Name of Agency

The University of Mississippi is a public, comprehensive, research institution that exists to enhance the educational, economic, healthcare, social and cultural foundations of the state, region, and nation. As the oldest public institution of higher learning in the state and as a Carnegie Research University (high research activity), the University's primary functions are the creation, dissemination, and application of knowledge through a variety of undergraduate, graduate and professional programs and public service activities. The University's main campus at Oxford emphasizes a traditional, residential educational experience, with a central College of Liberal Arts and several professional schools.

The University educates students to assume leadership roles in the state, nation, and world through its nationally recognized programs of undergraduate, graduate, and professional study. Its teaching, research, and service missions are characterized by equal access and equal opportunity to all who qualify.

The University will provide excellent, student-centered academic and co-curricular programs. The goal is to produce graduates who have the breadth and depth of knowledge to be lifelong learners, to be successful in their discipline, and to be good citizens. Instruction builds upon a central College of Liberal Arts, with programs through the doctorate in the sciences, humanities, social sciences, and the arts. The professional schools provide programs, including continuing education programs, for preparing the following: K-12 and higher education teachers and administrators; lawyers and legal professionals; engineers in a variety of specialty areas; accountancy and business professionals; pharmacists, health care and applied human sciences professionals. Academic programs also include the Sally McDonnell Barksdale Honors College, the Lott Leadership Institute, the Croft Institute for International Studies, and the Center for Manufacturing Excellence.

The University will produce research and scholarship that are nationally recognized and support the economic and cultural development of the state, the region, and the nation. The mission to generate new knowledge extends to the sciences, humanities, social sciences, engineering, business, accountancy, applied sciences, and educational pedagogy. Research programs include the National Center for Physical Acoustics, the National Food Service Management Institute, and the National Center for Computational Hydroscience and Engineering.

The University will be a leader in providing service to the public, through the application and dissemination of its expertise and knowledge, in Mississippi, the region, and the nation. This public service function is fulfilled through a variety of outreach programs involving almost all academic disciplines and extending across northern Mississippi and reaching state-wide and beyond in some cases.

Additionally, the University is committed to

- developing diverse campuses that recognize and promote the value of individual differences;
- providing the highest quality educational support services technologies to enhance the learning environment;
- maintaining efficient and effective administrative services to support its basic functions;
- supporting and developing a highly qualified faculty and staff;
- leveraging its strengths and expertise by developing interdisciplinary programs within the institution and partnerships with other IHL institutions for the benefit of the University and the state, and
- through civic engagement and service, purposefully applying its talent and knowledge so as to transform individuals, communities, and regions.

Restoration of Funds:

- New faculty hires and associated operating funds. Enrollment has increased over 50% since FY1996, and over 15% from FY2010 to FY2012, without a commensurate increase in state appropriations. During this period, the University has been unable to add sufficient numbers of faculty to keep student to faculty ratios from increasing. Fifty faculty positions. (\$5,500,000)

*Increase in Instruction - Salary, Wage & Fringe Benefits \$5,200,000; Contractual Services \$100,000; Commodities \$100,000; Equipment \$100,000.

- Expansion of on-line academic programs. The demand and need for efficient and effective on-line learning continues to rapidly expand. These funds will be used to increase our on-line learning capabilities and offer more programs. Five faculty positions, one technical support position. (\$684,750)

*Increase in Instruction - Salary, Wage & Fringe Benefits \$572,000; Contractual Services \$40,000; Commodities \$22,750; and Equipment \$50,000.

- Strengthen academic advising. Improving student retention rates and graduation rates are high priority goals. These funds would support those efforts by strengthening the quality and availability of academic advising. Fifteen advisor positions. (\$755,250)

*Increase in Academic Support - Salary, Wage & Fringe Benefits \$672,750; Contractual Services \$22,500; Commodities \$22,500; Equipment \$37,500.

- Enhance & upgrade of classroom, academic and support technology. In order to appropriately prepare students, they must have access to current technologies, as well as an understanding and comfort with this technology. (\$250,000)

*Increase in Academic Support - Equipment \$250,000

- Admissions & recruiting support - increase higher education participation rates among Mississippians. Five recruiter positions. (\$260,000)

*Increase in Student Services - Salary, Wage & Fringe Benefits \$227,500; Travel \$20,000; Contractual Services \$7,500; Commodities \$5,000.

- Anticipated utility rate increases & infrastructure maintenance costs. TVA recently changed the basis of its billing methodology which has proven to be costly to the University and far exceeds the anticipated and achievable efficiency gains we are implementing and planning. (\$1,000,000)

*Increase in Operation & Maintenance - Contractual Services \$1,000,000.

- A minimal level of built-in funding is requested for new academic square footage added to accommodate rapidly expanding enrollments. Three custodial positions, two skilled crafts positions. (\$268,812)

*Increase in Operation & Maintenance - Salary, Wage & Fringe Benefits \$156,520; Contractual Services \$60,000; Commodities \$52,392.

- The non-personnel portions of our operating budget have remained static since FY2000. Inflation and rapidly expanding student enrollments can no longer be supported through additional operating efficiencies or cutbacks. (\$1,000,000)

*Increase in All Functions - Contractual Services \$750,000; Commodities \$250,000
