The University of Mississippi Medical Center Hospitals and Clinics budget for Fiscal Year 2014 is the foundation of our vision. GENERAL FUNDS PRIORITIES

(1.) Appropriation of \$10,880,297

For fiscal 2013 and beyond the Medicaid Transfer is being eliminated. As such there is no provisional request for funding for the match related to this item. However there has been appropriations funded for teaching subsidies for the University Hospital that we seek continued funding for in the amount of \$10,880,297. This funding is critical to our abilities to our ability to make critical investments that improve the healthcares serivces to the citizens of this state.

A. Personnel Services:

1.) Salaries, Wages & Fringe Benefits:

The University Hospital requests approval to expend \$507,633,397 for salaries, wages and fringe benefits to health care and related workers employed by the University of Mississippi Medical Center's University Hospital and Clinics.

The retirement rate provided by the state for all employees was increased from 12.93% to 14.26% on July 1, 2012. Additional funding was not provided to UMMC to meet the cost of this increase.

- 2.) Travel.
 - The University Hospital requests approval to exend \$1,348,088 in travel expense as follows:
 - a.) Instate travel and subsistence for health care related programs and requirements throughout the State. Approval Request \$287,588

- b.) Communications, trasportation and utilities. Approval request \$1,365,110
- c.) Public information to inform the citizenry of health and related issues. Approval request \$502,999
- d.) Rents, principally to the Jackson Medical Mall Foundation. These fund salso allow us to rent specialized medical and related equipment. Approval request \$9,528,614
- e.) Repairs and service of equipment. These funds include repair and maintenance of buildings employed in the care of patients. Approval request \$6,816,132
- f.) Professional fees and other services. The majority of these funds are expended for the purchase of outside medical services that are not economically reaonable to provide within our system. Approval request \$6,111,749
- g.) Other contactual services. These funds include fidelity bonds, laundry, uniforms accreditiation, certifications, organ transplant acquisition costs, organ recovery contracts, collections, sanitary services, Life Flight Helicopter Ambulance and other functions. Approval request \$165,441,052
- h.) Data processing services and repairs. These funds are used to maintain and strengthen our health care and financial data requirements. Approval request \$3,295,442
- C. Commodites.

The University Hospital is requesting approval to expend \$165,496,097 for commodites as follows:

a.) Maintenance and other supplies. These funds are used to purchase items for repairs and maintenance on
