Special Fund Revenues to fund the agency. These special funds are derived from investigative fees, permits, tests, and audits performed by the MGC. Each licensed casino also pays an inclusive investigative fee on a quarterly basis.

The Mississippi Gaming Commission requests to have language in the Fiscal Year 2013 appropriation bill to continue to have the ability to escalate and expend funds from any proceeds arising from the participation in seizures of illegal gaming activities. These monies will be awarded to the MGC by the county and municipal courts. The use of the funds is limited to law enforcement purposes, excluding salaries.

The Major Object Categories affected by the budget request are detailed as follows:

PERSONAL SERVICES:

The Mississippi Gaming Commission is requesting an increase of 2.04% or \$144,004 in the Major Object Category Personal Services. This increase is requested for anticipated reclassifications of enforcement agent and accountant/auditor professional pins, expected educational benchmarks, and maintenance of the MGC's allocated positions. Further detail will be addressed in the individual program narratives.

TRAVEL:

The Mississippi Gaming Commission requests no increase/decrease in the Major Object Category Travel for Fiscal Year 2013.

CONTRACTUAL SERVICES:

The Mississippi Gaming Commission requests an increase of \$86,572 in the Major Object Category Contractual Services for Fiscal Year 2013. The MGC anticipates an increase in expenditures because spending has been so minimal in the past few Fiscal Years. As with any agency comprised of law enforcement officers, specific training is mandatory in order for certifications to be maintained. The MGC also maintains several data bases that will require professional assistance in maintaining or upgrading. There are two specific data bases that will require replacement as proper maintenance service is no longer available due to the age of the technology. These items will not expand the MGC, but will only allow for maintaining the level of regulatory services necessary to carry out the responsibilities placed on the MGC in the Gaming Control Act.

COMMODITIES:

The Mississippi Gaming Commission requests a decrease in the Major Object Category Commodities of \$60,000. This amount will still allow the MGC to operate all necessary functions to carry out its mission. The \$220,000 requested, while less than anticipated Fiscal Year 2012 spending, amounts to level funding and is appropriate for this category.

CAPITAL OUTLAY:

The Mississippi Gaming Commission requests an increase in the Major Object Category Capital Outlay Equipment of \$20,000 for Fiscal Year 2013. The majority of this increase is needed to replace and update data processing and telecommunication equipment throughout the agency. Divisions share laser printers to minimize costs, but due to age of the machines and general use these are no longer feasible to repair and need to be replaced.

VEHICLES:

The Mississippi Gaming Commission requests a \$60,000 decrease in the Major Object Category Vehicles for Fiscal Year 2013. However, in order to carry out the responsibilities placed on the MGC by the Gaming Control Act, enforcement agents, auditors, and compliance officers must frequently drive to both casinos and charitable gaming facilities for regulatory purposes. Many vehicles in the fleet have reached high mileages, which in turn, increase the amount necessary for repairs and maintenace that have to be done. The \$150,000 requested for Fiscal Year 2012 will allow the Agency to purchase approximately eight vehicles to replace some that are in disrepair or approaching eight to twelve years old and mileage well over 100,000.

SUBSIDIES, LOANS, & GRANTS:

The Mississippi Gaming Commission requests no increase/decrease in the Major Object Category Subsidies, Loans, & Grants for Fiscal Year 2013.
