MISSISSIPPI COMMISSION FOR VOLUNTEER SERVICE

NARRATIVE OF FEDERAL FUNDS AWARDED TO MCVS

MCVS ADMINISTRATIVE FUNDS (100% cash/inkind match requirement - State General Funds). MCVS is awarded administrative funds annually by the Corporation for National & Community Service (CNCS) for the operation and management of national service programs in Mississippi. MCVS is required to match 100% (pursuant to the 1993 National & Community Service Trust Act) from state monies for the administrative functioning of the agency. Federal funds allocated to Mississippi for January 1 - December 31, 2012 total \$342,724.

PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE & TRAINING (PDAT) FUNDS (no match)

MCVS is awarded annually by the Corporation for National & Community Service funds designated for technical assistance, training events, conferences, and other educational activities. These funds are specifically targeted for Learn and Serve, AmeriCorps and Senior Corps programs. Training is offered on a wide variety of subjects-i.e., grant writing, stress management, financial management, volunteer recruitment and retention, etc. Annually the number of participants ranges from 500 to 1,200 or more. MCVS received \$70,717 in PDAT funds.

VOLUNTEER GENERATION (30% match)

Volunteer Generation funds are being applied for through the Corporation for National & Community Service. This committeent will support the development of a comprehensive network of volunteer centers throughout the State of Mississippi. MCVS will utilize these monies to support local volunteer centers, connecting resources and information. Funds will be dispersed to programs based on a Request For Proposals selection process performed by independent reviewers. MCVS anticipates being awarded funding in the amount of \$270,000 for local centers. The match requirement for these funds is 30% and will be derived from state general funds and support from the local volunteer center agencies.

AMERICORPS COMPETITIVE & FORMULA FUNDS (24% match requirement)

CNCS allocates funds to MCVS annually for sub-granting projects throughout the state. MCVS is awarded funds on a population-based formula and through competitive application to CNCS. Funds are dispersed to programs based on a Request For Proposal selection process performed by independent reviewers. For FY 2012, \$6,404,785 (\$1,686,141 in formula funds and \$4,718,644) in competitive funds), was made available to MCVS, 99% of which is sub-granted to nonprofit organizations and governmental agencies to address unmet community needs in the areas of education, human needs, public safety/homeland security, and the environment.

DISABILITY FUNDS (no match)

MCVS is an equal opportunity agency with a vested interest in furthering the ADA provisions as they relate to national service (PL 103-82) and volunteerism in general. With the availability of federal CNCS funds totaling \$124,079, MCVS is able to provide a continuum of services and technical assistance (reasonable accommodation) for individuals with disabilities and their host programs. MCVS is charged with providing individuals with disabilities in local communities the skills, resources, and knowledge necessary to assure the successful integration and retention of AmeriCorps members with disabilities.

ARRA - GS

In Fiscal 2012, MCVS accessed \$43,016.00 in ARRA-General Services funding by way of the Governor's Office. The funding was limited to salary expenditures only.

STATE SUPPORT SPECIAL FUNDS

MCVS was awarded \$140,000 in FY 2012 in American Reinvestment and Recovery Act (ARRA) State Fiscal Stabilization Funds - Government Services funds via agreement number 277-SFSF. However, based on the agreement the funds were restricted to certain expenditures and only available for the first three months of the fiscal year. Based on these restrictions, the agency expenditures for that timeframe, only \$43,016 could be accessed. This amount was used to fund salary costs.

OTHER SPECIAL FUNDS

MISSISSIPPI COMMISSION FOR VOLUNTEER SERVICE NARRATIVE OF OTHER SPECIAL FUNDS TO MCVS

AMERICORPS ADMINISTRATION 1%

MCVS earns 1% of the total funds expended by its AmeriCorps subrecipients. These funds are utilized for training, monitoring and oversight provided to the program.

