STATE SUPPORT SPECIAL FUNDS

- 1. Health Care Expendable Funds are used by MSH for the care and treatment of patients, and are accounted for in a separate treasury fund (#3399). Actual revenues in FY2011 include transfer of remaining Health Care Expendable Funds from the Brookhaven Crisis Intervention Center (cash balance of \$70,614).
- 2. ARRA ("Stimulus") Funds are only applicable to FY2011. The calculated difference between the actual Medicaid Match paid by MSH (average around 17%) and the expected Medicaid Match (around 25%) is shown as a State Support Special Funds revenue labeled "ARRA Education, Discretionary, FMAP" and as a Subsidies expenditure with the same name. This practice was employed during FY2011, until the ARRA funds expired (June 30, 2011). The total amount is \$1,234,020, which is the amount originally appropriated. ARRA funds apply ONLY to the regular Medicaid Revenue match, not to the Medicaid Disproportionate Share Hospital (DSH) payments.

OTHER SPECIAL FUNDS

1. Regular Receipts (Medicaid) consist of the standard Medicaid payments received for patient care activities by Jaquith Nursing Homes, Whitfield Medical Surgical Hospital, Oak Circle Center, and Community Services. The amount of regular Medicaid receipts from the nursing home is primarily dependent on the level of Medicaid allowable costs as confirmed by the nursing home's annual Medicaid Cost Report and the number of residents who are certified to receive Medicaid assistance. The level of Medicaid and/or Medicare revenues for the service units of Mississippi State Hospital is determined by the individual patient's needs and their Medicaid/Medicare status.

House Bill 1504 swept funds from the Department of Mental Health, and \$975,000 is the applicable share that Mississippi State Hospital took of the "sweep" - shown as a negative revenue since it was a cash adjustment.

- 2. Medicaid Disproportionate Share (DSH)/Upper Payment Limit (UPL) is revenue derived from a payment system which compensates hospitals who provide care to a "disproportionate share" of indigent patients. Closely associated with DSH is a second payment called "Upper Payment Limit" which compensates hospitals for treating a large share of Medicaid and indigent patients at rates that are significantly less than those paid by Medicare. Projected FY2012 proceeds are shown at the amount estimated by the contractor that compiles the hospital's cost reports. FY2013 amounts are expected to be approximately the same.
- 3. Medicare Receipts are collections from applicable services that are covered by Medicare. The Whitfield Medical Surgical Hospital and Inpatient Services Male and Female receiving units are all certified to participate in Medicare.
- 4. Other funds in this section include transfers to another DMH facility, patient fees from benefit payments, grants from the DMH Central Office, and educational grant funds.

I. Program Description:

The Institutional Care Program provides a comprehensive range of inpatient psychiatric services designed to serve the needs of individuals between the ages of 4 and 12 (children), individuals between 12 years and 17 years and 11 months (adolescents), and individuals 18 years of age or older (adults), who reside in any of the ten community mental health regions assigned to Mississippi State Hospital's catchment area. Mississippi State Hospital operates a chemical dependency unit for adults and is the statewide service facility for forensic services. In addition, the hospital operates acute and continued care psychiatric units, dual diagnosis (mental retardation/mental illness) units, a medical surgical hospital, infirmaries, a certified nursing facility, and an acute child/adolescent psychiatric unit designed to provide diagnostic evaluation and short-term treatment for children and adolescents with impaired emotional, social, psychological and academic functioning. Many units at Mississippi State Hospital also serve as training facilities for professionals interested in the provision of services to the mentally ill.

Patients admitted to Mississippi State Hospital's Institutional Care Program may receive the following services: medical evaluation and treatment, psychiatric evaluation and treatment, psychological evaluation and treatment, social services, dietary, educational, recreational, physical therapy, music therapy, job training, vocational rehabilitation, occupational therapy, residential living, and pastoral care. Mississippi State Hospital is licensed by the State Department of Health and is fully accredited by the Joint Commission and certified by CMS.

II. Program Objective:

The objective of the Institutional Care Program is to operate a health care complex that provides a comprehensive range of high quality services to meet the needs of individuals with mental illness or individuals who require nursing home care and which meets the standards set by regulatory, licensing, and accrediting agencies or organizations. In recent years, there has also been extensive work toward serving patients in less restrictive settings than MSH. In accomplishing this objective, it has resulted in the hospital's population being the more difficult (behaviorally and medically) patients for which to care and serve.

