## FEDERAL FUNDS

In FY 2010, the MID was awarded a \$999,248 federal grant through the Department of Homeland Security Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program - Fire Prevention and Safety Grant (FP&S) to provide an additional 58,000 free smoke alarms throughout the state. During FY 2010, funds totaling \$695,991 were expended from MID's Fund 3501 to purchase 55,546 smoke alarms for this program. An additional \$3,900 was expended from the same fund for fire safety brochures. Reimbursement for expenditures and installation of the free smoke alarms were completed during FY 2011.

The Mississippi Insurance Department was awarded federal funds through the Mississippi Development Authority's 2009 Katrina Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG). This cost reimbursement grant funded a project that assisted in the development of the Mississippi Wind Hazard Mitigation Program. The grant was used specifically to perform a cost-benefit analysis for wind retrofit techniques, create a Mississippi Building Stock Model, evaluate Mississippi Building Code requirements, develop cost-effective wind mitigation techniques specific to the Mississippi Gulf Coast, and to develop a conceptual model building rating scale. During FY 2009, the Mississippi Insurance Department executed a request for proposal for development and implementation of a comprehensive and coordinated approach for hurricane damage mitigation. On April 6, 2009, the Mississippi Insurance Department entered into a one year contract for \$883,000 with Air Worldwide Corporation to perform a cost-benefit study relating to the development of hurricane wind damage mitigation program specifications. The Mississippi Insurance Department expended \$110,000 during FY 2009, and \$763,382 during FY 2010. The expenditures were paid with funds from the Mississippi Insurance Special Fund 3501. In FY 2010, \$110,000 in federal funds were requested and received for reimbursement. The remaining \$763,382 in federal funds was requested for reimbursement during FY 2010 and were received in FY 2011.

In August 2010, MID was awarded a \$1,000,000 Mississippi Health Insurance Premium Review Grant-Cycle I from the United States Department of Health and Human Services to overhaul its existing rate review regulations, bulletins, and standards, to enhance its current rate review process, and to improve public access to rate increase information. A new web portal will be the mechanism to disseminate the rate increase information to the public in an efficient and easy to understand manner.

In September 2010, MID was awarded a \$1,000,000 Mississippi Health Insurance Exchange Planning Grant from the United States Department of Health and Human Services to plan for and ultimately establish a Health Insurance Exchange for the State of Mississippi. The Exchange will facilitate the purchase of qualified health plans for individuals and provide for the establishment of a small employer health benefit Exchange designed to assist in facilitating the enrollment of their employees in qualified health plans.

# **OTHER SPECIAL FUNDS**

The Mississippi Insurance Department has been special funded since 1991. The Insurance Department collects statutory fees, insurance company assessments, and penalty fees for violation of statutes and regulations. These funds are deposited into the MID's Special Fund 3501.

The Mississippi Insurance Department's Special Fund 3503 represents the funds collected from a tax of one fourth (1/4) cent per gallon levied upon any person engaged in retail business as a distributor of liquefied compressed gas.

The Mississippi Insurance Department's Special Fund 350C was established for the Residential Electronic Protection Licensing Act created in Senate Bill 2742, 2006 Regular Legislative Session. The REP Licensing Act allows for collection of licensing fees from Alarm System Technicians, Installers, Salespersons, and Apprentices.

The Mississippi Insurance Department's Special Fund 3500 was established by House Bill 1500, 2007 Regular Session, to assist the Mississippi Windstorm Underwriting Association with defraying expenses and costs for reinsurance under Miss. Code Ann., Section 83-34-1. These funds are to serve as a subsidy to assist the insureds in the Windpool.

# NARRATIVE OF SPECIAL FUNDS DETAIL AND TREASURY FUND/BANK ACCOUNTS

### MISSISSIPPI INSURANCE DEPARTMENT

The State Tax Commission shall deposit into the Mississippi Windstorm Underwriting Association Reinsurance Assistance Fund \$20,000,000 annually each fiscal year, beginning with fiscal year 2007 and continuing through fiscal year 2010. Due to the way the State Tax Commission collects and transfers these funds to the MID, the balance of funds associated with House Bill 1500 were transferred to the Mississippi Windstorm Underwriting Association during fiscal year 2011. These funds are derived from insurance premium tax revenue collected by the State Tax Commission as allowed under the provisions of Miss. Code Ann., Section 27-15-103.