VOLUNTEERS IN SERVICE TO AMERICA (VISTA) - COST SHARE

MCVS collected fees from VISTA host sites which it used as match to meet the VISTA grant requirements and for VISTA program oversight costs.

GOVERNOR'S INITIATIVE FOR VOLUNTEER EXCELLENCE (GIVE)

MCVS receives donations from private businesses and other donors which it uses to plan and develop the annual GIVE award recognition ceremony and in support of volunteerism development throughout the state.

SPECIAL EVENT

MCVS received sponsorships and local collaborative support for two joint conference events - 1. Mississippi, Louisiana, Alabama Tri-State Voluntary Organizations Active in Disasters Conference (November 2011) and the Positioned for Progress Conference (May 2012).

TREASURY FUND/BANK

TREASURY FUND/BANK ACCOUNTS

MCVS, in the past thirteen years, has generated funds through registration fees, donations, sponsorship of events, and private business support. MCVS hosts three annual training events which generate funds from registration and exhibitor fees. MCVS is also charged with hosting the annual Governor's Initiative for Volunteer Excellence (GIVE) Awards honoring exemplary state volunteers. This event attracts private businesses to donate and sponsor activities.

I. The funds generated from these events are accounted for and recorded in two separate fund accounts, 1% Collections #3487, GIVE and # 3478. For FY2012, MCVS is expected to have a balance of \$125,500 in the two accounts. Since IHL is the fiscal agent for MCVS, the funds are maintained in the following account(s):

The Mississippi Commission for Volunteer Service promotes community service and volunteerism as a way to meet local needs more effectively.

II. Program Objective:

The objective of the Mississippi Commission for Volunteer Service (MCVS) is to engage and support Mississippians of all ages and backgrounds in service to their communities. MCVS makes grants to volunteer and community service organizations in Mississippi. It administers federal funds under the National and Community Service Trust Act of 1993, which supports national and community service activities focusing on the four national/state priorities of education, health and human needs, public safety/homeland security, and environment, and under the Edward M. Kennedy Serve America Act of 2009, which reauthorized and strengthened national service laws.

Commission duties authorized by Section 43-55-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, include:

- (a) Promote increased coordination, visibility, and support for volunteers of all ages, especially youth and senior citizens, and community service in meeting the unmet needs of communities.
- (b) Ensure that its funding decisions meet all federal and state requirements.
- (c) Recommend innovative, creative, statewide service programs to increase volunteer participation in all age groups and community-based problem solving among diverse participants.
- (d) Develop and implement a centralized system for obtaining information and technical support concerning volunteerism and community service recruitment, projects, training methods, materials, and activities throughout this state. The commission shall provide the information and support upon request.
- (e) Promote interagency collaboration to maximize resources and develop a model of such collaboration on the state level.
- (f) Provide public recognition and support of volunteer efforts that address community needs by individuals, by private sector organizations and businesses, and partnerships between the public and private sectors.
- (g) Stimulate increased community awareness of the effects of volunteer services in this state.
- (h) Utilize local, state and federal resources to initiate, strengthen, and expand quality service programs.
- (i) Serve as this state's representative to national and state organizations that support the commission's mission.
- (j) Prepare for this state a national three-year service plan that is developed through an open and public process that provides maximum participation and input from national service programs in this state and other interested members of the public. The plan shall be updated annually and contain information that the commission considers appropriate or the corporation requires. The plan shall ensure outreach to diverse community-based agencies that serve under-represented populations, by either using established state networks and registries or establishing these networks and registries.
- (k) Prepare this state's financial assistance applications under Section 117B of Title I, 42 U.S.C. 12543, and Section 130 of Title I, 42 U.S.C. 12582.
- (l) Assist in the preparation of the Department of Education's application for assistance under the Domestic Volunteer Service Act of 1973, Public Law 93-113, 87 Stat. 394.
- (m) Prepare this state's application under Section 130 of Title I, 42 U.S.C. 12582, for the approval of service positions that include the national service educational award described in Division D of Title I, 42 U.S.C. 12601 to 12604.
- (n) Make recommendations to the corporation with respect to priorities for programs receiving assistance under the Domestic Volunteer Service Act of 1973, Public Law 93-113, 87 Stat. 394.
- (o) Make technical assistance available to enable applicants for assistance under Section 121 of Title I, 42 U.S.C. 12571, to plan and implement service programs and to apply for assistance under the national service laws, using information and materials available through a clearing house established under Section 198A of Title I, 42 U.S.C. 12653a, if appropriate.
- (p) Assist participants in national service programs that receive assistance under Section 121 of Title I, 42 U.S.C. 12571, in attaining health care and child care under Section 140 of Title I, 42 U.S.C. 12594.
- (q) Develop a state system for the recruitment and placement of participants in programs that receive assistance under the national service laws.
- (r) Disseminate information about national service programs that receive assistance under the national service positions.
- (s) Use assistance provided under Section 121 of Title I, 42 U.S.C. 12571, to administer this state's grant program in support of national service programs including the selection, oversight, and evaluation of grant recipients.
- (t) Develop projects, training methods, curriculum materials, and other materials and activities related to national service programs that receive assistance directly from the corporation or from the state using assistance provided