III. Current program activities as supported by the funding in Columns 6-15 (FY 12 Estimated & FY 13 Increase/Decrease for continuations) of MBR-1-03 and designated Budget Unit Decisions columns of MBR-1-03-A:

(D) Energy Performance Contrac:

This decrease is related to a Performance Contract (operational efficiencies) between Mississippi State Hospital and Johnson Controls, Inc. (JCI). This performance contract involves operational efficiencies that are guaranteed to result in expenditure reductions sufficient to offset capital lease payments associated with the projects. \$107,796 is the expected decrease in contractual expenditures for utilities, while Subsidies has an \$8,376 decrease related to a decreasing interest payment. Also included is the increase in principal payment of \$19,178.

(E) Resource Reallocation:

This represents a decrease in spending authority for Personal Services in FY 2013. The overall expenditures in Personal Services has decreased in recent years due to a shifting from institutional based services to community services. This decrease, so far, has been accomplished through attrition.

(F) Ongoing Operations:

This \$44,701 increase in other funds spending authority is for estimated equipment purchases that are necessary for ongoing operations or have been postponed in prior years.

NARRATIVE JUSTIFICATION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2013 BUDGET

The United States Department of Justice began a review of the Mississippi Department of Mental Health in May of 2011. It is reasonably possible that this review may result in the implementation of changes to the way the Mississippi Department of Mental Health operates, either as a result of a consent decree or, failing that, legal action. These changes could be costly. It may be a few months or even a few years before the review is completed and findings are presented. The funding level requested in this budget submission may be amended as a result of this review if findings are made known before the appropriations process for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013 is completed.

I. MAJOR OBJECT OF EXPENDITURES

It is requested that the FY2013 appropriation be granted with "lump sum" authority just as the FY2012 appropriation because this provides the agency a level of flexibility which is invaluable in meeting the challenges of the current economic climate.

A. PERSONNEL SERVICES

1. SALARIES, WAGES, AND FRINGE BENEFITS (BASE):

The amount of \$94,086,187 shown for Salaries, Wages, and Fringe Benefits (BASE) for fiscal year ending June 30, 2012, is the amount projected by the State Personnel Board for 100% funding of current positions in the Variable Compensation Plan Cost Continuation Projection. After adjusting for additional compensation of \$6,095,532, and deducting the proposed vacancy rate (in dollars) of \$6,703,616, the net total requested is \$93,478,103 for FY 2013. This total represents a net DECREASE of \$4,904,456 in spending authority from the FY 2012 appropriated amount.

The adjustment for requested additional compensation of \$6,095,532 consists of:

Reallocations: \$19,218 Benchmarks: \$10,010 Overtime Pay: \$6,066,304

2. TRAVEL:

Mississippi State Hospital requests a total of \$30,000 in travel funds for FY 2013. \$19,000 is requested for Program One, Institutional Care, \$8,000 in Program Two, Pre and Post Institutional Care, and \$3,000 for Program Three, Support Services.

- a. Travel and Subsistence (In-State): A total of \$20,000 is requested.
- b. Travel and Subsistence (Out-of-State): A total of \$10,000 is requested.

These expenditures will be used for travel related to regulatory and technical trainings where the hospital staff has a need to stay updated. It will also be used for paying mileage in areas where a vehicle purchase would be unjustified.

B. CONTRACTUAL SERVICES - SCHEDULE B:

A total of \$12,083,184, representing a DECREASE of \$107,796, is requested. Of this amount, \$11,383,184 is allocated to Program One, Institutional Care, \$300,000 is allocated to Program Two, Pre and Post Institutional Care, and \$400,000 to Program Three, Support Services. The most significant of the categories of Contractual Services are:

b. Communications, Transportation, and Utilities \$1,594,341

61210 Electricity \$1,100,000

A Performance Contract (related to operational efficiencies) is in place at Mississippi State Hospital that will reduce the electricity and natural gas needed to operate the facility. Therefore, the amounts estimated for FY2012 and FY2013 are less than the expenditures during FY2011.

61220 Gas (Natural) \$330,000

f. Fees, Professional & Other: \$8,167,147

61640 Physician Services \$1,130,000

61642 Nursing Services \$1,300,000

Nursing services for agency contracts are expended from this area, and are used because they are more cost effective than using overtime to fill necessary shifts. If the quality of service, or safety, is believed to be compromised by the use of agency, then overtime may be used.

