FEDERAL FUNDS

This agency receives federal funds mainly from the US Forest Service. These funds are used in support of our technical assistance and educational programs provided to the landowners and citizens of this great state.

Funds received for Forest Stewardship enable the agency to provide technical information and educate forest landowners for the purpose of maintaining sustained and profitable forests. Urban & Community Forestry Funds provide financial assistance, help build partnerships by working with non-profit groups and other agencies and enable the agency to provide technical assistance on a one on one basis.

We also receive federal dollars in support of fire detection, suppression and prevention. These dollars support protection of life and property, annually many structures and forestlands are saved from destruction.

A portion of Fire Protection funding is utilized in assisting rural Volunteer Fire Departments in becoming prepared to safely protect rural urbanized areas.

All federal matching is provided by direct salary expenses, which are General Fund expenses. The 100% reflected in the Federal Required Match column indicates that the federal grant is the sole funding source and there is no State match.

The federal grant revenue schedule reflects a negative amount as a prior year reimbursed expense. This is due to the need to record actual General Fund expenses and actual federal funds received based on the agency's accounting records. Based on those actual receipts there was less federal expense than federal revenue in specific grants.

OTHER SPECIAL FUNDS

Severence Tax - MS Code Section 49-19-201 through 227 restricts the use of these funds for the cost share payments to qualifying landowners for reforestation and forest improvements. These funds are expended in the Subsidies, Loans and Grants Category.

Forest Acreage Tax - MS Code Section 49-19-115 restricts the use of these special funds for the purchase of fire related equipment. These funds are expended in the Equipment Category.

All MIFI expenses are from Fund 3454

The travel category reflects a negative amount as a prior year reimbursed expense. This is due to the need to record actual General Fund expenses and actual federal funds received based on the agency's accounting records. Based on those actual receipts there was less expense than revenue in the travel category. The expense was lower than the revenue as there was a beginning balance due from the federal grant that was not reflected as a prior year expense.

TREASURY FUND/BANK

This agency has consolidated our petty cash funding from 14 to 10 accounts in a effort to control funding and monitor efficiency. This consolidation effort has resulted in a savings of \$6,000.00, reduced expenses and better utilized manpower concerning this area of resonsibility. See attached listing "Treasury Fund/Bank Accounts".

However, wildfires still continue to plague Mississippi. On average, there are about 3,200 wildfires each year in Mississippi. These fires burn over 56,000 acres. As the financial value of timber continues to increase, along with the increasing acreage of forestland, the Forest Protection Program remains a vital investment to the state's timber resource.

Providing assistance to the state's Volunteer Fire Departments has had a great impact on improving wildfire protection in Mississippi. The agency's Forest Stewardship Program is designed to provide motivation, limited on-the-ground services, technical assistance and advice to these landowners to help them make their lands more productive.

Forest Information program suppports all MFC programs by providing public information, program prmotional activities and program publicity. Urban and Community Forestry (UCF) assistance is included in Forest Information. UCF provides technical and financial assistance throughout the state in regard to the planting and management of community trees and forested acres. The goal is to manage and protect trees in and around cities and towns for the benefits they provide to people.

II. Program Objective:

The FRDP(Forest Resource Development Program) provides cost-share assistance to eligible forest landowners for establishing and/or improving their timberland as recommended and approved by the MFC. These programs provide limited financial assistance to landowners implementing specific forestry practices.

Effective July 1, 2006 we incorporated the Mississippi Institute of Forest Inventory (MIFI) into the Mississippi Forestry Commission. MIFI's mission is to collect forest inventory information (plot data) and collaborate with Mississippi State University College of Forest Resources and the Mississippi Automated Resource System (MARIS) to develop accurate and current forest inventory data at the county level. This resource information is critical for policy development. Also accurate forest resource data is essential for existing wood using facilities to make Capital re-investment decisions. Another important role MIFI plays is supporting MDA by providing inventory information for emerging wood using markets such a KIOR.

The Director of MIFI retired effective June 30, 2012. MFC's strategy will be to realign the Forest Management duties associated with this position and contract with someone to handle just the MIFI duties at an estimated cost of \$50,000.00 for a reduction of \$68,617.84.