under Section 121 of Title I, for use by such programs upon request.

- (u) Establish policies and procedures for the use of federal funds received under Title I of the national service laws.
- (v) Coordinate its functions, including recruitment, public awareness, and training activities, with any division of the Corporation for National and Community Service.

To achieve this mission, MCVS promotes coalitions and collaborative efforts among public and private entities, including nonprofits, faith-based organizations, institutions of higher learning, and state and local agencies. Through the advancement of community service programs and resource sharing initiatives throughout the state, MCVS addresses myriad state and local needs, particularly around the national service focus areas of education, veterans and military families and disaster services. Since Hurricane Katrina, MCVS has also provided volunteer coordination support to local agencies and the State in times of disaster. Direct and demonstrable results are being achieved through fostering civic responsibility, strengthening the ties that bind us together as Mississippians, and providing educational opportunities for those who make a substantial commitment to service.

III. Current program activities as supported by the funding in Columns 5-12 (FY09 Estimated & FY10 Increase/Decrease for continuations) of MBR-1-03 and designated Budget Unit Decisions columns of MBR-1-03-A:

MCVS program priorities focus on the six major categories of Finance & Administration; Program Management & Development; Communication & Training; Resource Development; Volunteerism Development; and Disaster Preparedness, Response, and Recovery. These program categories are defined as follows:

Finance & Administration will include conducting sub-grantee fiscal monitoring and evaluations; preparing quarterly financial reports on program activities in a timely and accurate manner; maintaining appropriate financial management systems to disburse funds and track commission and program expenditures according to legal and grant requirements; processing and reviewing monthly program reimbursements; evaluating whether programs comply with legal, reporting, financial management and grant requirements and ensuring follow through on issues; reviewing audit reports on programs and ensuring that programs take appropriate and timely action; providing ongoing fiscal training and technical assistance to programs; ensuring grant compliance with federal, state, and local guidelines; and other grant administration duties.

Program Management & Development will include coordinating the grant review process to select high quality national service programs utilizing peer and staff grant reviewers; conducting sub-grantee programmatic monitoring and evaluation; assessing impact/outcome results of programs' goals and objectives; writing and disseminating progress reports of program activities; conducting program site visits and review of records at least annually; providing ongoing technical assistance to programs; ensuring grant compliance with federal, state, and local guidelines; acquiring and disseminating national, regional, and local "best practices," innovative service models, and/or information to Mississippi programs; and other program management activities.