61690 Other Fees \$4,166,000

Other Fees includes operation of the food services system. Over one million meals are served each year at Mississippi State Hospital.

h. Information Technology \$807,000

61917 Service Charges Paid - SDC \$122,000

61920 Internet/Application Serv. \$106,000

61921 Software Acquisition \$361,000

61923 Basic Telephone-ITS \$99,000

61961 Maint/Repair of IS Equipment \$73,500

In an attempt to stay current with Information Technology objectives, including Electronic Health Record (EHR) mandates, this area remains a priority within contractual expenditures.

C. COMMODITIES - SCHEDULE C:

A total of \$7,726,000, representing NO INCREASE, is requested in this category in Other Special and State Support Special Funds. Of this amount \$7,621,000 is allocated for Program One, Institutional Care, \$80,000 is allocated to Program Two, Pre and Post Institutional Care for use in Community Services, and \$25,000 is allocated to Program

Three, Support Services. The bulk of the Commodities appropriation is utilized in one category, drugs.

d. Professional & Scientific Supplies & Equipment: \$5,529,000

62340 Drugs - Medical Use \$3,907,000

62390 Other Professional Supplies \$1,280,000

These funds are used primarily for psychotropic drugs which are vital to the accomplishment of this hospital's mission to treat persons with mental illness. Drugs are also utilized in the care of the residents of Jaquith Nursing Home. Over the past several years the expenditures for drugs have been reduced approximately 50%. This has been accomplished mainly with the use of a preferential formulary and generic medications. With the formulary in place, the least costly group of medications is used first, unless there is convincing justification that there should be deviation. The result is a lower overall cost for drugs, with no sacrifice in the quality of service. Also, various medical and professional supplies are purchased with funds allocated to this area.

e. Other Supplies & Equipment: \$1,594,450

FY 2010 was the first year in which the new threshold of \$1,000 per unit was applied to Equipment purchases. This means that most items costing under \$1,000 which were formerly classified as equipment will now be purchased as Commodities. Most of these purchases will be classed in the category of Other Supplies & Equipment.

62450 Janitorial Supplies & Cleaning \$396,025

All of these Commodity purchases are essential to provide quality care, direct and support, for the agency's mission.

- D. CAPITAL OUTLAY:
- 1. CAPITAL OUTLAY OTHER THAN EQUIPMENT SCHEDULE D-1:

NO INCREASE is requested in this category for FY2013. A total of \$100,000 is requested

2. CAPITAL OUTLAY - EQUIPMENT - SCHEDULE D-2:

A total of \$553,495 representing an increase of \$130,931 is requested in this category. Much of the equipment currently in use is badly worn, obsolete, and non-repairable. Many of the replacement items are for direct patient use and are essential to their improvement and programming. Equipment is scheduled for replacement in medical, maintenance, and support areas. \$19,178 of this increase in spending authority is due to the principal payments associated with the lease under the Performance Contract with Johnson Controls, Inc.

These funds are necessary to allow for replacements in different categories as follows:

c. Office Equipment: \$58,517

d. Information Systems Equipment: \$250,346

This request is made to purchase or upgrade data processing and telecommunications equipment at Mississippi State Hospital. This equipment is necessary to maintain the current information systems capability of the hospital. The hospital's information system capability is essential for billings to Medicaid, Medicare, and private insurance. This system also provides health records and census information, and will be the source of the hospital's Electronic Health Record (EHR). Because of the short useful life and rapid improvement of such equipment, exact replacements are seldom feasible. Included in this request are computer servers which are needed to upgrade and rehabilitate the capabilities of the patient admission, tracking, and billing systems.

e. Equipment - Lease Purchase: \$205,322

The amount in this category is necessary because the principle payments on Lease Purchase transactions for capital outlay items are recorded as a Capital Outlay expenditure while the interest payment is recorded as a Subsidies expenditure. These expenditures are for the capital outlay associated with the Performance Contract between Mississippi State Hospital and Johnson Controls, Inc.

f. Other Equipment: \$39,310

This request is to purchase various pieces of equipment (new and replacement) for hospital operations.

