The Research Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences conducts research toward the discovery and development of new chemotherapeutic agents, and the improvement of existing agents. Improved agricultural productivity is also being sought through discovery and development of less environmentally impacting pesticides. The Institute also generates and serves pharmaceutical biotechnology and technical service industries in this region, and contribute to the economic development of the State through technological developments.

II. Program Objective:

To conduct research programs aimed toward enhancing the economic development of the State of Mississippi, to contribute to basic knowledge in the pharmaceutical and agrochemical sciences, and to the improvement of health status of Mississippians by improved health care delivery.

(D) Restoration:

We are requesting a total increase of \$521,244 in state funding for fiscal year 2013 to restore funding to the 2007/2008 level. We are requesting an increase of \$218,130 in personnel funds to allow us to pay some of our core faculty and staff that are currently being supported from other funds. We are requesting an increase of \$16,637 to help restore the travel budget which will allow our researchers to travel to conferences and seminars in order to make contacts and keep up with the latest in research developments. An increase of \$56,937 is being requested for contractual services to allow us to purchase service contracts on existing equipment. In order to build back our commodity budget and purchase necessary lab and office supplies that cannot be purchased with grant funding, we are requesting an increase of \$59,765. In addition, we are requesting \$12,653 that can be used towards the puchase of equipment. The additional \$157,122 would be used toward adequate funding of the Pharm-D Program.

IV. Additional program activities that will result from increased funding requested in Columns 16-25 (MBR-1-03) and specified Budget Decision Unit Columns (MBR-1-03-A):

(E) Phase II NCNPR Research Wi:

Construction of the Phase-II research wing, an expansion of the primary facility of NCNPR is expected to be completed in 2013. Current grants from federal agencies fund construction but do not include funds for furniture or equipment. This new building will include 41,353 square feet of assignable laboratory space and 11,574 square feet of assignable office and conference space. Additional funds will be required to furnish and equip, as well as staff this new facility.

NARRATIVE 2013 BUDGET REQUEST

UM - RESEARCH INSTITUTE OF PHARMACEUTICAL

Name of Agency

The Research Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences is comprised of two major divisions. These two divisions are The National Center for Natural Products Research (NCNPR) and the Center for Pharmaceutical Marketing and Management (CPMM). These programs conduct research to improve human health and agricultural productivity. The mission of NCNPR is to discover, develop, and commercialize natural product-derived pharmaceuticals and agrochemicals to benefit human health and agricultural productivity. The mission of the CPMM is to promote efficient and effective marketing and management of products and services in all segments of pharmacy, healthcare, and the pharmaceutical industry. The CPMM also provides an environment where business, government, and education can come together to exchange research ideas, results and information. The Institute partners with Mississippi industries in an effort to enhance the competitiveness of those industries and thus contribute to the economic development of the State through technological developments.

PERSONAL SERVICES

State Appropriations:

Due to budget cuts over the past few years, NCNPR and CPMM have had to rely on federal and other funding to offset cuts in core personnel in their budgets, and to try and shore up critically needed expansion in key operational support areas. As the NCNPR developed its programs, commensurate with its national mission, several positions were lost and remain unfilled, while others were filled with "soft" dollars to bridge the gaps. State funding is desperately needed to support the core infrastructure positions and the senior investigator positions for the research base of two prominent nationally and internationally recognized centers. It is critical that these positions have some continuity in our state base funding. Such key infrastructure operations are required for these Centers' long term operations. These provide the base from which our federal grants can be generated, as well as the product development, industry growth and new job attraction to this region of the State. In fiscal year 2010, the NCNPR leveraged the state base by about 5 to 1, and supported about 100 non-state jobs, but our infrastructure for database management, medicinal plant garden, repository operations, screening, and product development are sorely underfunded. We are requesting \$218,130 as a start towards rebuilding our base funding in this area. Support from the State in this area is vital to the continued growth of the Institute.

It is imperative that the Research Institute be able to recruit, train, and retain quality faculty and staff to continue at the forefront in research activities. This will not be possible if we are not able to appropriately compensate personnel and provide cost of living increases. At this time, we are not requesting any money for raises. We are however requesting an additional \$791,071 in federal funds to support new faculty/staff positions. \$281,770 will be used towards creating new positions for continuation of current programs and \$509,301 will be used towards creating positions to help staff the new building. These new positions will be necessary as we begin to move into Phase-II NCNPR. Construction of the Phase-II research wing, an expansion of the primary facility of NCNPR, is expected to

be completed in 2013. This new building will include 41,353 square feet of assignable laboratory space and 11,574 square feet of assignable office and conference space. Additional funds will be required to furnish and equip, as well as staff this new facility.

Other Funds:

We are also requesting an increase of \$75,000 in other funds to support new faculty/staff. \$43,800 will be used for continuation of current programs and \$31,200 is requested for new positions to staff NCNPR-Phase II.