Communication & Training activities include coordinating observances of national volunteer recognition days on a statewide level; strengthening volunteer service infrastructure and maximizing resources in the state by collaborating with other governmental, private, and nonprofit organizations; developing and distributing a monthly eNewsletter on service activities in the state; developing and implementing communication and marketing strategies; creating high-quality communication and marketing materials; assisting national service programs, volunteer centers, and other partners in identifying and accessing local and national training and technical assistance resources; establishing and maintaining a comprehensive updated website (www.mcvs.org) for resource sharing, information dissemination, data collection, and training opportunities; and coordinating conferences and other training and technical assistance events for national service programs and other volunteer groups.

Resource Development activities include developing and implementing Board governance policies and plans; securing and sustaining corporate sponsors for MCVS programs such as the Governor's Initiative for Volunteer Excellence (GIVE) Awards, conferences, and other MCVS efforts; strengthening volunteer service infrastructure and maximizing resources in the state by collaborating with other governmental, private, and nonprofit organizations; building strong and lasting relationships through personal contacts with the traditional volunteer sector, the nonprofit sector, (local, state, and national) government, businesses, foundation communities, and the public; promoting the income tax check-off to benefit MCVS as provided by the Legislature in the 1997 session; marketing the "Volunteer Y'all" license plates which also benefit MCVS; and acting as a catalyst for positive community change, encouraging innovative ideas and programs that address community needs through service and volunteerism.

Volunteerism Development will include fostering the concept and benefits of community volunteerism, volunteer

centers, and Cities of Service programs to nonprofit, business and government entities across the state, assisting interested entities in developing proposals for new volunteer centers, coordinating training and technical assistance for volunteer center staff and AmeriCorps VISTA members, assisting volunteer centers in meeting standards set by the Points of Light Foundation/HandsOn Network's Volunteer Center National Network, assisting volunteer centers with implementation of volunteer management systems, conducting site visits and program review to assure the development of high-performing volunteer centers, and encouraging volunteerism among Mississippians through general public outreach and special population-focused initiatives inclusive of seniors, veterans and military families, and disabled persons.

Disaster Preparedness, Response, and Recovery activity centers on the appropriate use of volunteers and donated goods in times of disaster in Mississippi, and the effective coordination of federal, state and local resources as available to ensure successful long-term recovery of Mississippians affected by disaster. Activities include ensuring that all volunteer agencies working in a disaster setting comply with all local, state and federal orders and regulations, working in a coordinated and collaborative effort with responding non-governmental organizations and local agencies in the response and recovery phases of an emergency event, and efficiently and equitably distributing donated goods and funds when necessary; ensuring that MCVS is internally prepared for a disaster that debilitates primary personnel, office space, equipment, data, and services; working in other states through the Emergency Management Assistance Compact should disaster assistance be requested; and ensuring national service resources and programs are compatible with any disaster deployment plans of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency, the Federal Emergency Management Agency and the Corporation for National and Community Service.

Administration, PDAT & Disability: MCVS is awarded federal dollars through the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS) for Commission Administration, Program Development, Assistance, and Training (PDAT), and Disability Inclusion. 2012 MCVS commission administration funds total \$342,724*, with a total 1 to 1 non-federal match requirement of \$342,742*; the commission administrative performance objective is to engage in outreach to organizations that may be interested in operating AmeriCorps programs, and convene and collaborate with volunteering and service entities within the state as outlined in the Mississippi state service plan, a partnership of MCVS, the Mississippi State Program Office of the Corporation for National and Community Service, the Mississippi Department of Education, Campus Compact, the Mississippi Center for Nonprofits and the AmeriCorps National Civilian Community Corps (NCCC) Southern Regional Campus. CNCS routinely selects a certain number of states each year to undergo an audit by its Office of the Inspector General. The audit includes not only examination of the State Commission systems, but those of its sub-grantees as well. MCVS was selected for an audit which began in late 2006 and concluded in May 2008, with MCVS receiving a clear management decision.