3. CAPITAL OUTLAY - VEHICLES - SCHEDULE D-3:

\$22,399 is requested for a fifteen passenger van and \$18,236 is requested for a Mid Size Van, both as replacements for transport of patients. Total request for vehicles is \$40,635.

4. CAPITAL OUTLAY - WIRELESS COMMUNICATION DEVICES - SCHEDULE D-3:

No funds are requested in this category.

E. SUBSIDIES, LOANS, GRANTS - SCHEDULE E:

A total of \$13,121,418 is requested in this category to fund the patient workers program, Medicaid matching funds, cost allocation payments, and other fees and taxes. This represents a slight decrease of \$8,376 from FY2012 related to a decreasing interest payment under the Performance Contract with Johnson Controls. These funds are allocated as \$12,961,418 to Program One, Institutional Care, and \$160,000 to Program Two, Pre and Post Institutional Care. The following items are significant and worthy of explanation:

78170 Medicaid Hospital Assessment - Disproportionate Share/UPL on OCC & WMSH

Medicaid Disproportionate Share (DSH) is part of a payment system which compensates hospitals that provide care to a "disproportionate share" of indigent patients. Closely associated with this system is a second payment called "Upper Payment Limit" which compensates hospitals who treat a large share of Medicaid patients and indigent patients at rates that are significantly less than those paid by Medicare. The corresponding revenues from DSH/UPL are shown separately in the Funding Detail (Form MBR 1-02). The requested amount for expenditure in this area is \$3,246,703.

78170 Medicaid Bed Tax - Nursing Home

Effective in April, 2010, the Medicaid Assessment ("Bed Tax") was applied to the nursing facilities of DMH, including Jaquith Nursing Home. The rate is applied to nursing homes based on total patient days (not just Medicaid patients) as required by Federal law. Although the Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services will allow MSH to include this tax as an allowable cost in determining the Medicaid rate, the hospital will have to pay the state share of match on any Medicaid revenues received. \$1,380,031 is requested for this purpose.

Medicaid Match - The bulk of Subsidies is used to pay the required state share of Medicaid Match. Regular Medicaid (as opposed to Disproportionate Share) consists of the standard Medicaid payments received for patient care activities by Jaquith Nursing Homes, Whitfield Medical Surgical Hospital, Oak Circle Center, and Community Services. The Medicaid match for these payments is computed based on the applicable federal-state split in effect at the time of payment, expected to be around 75/25 during FY2012.

II. BUDGET TO BE FUNDED AS FOLLOWS:

A. CASH BALANCE - UNENCUMBERED:

The cash balance unencumbered at the beginning of FY 2013 is estimated to be \$11,692,302.

B. STATE APPROPRIATIONS:

Mississippi State Hospital is requesting \$79,160,705 in general funds for FY2013 operations, which is no increase from FY2012. Of note is that the lapse amount includes three transfers. The first two were to the Department of Mental Health's Service Budget for operation of the Cleveland Crisis Intervention Center, which is now contracted with a local Community Mental Health Center provider - amounts transferred were \$373,491 and \$373,492. The third transfer was to Mississippi State Hospital from the Brookhaven Crisis Intervention Center, in an amount of \$412,317. The net of these transfers (\$373,491+\$373,492-\$412,317) results in the general funds lapse amount of \$334,666.

C. FUNDS FROM OTHER SOURCES:

- 1. FEDERAL FUNDS: Mississippi State Hospital receives no federal funds.
- 2. STATE SUPPORT SPECIAL FUNDS: Requested is funding of \$1,727,335 in this area. No increase is requested.
- 3. OTHER (SPECIAL) FUNDS: Patient Funds, Medicaid (Regular), Medicare, and miscellaneous sources will make up the funding for this area. Requested authority for Other Special Funds is \$44,703,647.

D. LESS: ESTIMATED CASH AVAILABLE NEXT FISCAL PERIOD:

The cash balance anticipated at the end of FY 2013 is estimated to be \$10,151,154. The result is a net cash usage during FY2013 of \$1,541,148.

III. PERSONNEL DATA

A. Number Positions Authorized in Appropriation Bill

The number of positions requested for FY2013 is the same as appropriated in FY2012 - Full Time-Perm of 2,045 and Full Time-TL of 144. Total requested positions equals 2,189. These positions are requested to maintain flexibility in hiring crucial positions such as direct care and nursing.