During the 2009 Regular Session, Senate Bill 2249 established the Mississippi Fire Safety Standard and Firefighter Protection Act. This Act requires the cigarette manufacturer to pay a fee for certification for each brand family, to the State Fire Marshal. The funds derived from this certification shall be deposited into MID's Fund 350H. The funds received will be utilized to defray the costs of inspections and to support fire safety and prevention programs.

# TREASURY FUND/BANK

The General Account is a clearing account for Agency collections.

The Publishing Fees account is a clearing account set up to receive and disburse funds collected for publication of insurance companies' annual financial statements.

The Surplus Lines (Lock Box) account is a clearing account for Surplus Lines Premium Tax.

The Bail Bond Account receives and disburses funds deposited with the Agency by a professional bondsman as qualification bond under the provisions of Miss. Code Ann., Section 83-39-7.

#### I. Program Description:

The Mississippi Insurance Department, created by virtue of Miss. Code Ann., Section 83-1-1, is charged with the execution of all laws now in force, and those enacted subsequent to this budget request, which in any way affect or are relative to all insurance companies, corporations, associations, agents and other entities involved in the insurance business within the State of Mississippi.

As State Fire Marshal, the Commissioner of Insurance appoints the State Chief Deputy Fire Marshal who is charged with the duty to investigate, by himself or his deputy, the origin of every fire occurring within the State to which his attention is called by the Chief of the fire department or other law enforcement authority of any county or municipality. His duty is to investigate any case requested by any party in interest wherever, in his judgment, there is sufficient evidence or circumstance indicating that such fire may be incendiary in origin. Regulations governing the operation of this office are enumerated in Miss. Code Ann., Section 45-11-1 and 45-11-103. The State Chief Deputy Fire Marshal, regulates fireworks pursuant to Miss. Code Ann., Section 45-13-11; fire alarm systems for hotels, Miss. Code Ann., Section 45-11-29; training of county arson investigators, Miss. Code Ann., Section 83-1-39 (5) (b); and inspects private correctional facilities and buildings as well as private sororities and fraternities on state campuses upon request from interested persons, as stated in Miss Code Ann., Section 45-11-101.

By virtue of his designation as State Fire Marshal, the Commissioner of Insurance, through his State Chief Deputy Fire Marshal, is charged with promulgating the Mississippi Fire Prevention Code. These guidelines apply to all buildings owned by the State or by state agencies utilized for public assembly upon complaint, except in counties and municipalities that have adopted a fire prevention code. The Commissioner is charged with the enforcement of the Mississippi Fire Prevention Code and any other ordinance or regulation made under his authority, including the institution of actions or proceedings to prevent unlawful construction and to restrain, correct or abate any violation, and to prevent the occupancy of any building in violation of the Mississippi Fire Prevention Code.

Miss. Code Ann., Section 45-11-9, required the Fire Marshal's Division to develop and implement a Fire Safety Education Program for the State of Mississippi. This Program was developed and implemented in 2007.

Under Miss. Code Ann., Sections 75-49-1 through 75-49-19, the State Chief Deputy Fire Marshal is charged and directed to investigate and examine engineering and construction practices as well as the techniques and properties of materials used in the construction and assembly of manufactured homes. It also allows the Commissioner of Insurance to establish rules and regulations on the bonding and/or insurance requirements as part of the licensing requirements for manufactures, modular contractors, retailers, and transporters of factory-built homes. Furthermore, the Fire Marshal's Division is charged with the examination and inspection of the electrical, plumbing, heating appliances, anchoring and blocking systems and techniques, fire prevention, as well as the promotion of the safety of persons and property and the protection of the health of the users of such manufactured homes. The Mississippi Insurance Department can contract with HUD to conduct installation inspections of factory-built homes and to charge a fee for said service provided by HUD.

The Commissioner of Insurance is responsible for the distribution of Fire Insurance Rebate Funds and Rural Fire Truck Acquisition Program Funds as mandated by Miss. Code Ann., Sections 45-11-7, 83-1-37, 83-1-39 and 17-23-1. Miss. Code Ann., Section 17-23-11, creates the Supplementary Rural Fire Truck Program which is administered by the Insurance Department's Fire Services Division. House Bill 1465, 2008 Regular Legislative Session, amends Miss. Code Ann., Sections 83-1-37 and 83-1-39 to establish funding through the Municipal and County fire rebate programs to assist counties with training of personnel to conduct building code inspections.