In 2012, PDAT funds awarded to MCVS in the amount of \$70,717*, are supporting activity of the Mississippi National Service Cross-Stream Council (comprised of Mississippi state service plan partners and national service stakeholders), a series of public information and listening sessions held around the state to increase access to national service resources, customized training experiences for AmeriCorps, VISTA, Volunteer Center and Senior Corps program staff, and educational conferences promoting personal and professional development for national service members.

Disability inclusion funds totaling \$124,079*have been requested for the 2012 program year, for the convening of a statewide Disability Inclusion Team, planning and implementation of the annual Connect One Disaster Summit bringing together disability agencies, first responders and health care providers for preparedness planning and resource sharing, training for a variety of audiences in disability inclusion practices, and administration of mini-grants for organizations enhancing Make a Difference Day projects through disability inclusion.

AmeriCorps State & National: As a grant-making entity, MCVS administers federal dollars devoted to AmeriCorps, the domestic Peace Corps program, which provides full-time members working to "get things done" in local communities with a modest living stipend and an education award of \$5,550 upon completion of 1,700 hours of service. In the 2012-13 program year, there will be over 1,300 AmeriCorps members serving in communities all over the state (all 82 Mississippi counties were served by national service programs in 2011-12). Of these, 668 AmeriCorps positions will be operated under direct MCVS administrative oversight. MCVS is awarded funds on a population-based formula and through competitive application to the CNCS. Funds are disbursed to programs based on a Request for Proposals selection process performed by independent reviewers. For the 2012-13 program year, MCVS AmeriCorps State funding total \$6,404,783* (\$1,686,139 in formula funds and \$4,718,644 in competitive funds), 99% of which is sub-granted to nonprofit organizations and governmental agencies to address unmet community needs. The remaining 1% is used to administer, monitor, and support these local programs.

Volunteer Generation Program: In fall 2010, MCVS joined the first round of recipients nationally awarded a Volunteer Generation Fund grant, authorized by the Kennedy Serve America Act and administered by CNCS. The Mississippi Volunteer Generation program is designed to significantly increase the state's volunteer rate by strengthening and/or developing regional volunteer connector organizations (volunteer centers) who operate as local volunteer hubs for their communities. Investment in volunteer infrastructure generates a substantial return for the state; Volunteering in America 2010 (published by CNCS) reports an annual average of 520,000 volunteers serve 70.7 million hours in Mississippi, valued by Independent Sector as an economic contribution of \$1.5 billion. This impressive re-investment in Mississippi communities has been achieved with just five community-based volunteer centers functioning in varying degrees of efficiency as a connector organization, and there is much opportunity for further development of valuable volunteer resources, as Mississippi ranks 45th in the national volunteer rate index (up from 46th last year). Volunteer centers in less populated, poorer regions of the state have struggled to continue their original purpose of connecting volunteers; while volunteer centers in more heavily populated areas have in general continued to connect and manage volunteers while offering capacity-building training to local partners. The federal award to MCVS of \$270,000* requires a non-federal match commitment of \$184,116. The majority of funds (70%) are sub-granted to community-based volunteer centers, through a competitive request for proposals process, for increasing capacity to engage more volunteers. Remaining funds - 30% of the total award - are used for direct support of volunteer center efforts through personalized monitoring, training, consulting, and statewide volunteerism promotion.

Disaster Preparedness, Response & Recovery: MCVS has been designated by the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency (MEMA) to be the responsible agency for the Emergency Support Function (ESF) 6 (Mass Care, Housing, and Human Services) Volunteers and Donations Management Annexes of the Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan (CEMP) for the State of Mississippi. Due to severe storms and tornadoes in the spring of 2011, and historic Mississippi River flooding, 40 of the state's 82 counties were federally declared eligible for individual assistance this year through the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). MCVS staff contacted local emergency management directors in the immediate aftermath of the severe storms to determine needs for volunteer assistance and donations management. Where necessary, MCVS staff trained local government officials, nonprofits and/or volunteers to open and operate Volunteer Response Centers and/or donations drop-points, and coordinated the reporting of local volunteer efforts to the state. Well over 8,000 volunteers have served disaster declared counties through six MCVS-supported Volunteer Response Centers in 2011. As the initial response efforts transitioned into long-term recovery, at least 14 of the 40 declared counties established Long-Term Recovery Committees to provide coordinated local, state and federal assistance to those affected by the dual disasters. MCVS staff continue to participate in these local long-term recovery meetings, along with FEMA and MEMA staff, to ensure coordination among federal, state and local efforts, including public and private entities.

