I. Program Description:

This program was established by section 57-55-5 of the MS Code of 1972 as an official advisory law revision, research and reform agency of the state. The general purpose of the Institute is to provide law research to promote and encourage the clarification and simplification of the law of Mississippi, to improve the administration of justice and to carry on scholarly law research in anticipation of legal requirements for the efficient utilization and conservation of the natural resources of the state and the promotion of social, agricultural, industrial, and commercial development.

II. Program Objective:

To examine and study the law of Mississippi with the objective of identifying defects, inequities and needed improvements; to receive and consider suggestions from legislators, judges, and other public officials, lawyers and the general public as to defects and anachronisms in the law; to advise and assist local governments, state agencies, and associations; to provide in depth and comprehensive legal research and recommendations to the Mississippi Legislature and other agencies of the state and local government for improvement of the jurisprudence of the state utilizing staff council, law school faculty, and law students.

III. Current program activities as supported by the funding in Columns 6-15 (FY 12 Estimated & FY 13 Increase/Decrease for continuations) of MBR-1-03 and designated Budget Unit Decisions columns of MBR-1-03-A:

(D) Restoration:

These are ongoing expenses for the operational budget. The Institute's budget allows it to serve Mississippian's through: research for legislative counsel and committees, the publication of law enforcement manuals for Mississippi's law enforcement personnel, advising local governments, assisting Mississippi universities with patents, copyrights, and trademarks, and helping to untangle legal issues facing our coastal communities.

Research projects in FY 2011 included providing law research and counsel to House and Senate legislative committees, drafting offices and committee counsel on such topics as animal cruelty, imminent domain, and the attempted murder statutes. Another set of projects included updating our law enforcement manuals (the Model Form Affidavit Book, the Rules of the Road, the MS Law Officers Handbook, and the Prosecutor's Trial and Training Manual) which are used by over 326 police and sheriffs, 238 state courts and 318 other legal personnel throughout the state. In the local government area, the Institute assisted in analyzing such things as private restrictive covenants, municipal zoning, mobile food vendor regulation and the control of wildlife by municipalities. In addition to providing assistance on many issues relating to the development of university research and intellectual property, the Institute also continued with its publication of IP Mississippi, a newsletter designed to inform the state's higher education community on patent, copyright, and trademark developments relevant to university research and teaching. The Institute's Sea Grant programs published several newsletters and fielded research requests from coastal communities on issues ranging from aquaculture and fisheries to coastal conservation. Representative projects included research into the regulation of water quality by local governments, sea food sales and safety regulations, and coastal development laws in Gulf communities. The Institute has received very favorable feedback on its services and envisions that future comprehensive research will be similar to that which has been provided to the Legislature and other constituents in the past.

Funding:

Salaries and Wages: Since the mission of the Institute is to provide legal advisory and research services, the majority of the Institute's funding falls within these categories as the Institute's personnel are its most critical element. The function, research and analysis of the Institute are dependent on its personnel. The increase in this category requested is to fund student worker wages, which have not been funded by state appropriations for two years. Regular staff wages and salaries remain the same under this request.

Travel: It is important that the Institute's personnel often be on site to assist with the issues presented to them. The Institute provides training and educational services which often require its personnel to travel. Also, the Institute's personnel participate in national and regional organizations that help keep its work in Mississippi current and up to date. The increase in travel costs requested reflects estimated increased costs due to inflation and other economic factors.

Contractual Services: Communication and office equipment rental costs make up most of the necessary funds for

contractual services expenses. It is through these devices that the Institute is able to work with Mississippians and agencies through the state in a timely manner. The increase requested in this category is estimated to help with the increase in costs of telephone, postage, office equipment rental and other such expenses.

Commodities: The funds in this category are primarily for printing and publishing research reports of the Institute, purchasing research materials such as reporters and office supplies. The increase is requested for the printing of additional publications and handbooks.

Data Processing: The amount requested in this category is for the replacement and upgrading obsolete computers and computer related equipment. As virtually all of the research and publications undertaken by the Institute are conducted on computers, it is critical that the Institute's computer equipment remain current and operational. If this equipment is not upgraded on a regular basis, the entire system will become obsolete in a few years and need replacing at a substantially higher cost.

NARRATIVE 2013 BUDGET REQUEST

Name of Agency

Overview

The work of the Institute serves the state of Mississippi in areas that have been specifically authorized by the Legislature incrementally over the past 28 years. These areas are extensive research in support of Legislative Committees (Mr. Cotton Ruthven), criminal law research (handbooks, training, legislative bills) (Mr. Richard Carlisle), local government law research on issues affecting municipalities, counties, school districts and concerned legislative committees (Mr. Jerry Patton), copyright and patent law and policy research for all of the state universities (Mr. William Wilkins and Ms. A. Meaghin Burke) and ocean, coastal and natural resources law researching issues affecting coastal governmental agencies (Ms. Terra Bowling, Ms. Niki Pace and Ms. Stephanie Showalter Otts). These lawyers and their work are supported by an Administrative Coordinator (Ms. Carol Bullard), a Web Developer (Ms. Waurene Roberson), a Program Coordinator (Ms. Dominiqua Dickey) and part time work of law and undergraduate students. The work of these employees is managed by the Institute Director, Mr. William Wilkins.