Miss. Code Ann., Section 45-11-251 mandates administrative support to the Mississippi Fire Personnel Minimum Standards & Certification Board.

Miss. Code Ann., Section 73-69-1, established the Residential Electronic Protection Licensing Act to license & regulate the Residential Electronic Protection Industry.

Miss. Code Ann., Section 17-2-1, requires Jackson, Harrison, Hancock, Stone and Pearl River Counties, and municipalities to enforce wind and flood mitigation requirements prescribed by the 2003 International Residential Code and the 2003 International Building Code. Miss. Code Ann., Section 17-2-3, created the twenty-six (26) member Mississippi Building Codes Council. The State Fire Marshal or his designee is required to serve ex officio, to convene the first meeting of the council and to serve as the temporary chairman. House Bill 1465, 2008 Regular Legislative Session, amends Miss. Code Ann. Section 17-2-5 to establish that any county or municipality adopting building codes

Miss. Code Ann., Section 83-21-21 has been amended to allow the Mississippi Insurance Department to contract with a third party to assist with the regulation of surplus lines companies in lieu of the Mississippi Surplus Lines Association.

House Bill 785, 2010 Regular Legislative Session, was passed to conformed Mississippi's surplus lines laws with the federal Nonadmitted and Reinsurance Reform Act ("NRRA") which was signed into law by President Obama on July 21, 2010, as poart of the Dod-Frank Wall Street Reform Act. The intent o the NRRA is to make the surplus lines market more efficient and uniform on a national basis. This bill amends many of the surplus lines statutes.

Miss. Code Ann., Section 83-1-191, established a Comprehensive Hurricane Damage Mitigation Program within the Mississippi Insurance Department. The program is to develop and implement a comprehensive and coordinated approach for hurricane damage mitigation that includes: a cost-benefit study on wind hazard mitigation construction measures; wind certification and hurricane mitigation inspections; financial grants to retrofit properties; education and consumer awareness; an advisory council consisting of a representative of lending institutions, an agent selected by the Independent Insurance Agents of Mississippi, two (2) representatives of residential property insurers, selected by the Department of Insurance, one (1) representative of homebuilders, selected by the Home Builders Association of Mississippi, the Chairman of the House Insurance Committee, or his designee, the Chairman of the Senate Insurance Committee, or his designee, the Executive Director of the Mississippi Windstorm Underwriting Association, or his designee, and the Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency, or his designee; and rules and regulations governing the Program.

House Bill 777, 2009 Regular Legislative Session, amends Miss. Code Ann., Sections 27-15-85, 27-15-87, 27-15-89, 27-15-91, 83-17-1, 83-17-25, 83-17-53, 83-17-63, 83-17-65, 83-17-251, 83-17-253, 83-17-255, 83-17-257, 83-21-19, and 27-15-101, and repealed Miss. Code Ann., Sections 27-15-95, 27-15-99, and 83-17-43. The objective of House Bill 777 is to provide national uniformity with regard to insurance producer licensing. It implements new license periods and requirements for all newly created license types and a majority of existing license types issued by the Mississippi Insurance Department.

The "Mississippi Fire Safety Standard and Firefighter Protection Act", created by Senate Bill 2249, 2009 Regular Legislative Session, requires cigarette manufacturers to certify with the State Fire Marshal's Office that the cigarette paper used in manufacturing meets the adopted lowered permeability bands requirements. The State Fire Marshal's Office shall conduct certification testing to ensure compliance. For each brand family of cigarettes listed for certification, a manufacturer shall pay a fee of \$1,000 to the State Fire Marshal's Office which will be placed in the Cigarette Fire Safety Standard and Firefighter Protection Fund. As a result of the Mississippi Fire Safety Standard and Firefighter Protection Act, the Mississippi Insurance Department was appropriated \$250,000 in FY 2012. Of these funds, \$200,000 in the commodity category is to be used for fire prevention supplies and materials and to fund the purchase of smoke alarms. The remaining \$50,000 in the contractual category is to be used for public announcements providing fire prevention information. Estimated collections for this Act did not meet expectations. Therefore, only \$125,000 is being requested for FY 2013, with \$100,000 in the commodity category and \$25,000 in the contractual category.

