FEDERAL FUNDS

Federal Grants awarded to the MCL from the Bureau of Justice Assistance as well as the National Institute of Justice for continuationa dn enhancement of forensic services. Grants included the DNA Backlog Reduction Grant and the Paul Coverdell Crime Lab Enhancement Grant. State Supported Special Funds- The MCL received \$633,000 in Federal ARRA grants funds for the hiring and retention of 5 key personnel. This money will be expended this year.

STATE SUPPORT SPECIAL FUNDS

ARRA grant awarded to retain key individuals whose grant funding had ended as well as enhancement law enforcement tecnology capabilities and maintain staffing of the DNA section. State Supported Special Funds- The MCL received \$633,000 in Federal ARRA grants funds for the hiring and retention of 5 key personnel. This money will be expended this year.

BCF- \$870,821 to cover general fund reduction

OTHER SPECIAL FUNDS

The MCL maintains 3 special fund accounts. Fund 371E is derived from a \$25 assessment on all DUI convictions and is directed to supplement the operation of the MCL Implied Consent Program for which we are statutorily responsible. Fund 3713 funds are derived from a \$50 assessment applied to all law enforcement agencies that submit a case to the MCL. This assessment is per case regardless of the complexity and number of requests. Fund 371N is derived from an assessment of convicted felons and sex offenders who must supply a DNA sample for analysis and upload to the DNA database. This fund supplements the DNA analysis program for the state.

Forensic Analysis is the primary service provided by the MCL. This program consists of 8 highly technical and specialized areas of expertise: Trace/Microanalysis, Impression Evidence, Firearms and Tool-Marks, Toxicology, Identification of Controlled Substances, Human Impairment and DUI Testing, Physical Evidence Analysis, FIre Debris Analysis, and Questioned Documents. The scientists in these areas of expertise employ the latest methodology on state of the art technology to develop information from items of evidence from criminal activity. They prepare an official report of those scientific findings and provide testimony as an expert witness as required. Training to law enforcement personnel is also provided on proper evidence collection techniques. The quality of the scientific analyses performed in this program is evaluted and accredited by the American Society of Crime Lab Directors-Laboratory Accreditation Board.

II. Program Objective:

The objective of this program is to provide accurate, timely scientific analysis to our clients. The results of those analyses provide the foundation for the criminal justice system to identify, apprehend and adjuducate individuals responsible for criminal activity.

PROGRAM NAME

I. Program Description:

This program was mandated in 1994 by MCA 45-33-15. This statute established a forensic DNA testing laboratory which adheres to the federal guidelines established through the Quality Assurance standards for forensic DNA testing issued by the Fedreral Bureau of Investigation. This same statute identified the MCL as responsible for the establishment of the sex offender database. This database was expanded by statute in 2003 to include forensic profiles of all known felons. By the end of FY11, the MCL had uploaded over 50,000 convicted felon profiles into this database. The MCL maintains this database as well as access to the national database resulting solving numerous crimes where the suspect had yet to be identified. This system and the MCL DNA section has dramatically increased the crime-solving capabilities for law enforcement in the state.

II. Program Objective:

The objective of this program is to utilize a higher degree of scientific discrimination when identifying and individualizing biological stains. This testing allows evidence recovered from crime scenes to be linked to individuals rather than to a less discriminating broad population group.

Costs associated with this as well as forensic DNA cases will have to be suported by the State in order to maintain federal compliance. In addition the ARRA grant will also have been expended and the MCL cannot loose key personnel that have been critical in our past success.

The Mississippi Crime Laboratory incurred a \$1,000,000 reduction in operating capital during FY 2010 due to budget reductions which continued through FY 2011. This reduction significantly impacted the lab's ability to hire personnel into vacancies, allow travel to receive mandatory continuing education requirements, purchase any non-grant supplied equipment and marginally meet contractual and commodity obligations for analytical casework. Recent court rulings have impacted the MCL's ability to work cases as efficiently due to the requirement that the analyst of record must appear in court for testimony.

The FY 2013 budget request increases of general funds over FY 2012 estimated are based on the loss of federal grant funding which has helped sustain the lab over the past two years.

Personnel- An increase in personnel budget reflects the full funding of the reestablished PINS during FY 12. The MCL was preparing to hire analysts in sections experiencing significant increases in caseload (10-15%), such DNA, DUI cases, and controlled substances. The inability to fill these positions has directly impacted our ability to keep the backlog of criminal cases in check. Additionally, one the biggest struggles the MCL historically incurs is retention of trained, qualified analysts. After completing a 1.5-2 year training program the MCL has been unable, due to restrictions, provide raises or adequate competitive compensation to experienced employees. Loss of experienced personnel after such an investment is devastating to our operational structure.

Travel- The MCL employees maintain professional certifications required by both their job descriptions as well as the Laboratory's accreditation. A minimum number of continuing education hours are mandatory in order to keep this status.

Commodities and Contractual Services- The figures reflected are based on the minimum operational costs during the FY 2011 with no significant increase. Approximately \$400,000 of this category alone is obligated to instrument service contracts to maintain the aging laboratory equipment. During FY 2012 the MCL will opened the new Gulfcoast Regional Crime Laboratory to replace the four trailers we have operated out of since Katrina. The cost of operating this facility including a morgue may also affect the amount of utilities obligations for both FY 2012 and 2013.

Equipment- The MCL operates over \$4,000,000 of analytical instrumentation daily for the analysis of physical evidence. Many of our instruments have already exceeded their 5 year life expectancy; in fact some of the instruments we use are over 10 years old and are no longer supported by the companies they were purchased from. The MCL must have the ability to replace these older instruments and be able to utilize state of the art equipment in the analysis of evidence. A plan to replace only the oldest instruments for an equipment budget of \$295,000 is included.