The Mississippi Forestry Commission has been mandated since 1926 to protect the state's forestlands from wildfires. The Commission is also charged with management of the forests of the state both on private and public lands in a sustainable manner and to provide expertise, information and support to keep to Mississippi's 19.8 million acres of forestlands healthy, productive, and profitable. The responsibilities and accomplishments in these areas are detailed within our Program Narrative sections of this budget.

For the past six years, the Mississippi Institute of Forest Inventory (MIFI) has been incorporated within the Mississippi Forestry Commission. The funding for this forest inventory program was provided from a transfer of funds from the Commission to MIFI. Each year, a position was created through the escalation process in order to staff this program. With the retirement of the Executive Director, the Commission has requested that MIFI become a program within the agency instead of being handled as a separate entity. We have shown the FY12 costs in the major object category in which the MIFI expense occurred instead of as a single line item transfer. Beginning in FY13, the Commission's strategy is to realign the duties of this former position (the PIN will be retained by the agency) and contract with someone to handle only the duties associated with MIFI. This strategy will result in a cost savings for the agency and the State. We are proud to add MIFI as one of the Commission's program areas and have its outcomes and efficiencies reported during the budget process.

The majority of the funding for the Commission is provided from the State General Fund. Additional funding is generated at the state level from severance and acreage taxes. The federal government reimburses the Commission for approximately 12% of its total budget. The remaining funding is received from fees charged for services provided to landowners since the General Funds do not fully fund agency operations.

Due to the state's economic condition, the Commission's General Fund appropriation has declined steadily over the past several years. The FY13 General Fund appropriation is 17.22% less than it was in 2008. The reduction in General Funds between FY12 and FY13 was 3%.

The Commission was able to continue to provide a consistent level of services during this five year time span due solely to program efficiencies and funding received from disasters such as tornados as there were federal funds to compensate for reforestation efforts. The Commission also received ARRA funding for hazardous fuel reduction, control of invasive species and southern pine beetle projects. The ARRA grants have been completed and will no longer be available to augment the loss of General Funds. The Commission also cannot continue to rely on receiving operational funding from disasters. Disaster funding should not be used for ongoing agency expenses as the mandated programs of the agency continue even in times of disasters.

The services provided for forest management and protection have continued to be provided to the landowners of the state due to cost saving measures employed. These services have continued even with a loss of over 30% of the authorized positions. In 2008 the Commission had a total of 672 positions; currently the Commission has 461 positions. Unlike other agencies, the agency did not replace the lost positions by employing contract workers or re-hiring retirees. The Commission instituted cost saving measures and technology to assist in continuing to provide a high level of services. Technology has been used to track and serve state lands thereby reducing time consuming tasks previously employed manually. It has also been used for informational and educational tasks previously performed on an individual basis. Other cost savings have occurred by repairing and servicing older pieces of equipment in lieu of replacing them according to life cycle schedules. Some vehicles are now 15 years old with over 200,000 miles. The repairs are now becoming cost prohibitive. We have also reduced the need for replacement of our computer equipment by using virtual computerization. Our computer budget will be reduced over 80% from FY12 to FY14 due to this innovation.

The Commission cannot continue to provide the level of services the public now expects without being fully funded as there are increasingly fewer opportunities for reductions. Although the Commission is not seeking to be restored to its 2008 levels of funding, we are seeking an increase in our General Fund appropriation. The increase will

replace the loss of ARRA funding and the reliance on federal disaster funds and allow us to fully fund our already reduced budget.

The FY13 appropriation does not reflect a true operational cost for the agency. The Commission will have to escalate the FY13 appropriated amount by over \$3,000,000 as funding is received. The five-year average of expenses has been \$30,596,140. Our FY14 request is just below this average. We are seeking funding closer to the average than to the appropriation so our comparisons are based on actual FY12 expenditures and not the FY13 appropriated levels.

The justification of our budget is provided by major object category below.

SALARIES

The Commission recently reviewed its employee retention and determined that in FY12 we had an average turnover rate of 17% -- higher than any other agency within the state. Exit interviews have shown that this high turnover rate is larger attributably to our low relative wage rates for most of our positions when compared to the private sector. This is especially the case in our South East District. The entry level for a Forest Ranger is \$18,843. It is difficult to retain employees when the salaries are lower than that paid to the lowest level of an administrative assistant which has a starting salary of \$19,572.