The Interstate Insurance Product Regulation Compact enacted by Senate Bill 2841, 2009 Regular Legislative Session, allows joint and cooperative action among Compacting States to: promote and protect the interest of consumers of individual and group annuity, life insurance, disability income and long-term care insurance products; develop uniform standards for insurance products covered under the Compact; establish a central clearinghouse to receive and provide prompt review of insurance products covered under the Compacts, in certain cases, advertisements related thereto, submitted by insurers authorized to do business in one or more Compacting States; give appropriate regulatory approval to those product findings and advertisements satisfying the applicable uniform standard; improve coordination of regulatory resources and expertise between state insurance departments; create the Insurance Product Regulation Commission; and to perform these and such other related functions as may be consistent with the state regulation of the business of insurance.

House Bill 232, 2010 Regular Session, prohibits the sale or distribution of novelty lighters in Mississippi. The State Fire Marshal's office; a state, county or municipal law enforcement officer; or a municipal code enforcement officer is empowered to enforce this legislation. A person may not sell at retail, offer or distribute for retail sale or promotion a

novelty lighter . A person who violates this section commits a civil violation for which a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) may be imposed.

On March 23, 2010, President Obama signed comprehensive health reform, the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act ("PPACA"), into law. Said reform imposes on states the duty to implement several Federal programs and enforce certain Federal mandates. These new regulatory requirements include, but are not limited to, the following: establishing a mechanism to receive and review the expected substantial increase in the number of health insurance rate and form filings as a result of new Federal mandates and rating requirements; establishing a new health insurance premium rate review process in order to review health rate increase requests according to Federal standards; compiling rate increase information in order to submit it to the Department of Health and Human Services ("HHS") and in order to post said data on our website; compiling and Publishing health insurance policy information on our website; reviewing all policies to ensure that the new Federal medical loss ratio requirements are being met and ensuring that all rebates to consumers are being paid, where applicable, in a timely manner; reviewing all policies to ensure that all health insurers in Mississippi are complying with new Federal benefit mandates; preparing legislation and/or promulgating regulations in order to bring Mississippi into compliance with new Federal benefit mandates, reporting mandates, rate review requirements and medical loss ratio requirements; preparing legislation and/or regulations implementing the new Federal transparency of coverage and explanation of benefits requirements; enforcing said transparency of coverage and explanation of benefit requirements; Preparing legislation and or promulgating regulations in order to create an external claims review system pursuant to PPACA requirements; implementing, regulating and operating said external claims review system; resolving issues arising from various plan's attempts to maintain the "grandfathered" status of their plans and determining when and if a plan loses its "grandfathered" status; establishing via legislation and/or regulations and regulating a comprehensive Health Care Exchange in order to have said Exchange fully functional on or before January 1, 2014, as required by PPACA; and maintaining staff capable of being intimately knowledgeable about the health insurance reforms in PPACA so that they may inform and educate citizens of Mississippi about their rights under said law, their potential access to affordable health insurance and assist them in obtaining said health insurance.

The foregoing requirements represent only a fraction of what will be required of the Mississippi Insurance Department (MID) in the coming years. Over the next four to five years, MID expects the Federal Government to issue thousands of pages of regulations regarding the aforementioned issues as well as other matters concerning healthcare reform. MID has a duty to study these regulations, have a working knowledge of them and enforce their provisions.

### II. Program Objective:

The mission of the Mississippi Insurance Department is to provide the proper regulation of the insurance industry while creating an environment conducive to a competitive marketplace for the sale of insurance products while providing the maximum amount of consumer protection to the State's citizens and policyholders. Our aim is to facilitate the highest degree of economic security, quality of life, public safety and protection for the State's citizens at the lowest possible cost.

The State Fire Marshal's Division implements programs to decrease the number of fires across the State, particularly arson related fires. The office ensures that manufactured housing is safe and meets required quality standards. The Fire Marshal also works to ensure a safe building environment, free from fire hazards, and collects fire loss data to assist in the development of improved standards. The State Fire Marshal's Division implemented a Fire Safety Education Program during Fiscal Year 2007. The Fire Marshal regulates and licenses the Residential Electronic Protection Industry.

The Mississippi Fire Safety Standard and Firefighter Protection Act, established by Senate Bill 2249, 2009 Regular Session, requires the State Fire Marshal to inspect and certify each cigarette brand family.

Within the State Fire Marshal's Division, the State Fire Services Development Coordinator takes a proactive role in fire prevention by assisting fire departments across the State in confronting and overcoming problems related to manpower and funding resources. These reductions translate into economic benefits by reducing the cost of residential, commercial and industrial insurance coverage for all of the State's citizens.