Budget Request

Between FY'00 and FY'02 appropriated state funds for the operation of the Institute were reduced by \$106,005, a 15% decrease in a budget where salaries, wages and fringe benefits consumes 85% of the total budget in FY'02 (80% in FY'00). These reductions eliminated funds for replacement of obsolete and worn out data processing equipment (computers, printers, etc.) so essential to the law research mission of the Institute and reduced Contractual Services, Commodities and Travel budgets to an absolute minimum before invading salaries. State funding for FY'03-FY'08 returned to barely sustainable levels but is very much appreciated. In 2009, the Institute's funds were reduced in widespread mid-year budget cuts. These reductions amounted to 5% of the Institute's budget and resulted in severely limiting the Institute's travel and commodities budgets both of which in turn limited the Institute's ability to deliver its services to its constituents. The Institute's funding was restored in its 2010 budget which was very much appreciated, but was again cut by over 9% by year's end. Mississippi Law Research Institute's budget was again decreased for FY 2012 to a barely sustainable level. The increases requested herein, as discussed more thoroughly under "Restoration," will enable the Institute to continue meeting the needs of the Legislature and other constituents while keeping current with the increased costs associated with inflation and other economic factors.

Research Personnel

Mr. Ruthven is a graduate of the US Military Academy and the University of Mississippi Law School (1976). He joined the Institute in 1990 replacing Mr. Al Sage. He has over 35 years varied experience in Mississippi law practice and research. His work is familiar to many legislators and legislative staff. He provides research to the Legislature on lengthy projects such as tort reform and workers' compensation law reform and quick turnaround for 50 state and federal law research projects from Committee Counsel during the session.

Mr. Carlisle is a 1972 University of Mississippi law graduate who joined the Institute in 1985 with extensive Mississippi civil and criminal law practice. He is a former county prosecuting attorney. His work is developing and maintaining handbooks and training material for use by Mississippi law enforcement personnel and court personnel and researching criminal law matters for the Legislature. His publications are used throughout the state by Highway patrol, municipal and county police, prosecutors and court clerks and judges.

Mr. Patton is a University of Mississippi, Duke Law School (1983) graduate with scholarship post graduate work at Stanford University and Nottingham University (England). He joined the Institute in 1994 to fill a need identified by the Legislature for comprehensive law research on matters affecting local government generally. He has developed and maintains a code of ordinances for municipalities to conform to Mississippi and federal laws that is widely utilized by cities throughout the state. He also provides research and counsel to the Legislature on local government matters. He recently served as Counsel for the Administrative Law Reform Task force.

NARRATIVE 2013 BUDGET REQUEST

Name of Agency

Mr. Wilkins is a graduate of Sewanee and the University of Mississippi Law School (1991). He serves as Director and also conducts research in his area of specialty, intellectual property. He joined the Institute in 2000 and became Director upon the retirement of long term Director, William Hooper Jr. in 2006. This is an area of law of particular concern to the state's Universities where much research is performed. Lawyers with this specialty are hard to find and employ. With research activities growing dramatically at the state's Universities, there was a need identified to the Legislature for assistance in educating research personnel on copyright and patent law to protect the State's interest. Mr. Wilkins conducts seminars on these matters for all the state universities, monitors university intellectual property written policies and provides assistance to University attorneys on intellectual property matters.

Ms. Burke is Research Counsel in the Intellectual Property Group at the Mississippi Law Research Institute. She received a B.S. in pharmaceutical sciences from the University of Mississippi in 2000 and a J.D. from the University of Mississippi School of Law in 2006. During law school, Meaghin served as Mississippi Cases Editor for the Mississippi Law Journal, won the McGlinchey Stafford Oral Advocacy Competition, and published a comment, "New Approaches to Pharmaceutical Patent Law: Why Current Patent Jurisprudence Is Inappropriate as Applied to the Unique Characteristics of Chemical Compounds."

Ms. Showalter Otts, a 2001 Master of Laws graduate from Vermont Law School is the Director of the Mississippi-Alabama Sea Grant Legal Program. This is a nationally recognized ocean and coastal law and policy research program funded by a grant from the National Sea Grant College program now in its 34th consecutive year at the Ole Miss Law Center. This grant provides 100% of the salary for another lawyer, Ms. Niki Pace. Ms. Pace, a Hattiesburg native, received a B.S. in geology from the University of Southern Mississippi and a law degree from Lewis and Clark School of Law in 2002. She returned to Lewis and Clark in 2008 and obtained an LL.M. in environmental and natural resources law. This program provides law research and counsel to coastal governmental agencies in Mississippi and Alabama on such matters as fisheries, aquaculture, beach development and protection and wetlands use. Due to the long standing reputation of this program the National Sea Grant College Program of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration established a National Sea Grant Law Center at the Mississippi Law Research Institute in 2002. Ms. Showalter is director of this Center and Ms. Terra Bowling is Research Counsel. Ms. Bowling received bachelor degrees in Journalism and Spanish from the University of Mississippi and a J.D. from the University of Mississippi School of Law. Prior to attending law school, Terra served as assistant editor for American City and County magazine. As a law student, she served as a research associate for the National Sea Grant Law Center. She joined the law center staff after graduation and currently serves as editor of The SandBar and The Sea Grant Law and Policy Digest. The Center also houses a Web Developer, Ms. Waurene Roberson and a Program Coordinator, Ms. Dominiqua Dickey. The Center is a national research center for ocean and coastal law and policy and is funded by a grant from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration.
