The purpose of the Public Employees' Retirement System (System), which was established by legislation in 1952, is to provide retirement benefits for all state employees and other public employees whose employers have elected to participate. Salaries, Wages and Fringe Benefits - Funding requested in this category includes an increase of \$311,059 in salary expenditures for continuation of current activities and services, of which \$50,420 is an increase in the SPB salary projection over FY 2012; \$68,981 for MIS special compensation; \$41,000 for reallocations; \$108,658 for reclassification of positions; and \$42,000 for the PERS Board of Trustees' payroll.

Travel - PERS requests \$80,000, an amount equal to the 2012 budget appropriation. This travel request will ensure adequate training for Board Members and staff, as well as provide for in-state travel for pre-retirement staff.

Contractual Services - PERS requests \$3,659,000, an amount equal to the 2012 budget appropriation, to maintain existing contracts, fees and software maintenance.

Commodities - PERS requests total funding of \$325,000. This request is equal to our 2012 appropriation and is the minimum amount needed to fund major initiatives in printed communications. Our request also encompasses normal growth in operating expenses associated with office and equipment supplies.

Capital Outlay - Our total continuation request in this category is \$126,700, which includes funding for information systems related equipment such as memory upgrades, expanded disk space, and the replacement of 15 desktops and six PCs. In addition, our request includes funding for backup systems, a forms/check folder, a MICR check reader, audio/visual equipment, and PDAs for Field Representatives.

IV. Additional program activities that will result from increased funding requested in Columns 16-25 (MBR-1-03) and specified Budget Decision Unit Columns (MBR-1-03-A):

(E) Investments & Pension IT:

Salaries, Wages and Fringe Benefits - Funding of \$102,076 is requested for a PERS Investment Director-Real Assets. This position is critical to PERS' continued ability to monitor investment activity in the area of Real Assets. In addition, PERS is requesting two positions in the Information Technology Division. A Programmer Analyst II, at \$54,453 and a Systems Administrator I, \$39,255 are required to operate, maintain, and support the new pension administration system, which the line of business will be fully implemented by the beginning of 2013 .

The total 2013 budget request of \$13,619,557 for Public Employees' Retirement System shows an increase of \$523,543 or 4.0 percent above approved funding for fiscal year 2012. PERS continues its commitment to align our staff, business processes and technology in support of our mission to provide quality pension benefit services to our participants, all at the lowest possible cost.

Salaries, Wages & Fringe Benefits-

We are submitting a total budget request for salary expenditures of \$9,428,857, an increase of \$506,843 above approved funding for 2012.

Reallocations - PERS is requesting \$41,000 for positions in which it has been determined that a substantial difference exits between actual job performance, experience, and educational requirements versus the job title currently utilized by the agency. These positions are in the Administrative Services, Investment and Retirement Services Divisions.

Reclassifications - Our request includes \$108,658 for reclassification of positions under authority granted by the State Personnel Board to establish a career ladder to promote successful job performance, job training, and tenure in positions. Incumbents in these job classifications are required to successfully complete prescribed training, perform successfully in the PERS job series and meet the requirements defined in the PERS Career Ladders Guidelines for Auto-Reclassification/Promotion.

Management Information Systems Special Compensation - \$68,981 is being requested for the purpose of attracting, retaining and developing competent information technology professionals to support the unique information technology business needs of PERS.

Board of Trustees Payroll - Funding of \$42,000 is requested for the ten-member Board of Trustees' payroll, currently paid from Salaries (Base) but not included in the SPB's projection of salary costs.

PERS is requesting \$102,076 in appropriations for a PERS Investment Director-Real Assets position for the 2013 fiscal year. This position is necessary to perform research, analyses, and evaluation of the merits of different types of investment projects and programs. This position will also be charged with monitoring financial markets and assisting in the formulation of investment recommendations, as well as implementing approved portfolio strategy. The incumbent in this position will specialize in the areas of real estate and timber investments.

In addition, PERS is requesting two positions in the Information Technology Division. A Programmer Analyst II, at \$54,453 and a Systems Administrator I, \$39,255 are required to operate, maintain, and support the new pension administration system.

Travel-

PERS is requesting no increase in funding in the Travel category. The current funding level represents the minimum at which staff and board members can maintain adequate professional development and provide for educational services to agencies, members, and retirees.

Contractual Services-

PERS is requesting no increase in funding for Contractual Services. The request of \$3,659,000 provides for existing contracts, fees and software maintenance.

Included in the 2011 expenditures are building repairs of \$38,547, which are funded by escalation authority within the PERS Building Repair and Maintenance Fund (3533).

Commodities

PERS requests that funding for the 2013 budget remain the same as the fiscal year 2012 approved budget amount.

Our request in this category represents the lowest amount necessary to continue funding major initiatives in printed communications including annual membership statements, retiree/member newsletters and member handbooks.

Included in the 2011 expenditures are building repairs of \$403, which are funded by escalation authority within the PERS Building Repair and Maintenance Fund (3533).

Capital Outlay-

PERS is requesting a total of \$126,700 to fund Capital Outlay expenditures in fiscal year 2013, an increase of \$16,700 from our 2012 appropriation. Equipment requests total \$126,100, while Wireless Communication Devices total \$600.

Audio/Visual Equipment - \$20,000 in spending authority is requested for emergency use in replacing audio equipment in the board room and training room. The warranty on this equipment expired in September, 2007. This request includes presenter and board table microphones, digital recording and audio/visual equipment.

Disaster Recovery Equipment - \$27,500 is requested for the purchase of a Exagrid Backup appliance with deduplication, which will provide data protection through faster and more reliable backups and restores.

Printers - \$25,500 is requested to replace 15 printers, 12 network and three for desktop use. This amount includes replacement of obsolete network printers, as well as three printers for new positions.

MICR Check Reader - \$15,000 is being requested to purchase a reader/verifier check qualifier, including maintenance for two years.

Forms/Check Folder - \$12,000 is requested to purchase a high production/commercial forms folder to be used to fold and seal checks, 1099R's and other PERS forms for mailing.

Memory Upgrade, Disk Space and Equipment - \$26,100 is requested to manage escalating processing and storage capacity requirements of the System and to secure equipment for emergencies and/or unplanned projects. One computer is included in our request of equipment for emergencies/unplanned projects and the remaining computers are requested for replacement computers and for three new positions. The need for expanded disk space and memory is expected to continue as the number of retirees increases each year.

Wireless Communications Devices- \$600 is requested to provide for emergency replacement of PDAs for PERS Field Representatives.