An overall increase of \$12,635 to MID's continuation of existing activities is being requested for the FY 2013 Budget Request.

Salaries, Wages & Fringe Benefits has an increase request of \$6,684 due to underfunding during FY 2012. In accordance to MS Ann. Code Section 33-1-21 the Mississippi Insurance Department is requesting funding under this mandate, as the Agency has an employee on military leave and must maintain this position for five years.

Travel has an increase of \$10,325 to fund additional travel for Fire Marshals due to a Court Order filed 06/09/2011, in which the United States District Court for the Northern District of Mississippi has ordered the State Fire Marshal to inspect all county jails that house state prisoners, regardless of length of stay, beginning July 1, 2012. This is in addition to the approximate 6,000 state owned buildings under the State Fire Marshal statutory jurisdiction.

Contractual Services has an overall increase of \$19,419.

- An additional \$3,000 is being requested for employee training to educate new Fire Marshal positions being requested.

- A decrease of \$25,000 is being requested in Advertising & Public Information due to lack of collections of the Cigarette Tax.

- An increase of \$9,027 is being requested in Rents.

An additional \$500 is being requested for Record Storage Rent due to an increase in permanent records. An additional \$2,700 is being requested for Office Equipment Rent for the new Hasler Mail System.

An additional \$5,827 is being requested for Bureau of Buildings Rent as a charge for common area at the Dr. Eldon Langston Bolton State Office and MID will have a full years worth of rent at the 660 North Street Building for the Fire Marshals.

Hi and Lo band radios for our Fire Marshal Division. Additional funding is needed to continue implementation of MID's document management system. Other Equipment being requested is MsWIN capable radios, a total of twenty-six (26) at a cost of \$104,000. MsWIN radios, the new Statewide Communication System which will be fully operational in FY 2012, will allow emergency responders, Fire Marshals, statewide voice communication and interopterability with other state and local agencies during natural disasters.

Funding for Wireless Communication Devices has been requested in order to replace damaged PDAs.

(E) Upward Reallocation(s):

Five (5) upward reallocations are requested:

- Two (2) IS Division positions due to increased duties, responsibilities, complexities of multiple technologies and different methodologies used to meet the demands of the Agency for a total of \$4,821.

- Two (2) Actuary/Health Care Reform Division positions due to an increase in duties and responsibilities associated with the Health Care Exchange and PPACA for a total of \$10,909.

- One (1) Consumer Services Division position due to an increase in the number of requests for consumer assistance with a continued increase as a result of PPACA for a total of \$1,984.

These positions will acquire certifications during FY 2012. Criteria for benchmarks have been achieved by employees during FY 2010, FY 2011 & FY 2012; due to legislative restrictive language no funding was provided.

Benchmark designations are listed/approved in the SPB data base.

### (I) Vehicle(s):

MID is requesting funding for six (6) replacement and three (3) new vehicles for FY 2013. These vehicles are used for conducting Criminal Investigations (45-11-1), Fire Code Enforcement and Inspections (45-11-101), Mississippi Residential Electronic Protection Division Inspections (73-69-1), Pyrotechniques Inspections (25-45-1) and L C Gas Inspections (75-57-1 through 75-57-119).

Per the Bureau of Fleet Management's Fleet Manual, generally, most vehicles should be replaced when they reach 6 years (72 months) of service or 120,000 miles whichever comes first.

One of the six vehicles being requested is a 2004 model with over 137,000 miles on each as of June 30, 2011. The remaining vehicles range from 2006 to 2009 models with mileages ranging from 73,000 to 76,000 miles driven as of June 30, 2011. The average annual expected mileage is 25,000. Section 75-57-3, Miss. Code Ann., vests the Commissioner of Insurance with the sole and exclusive power and authority to administer and enforce such laws which include inspecting any liquefied compressed gas containers, systems, pump equipment, tank cars, storage tanks, or vehicles in which any liquefied compressed gas is present. The Agency is required to enforce the rules of L. P. Gas Code NFPA 58, 2004 edition; National Fuel Gas Code, NFPA 54, 2002 edition; and The Mississippi Liquefied Compressed Gas Rules and Regulations dated August 22, 1996.

The L. C. Gas Board is created to regulate matters pertaining to Liquefied Compressed Gas. The L. C. Gas Division inspects schools that use propane and places where the public meets or gathers. In addition to this, the L. C. Gas Division inspects annually propane bulk plants, cylinder dispensing plants, cargo vehicles and public, commercial, and domestic installations as deemed necessary. The division holds safety and code training seminars throughout the year.