TRAVEL

State Appropriations:

Travel is imperative to the success of the research programs. It is important to make regular visits to potential funding agencies to develop and maintain strong research relationships. As the number of grants/contracts the Institute is awarded continues to rise, the amount of travel our PIs must make also increases. In addition to research travel, our PIs and research staff need to travel to conferences and seminars in order to make contacts and keep up with the latest in research developments. At this time, we are requesting an increase of \$16,637 in state appropriations to further fund travel.

NARRATIVE 2013 BUDGET REQUEST

UM - RESEARCH INSTITUTE OF PHARMACEUTICAL

Name of Agency

Federal Funds:

We are requesting an increase of \$39,363 in federal funds to support travel for fiscal year 2013. This increase will go to support national/international travel funded in research projects as part of the funded grant/contract. Of this amount, \$20,000 will be used to support current programs. The additional \$19,363 will be for new projects related to NCNPR-Phase II Research Wing.

Other Funds:

An additional increase of \$5,000 is requested to spend in other funds for continuation of current programs.

CONTRACTUAL SERVICES

State Appropriations:

We are requesting that \$56,937 be added to the contractual services category of the RIPS budget to provide some assistance in the maintenance of the research equipment for the Research Institute.

Federal Funds:

We request authorization to spend an additional \$1,101,952 in the federal funds contractual service category. This request is due to an increase in the grant/contract activity in both NCNPR and CPMM. In addition, we anticipate at least \$331,000 to cover service contracts on new equipment needed for Phase-II NCNPR Research Wing. A total of \$600,000 is being requested for continuation of current programs. The remaining \$501,952 is requested as part of the expansion of services.

Other Funds:

We request authorization to spend an additional \$124,958 in other funds. \$25,000 is for continuation and growth of current research activities and an additional \$99,958 for expansion.

COMMODITIES

State Appropriations:

The RIPS commodities budget has been inadequate for several years. The ability to purchase laboratory supplies such as laboratory animals, chemicals and other commodities is essential to the development of our research programs. We have been able to combat the inadequate commodities budget by building larger commodities budgets into our research grants/contracts, but these budgets, by law, must be used for the specific projects that are being funded and cannot be used for our general research programs. We will continue to search for other funding sources to keep up with the rising costs of commodities, but must have support from the State if we are to be successful. We are requesting an increase of \$59,765 from the state for fiscal year 2013.

Federal Funds:

We request authorization to spend an additional \$140,885 in the federal funds commodities category. This request is due to an increase in grant/contract activity in the NCNPR and CPMM. We are requesting to spend an additional \$75,000 towards continuation of the existing program. In addition, we are requesting to spend an additional \$65,885 to stock the new labs in Phase II, NCNPR with basic lab supplies.

Other Funds:

We request authorization to spend an additional \$25,000 in other funds due to anticipated research activity and an additional \$50,000 to use towards stocking new labs for a total of \$75,000.

EQUIPMENT

State Appropriations:

A vital part of any research program is the research equipment. The Research Institute must maintain the ability to purchase equipment if we are to continue to be successful in our research activities. We have drastically reduced the state budget in this category over past years and have been unable to buy the new equipment that we need. We are

requesting an increase of \$12,653 for fiscal year 2013 as a start towards rebuilding our equipment category.

Federal Funds:

We are seeking an increase of \$200,000 in federal funds for equipment due to anticipated research activity and an additional \$4,092,500 that will be used to furnish the labs and offices of the new building with necessary furniture and lab equipment. Current grants from federal agencies fund construction of the new research wing, but do not include funds for furniture or equipment. The total requested increase for federal funds is \$4,292,500.

Other Funds:

We are requesting an increase of \$169,347 in other funds for equipment. \$44,347 of this requested increase will be used to buy needed equipment for current programs. The remaining \$125,000 will be used to equip new the new labs in NCNPR-Phase II.

VEHICLES

We are not requesting an increase in this category from any of our funding sources for fiscal year 2013.

WIRELESS DEVICES

We are not requesting an increase in this category from any of our funding sources for fiscal year 2013.

SUBSIDIES LOANS AND GRANTS

State Appropriations:

The commitment was made to proceed with the implementation of the Pharm D program over eleven years ago. \$1,500,000 was provided to initiate this program. We have taken significant budget cuts which have impacted this program as well as other RIPS programs, and therefore are operating on a significantly smaller budget than we did years ago. We must seek ways to adequately fund the Pharm D program to maintain the status of being one of the outstanding pharmacy schools in the Nation. In order to maintain adequate support for this program, we are requesting an increase of \$157,122 from state appropriations.

Federal Funds:

We are not requesting an increase in federal funds at this time.

Other Funds:

We are not requesting an increase in other funds at this time.