Name of Agency

The Mississippi Commission for Volunteer Service promotes community service and volunteerism as a way to meet local needs more effectively.

The objective of the Mississippi Commission for Volunteer Service (MCVS) is to engage and support Mississippians of all ages and backgrounds in service to their communities.

MCVS makes grants to volunteer and community service organizations in Mississippi. It administers federal funds under the National and Community Service Trust Act of 1993, which supports national and community service activities focusing on the four national/state priorities of education, health and human needs, public safety/homeland security, and environment, and under the Edward M. Kennedy Serve America Act of 2009, which reauthorized and strengthened national service laws. The agency also serves the state by providing Disaster Preparedness and Response as well as Volunteer Coordination services since Hurricane Katrina. MCVS is also authorized by Section 43-55-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, to:

- (a) Promote increased coordination, visibility, and support for volunteers of all ages, especially youth and senior citizens, and community service in meeting the unmet needs of communities.
- (b) Ensure that its funding decisions meet all federal and state requirements.
- (c) Recommend innovative, creative, statewide service programs to increase volunteer participation in all age groups and community-based problem solving among diverse participants.
- (d) Develop and implement a centralized system for obtaining information and technical support concerning volunteerism and community service recruitment, projects, training methods, materials, and activities throughout this state. The commission shall provide the information and support upon request.
- (e) Promote interagency collaboration to maximize resources and develop a model of such collaboration on the state level.
- (f) Provide public recognition and support of volunteer efforts that address community needs by individuals, by private sector organizations and businesses, and partnerships between the public and private sectors.
- (g) Stimulate increased community awareness of the effects of volunteer services in this state.
- (h) Utilize local, state and federal resources to initiate, strengthen, and expand quality service programs.
- (i) Serve as this state's representative to national and state organizations that support the commission's mission.
- (j) Prepare for this state a national three-year service plan that is developed through an open and public process that provides maximum participation and input from national service programs in this state and other interested members of the public. The plan shall be updated annually and contain information that the commission considers appropriate or the corporation requires. The plan shall ensure outreach to diverse community-based agencies that serve under-represented populations, by either using established state networks and registries or establishing these networks and registries.
- (k) Prepare this state's financial assistance applications under Section 117B of Title I, 42 U.S.C. 12543, and Section 130 of Title I, 42 U.S.C. 12582.
- (1) Assist in the preparation of the Department of Education's application for assistance under the Domestic Volunteer Service Act of 1973, Public Law 93-113, 87 Stat. 394.
- (m) Prepare this state's application under Section 130 of Title I, 42 U.S.C. 12582, for the approval of service positions that include the national service educational award described in Division D of Title I, 42 U.S.C. 12601 to 12604.
- (n) Make recommendations to the corporation with respect to priorities for programs receiving assistance under the Domestic Volunteer Service Act of 1973, Public Law 93-113, 87 Stat. 394.
- (o) Make technical assistance available to enable applicants for assistance under Section 121 of Title I, 42 U.S.C. 12571, to plan and implement service programs and to apply for assistance under the national service laws, using information and materials available through a clearing house established under Section 198A of Title I, 42 U.S.C. 12653a, if appropriate.
- (p) Assist participants in national service programs that receive assistance under Section 121 of Title I, 42 U.S.C. 12571, in attaining health care and child care under Section 140 of Title I, 42 U.S.C. 12594.