#### II. Program Objective:

To administer and enforce the Liquefied Compressed Gas Equipment Inspection Laws, Miss. Code, Ann., Sections 75-57-1 through 75-57-119, L. P. Gas Code, NFPA 58, 2004 edition, National Fuel Gas Code, NFPA 54, 2002 edition, and Mississippi Liquefied Compressed Gas Rules and Regulations dated August 22, 1996.

Provide an increase in industry and consumer product safety awareness, while decreasing liquefied compressed gas accidents, deaths, injuries, and property loss.

#### I. Program Description:

House Bill 1500, 2007 Regular Session, known as the "Mississippi Economic Growth and Redevelopment Act of 2007", created a special fund known as the "Mississippi Windstorm Underwriting Association Reinsurance Assistance Fund". This fund was created to assist the Mississippi Windstorm Underwriting Association, which was created by Chapter 450, Laws of 1987, with defraying of expenses and costs for reinsurance under Miss. Code Ann., Section 83-34-1.

The State Tax Commission shall deposit into the Mississippi Windstorm Underwriting Association Reinsurance Assistance Fund \$20,000,000 annually each fiscal year, beginning with fiscal year 2007 and continuing through fiscal year 2010. Due to the way the State Tax Commission collects and transfers these funds to the MID, the balance of funds associated with House Bill 1500 were transferred to the Mississippi Windstorm Underwriting Association during fiscal year 2011, with the total amount transferred associated with House Bill 1500 was \$81,876,510. These funds were derived from insurance premium tax revenue collected by the State Tax Commission as allowed under the provisions of Miss. Code Ann., Section 27-15-103.

An additional \$18,104,871 in Hurricane Disaster Relief Funds (HDRF) was transferred to the Mississippi Windstorm Underwriting Association during fiscal year 2010. This amount was less than anticipated due to the Governor's budget cut in the amount of \$1,895,129.

The total amount transferred to the Mississippi Windstorm Underwriting Association from fiscal year 2007 through fiscal year 2011 was \$99,981,381.

# II. Program Objective:

The Mississippi Insurance Department's objective is to assist with the reduction of premium rates charged for insuring property through the Mississippi Windstorm Underwriting Association for the coastal area counties including Hancock, Harrison, Jackson, Pearl River, Stone and George. These funds are to serve as a subsidy to assist the insureds in the Windpool.

In efforts to stimulate economic growth, the Mississippi Insurance Department is promoting the availability of affordable commercial and residential casualty loss insurance.

Name of Agency

### OVERVIEW OF BUDGET REQUEST

In order to fulfill the Mississippi Insurance Department's mission and effectively implement laws and regulations necessary for the oversight of the insurance industry, the Agency is requesting the funds necessary to continue providing the services mandated by law.

Since 1991, the Mississippi Insurance Department has operated on one hundred percent (100%) special funds. The MID continues to receive special funds which are generated from a small liquefied compressed gas tax, statutory insurance filing fees and company assessments.

In Fiscal Year 2012, the MID received a lump sum appropriation. The Department is requesting to continue with a lump sum appropriation for Fiscal Year 2013.

The Mississippi Insurance Department's (MID) Fiscal Year 2013 Budget Request reflects an overall increase of 5.2% over its' Fiscal Year 2012 appropriation. The Mississippi Insurance Department's estimate of funds needed for the continuation and expansion of existing activities reflects an overall increase of \$619,432. The primary reason for this increase is the need for additional staff in the Financial & Market Regulation Division and the Fire Marshal Division. These positions are being requested in order for MID to retain accreditation and to comply with a court order requiring the Fire Marshals to inspect all county jails in addition to the approximate 6,000 state owned buildings under the State Fire Marshal statutory jurisdiction.

As a result of the Mississippi Fire Safety Standard and Firefighter Protection Act, the Mississippi Insurance Department was appropriated \$250,000 in FY 2012. Of these funds, \$200,000 in the commodity category is to be used for fire prevention supplies and materials and to fund the purchase of smoke alarms. The remaining \$50,000 in the contractual category is to be used for public announcements providing fire prevention information. Estimated collections for this Act did not meet expectations. Therefore, only \$125,000 is being requested for FY 2013, with \$100,000 in the commodity category and \$25,000 in the contractual category.