The retention analysis also included the cost for replacing employees.

Based on a recent Bureau of Labor Statistics report, the administrative tasks associated with recruitment, interviewing, hiring and new employee orientation is approximately \$3,000 per position. Training for a new Forest Ranger (with a starting salary of \$18,843) costs approximately \$17,000 and training for a Forest Technician (with a starting salary of \$26,122) is approximately \$38,000. When considering the loss of productivity associated with retraining, this cost is sufficiently higher. It is much more cost effective to retain current employees and pay them for their knowledge than to lose them and have to recruit and train new employees. In order to retain our experienced staff, we are seeking additional salary authority to adequately compensate our staff.

We are requesting \$212,811 to reallocate 26 positions to Forester IVs. The majority of the agency positions are authorized for reclassifications; this is not the case with the Forester III positions. The only method for these employees to advance is to have a position become vacant. This action will allow us to compensate the individuals for the added responsibilities they have undertaken due to reduction of 30% of the agency's workforce over the past several years.

The agency has not received the funding to award the automatic reclassification of employees based upon attainment of experience and training according the guidelines and procedures of the State Personnel Board (SPB) for several years. We are requesting full funding to award the reclassification of all authorized positions. The cost for the reclassification is on an average of only \$3,606 per employee. This is approximately the administrative cost for employee replacement. We are seeking to retain these employees in place of spending funds for their replacement. The reclassification request for 328 positions is \$1,182,757.

Although the Commission has lost over 30% of its positions over the past several years, we are only seeking one additional position for FY14. We are asking to add an accountant position based on the workload analysis conducted which showed an increased workload on the administrative support area of the central office. The salary and fringe for this position is \$46,215.

A copy of the SPB Budget Request is included at the conclusion of the Budget Narrative.

The Commission expended \$103,313 for travel in FY12. We are requesting less than a \$4,000 increase in this category to accommodate rising costs. Our total travel request is \$107,000.

CONTRACTUAL

The FY12 contractual expense was higher than our FY14 request. The majority of our \$541,714 reduction is due to the completion of Cogongrass spraying project, which is part of an invasive species eradiation project, was performed by third party vendors. The contractual reduction provides almost half of the funding requested for the salary increases.

COMMODITIES

Sixty seven percent (67%) of the agency's commodity budget occurs in for fuel consumption and repairs to vehicles. These costs will continue to rise due to the age of the agency's equipment and trends for fuel increases. Another large portion of the agency's commodity budget is utilized for purchase of poisons, fertilizers and other items necessary for forest management. Additional commodity expense occurs for publication of educational materials and other informational and outreach programs of the agency. Very little of the expense in this area is utilized for office staff and office operations. We are seeking \$2,860,525 in order to be fully funded for these important areas of Commission operations.

CAPITAL OUTLAY - OTHER THAN EOUIPMENT

The Commission owes much property and did not spend any funds for its improvement in FY12. We are seeking \$25,000 for emergency repairs that may be needed in FY14.

CAPITAL EQUIPMENT

The Commission will reduce its expenses in FY14 by almost 100% of what it expended in FY12. This is due in part to the change in technology with utilization of virtual hardware. The majority of the expense in equipment is for the purchase of radios and other equipment through a master lease that was entered into last year. The annual lease payments are in excess of \$300,000 for the next several years.

VEHICLES

The Commission will be required to replace to two Dozier units utilized for fire fighting. These purchases will be for the replacement of units that are beyond their useful life. The \$500,000 cost for this purchase will be funded from approximately a third of the revenue generated from acreage taxes collected in FY13.

Although the Commission is an emergency responder for the state, the funding authorization for vehicle purchases was reduced from the agency's FY13 budget. Replacement of 12, based on the agency established vehicle replacement schedule, is included in our FY14 request. The replacement of these vehicles will be paramount due to prior year reduced budget.

WIRELESS COMMUNICATION DEVICES

Expenditures for wireless devices were in excess of \$7,000 in FY12. We are seeking a reduction in this line item from the FY12 level and are requesting only \$6,000 in this category for FY14 to replace approximately 25 units that will be at the end of their life cycle.

The majority of expenses in the Subsidies category are for the Forest Resource Development Program (FRDP) which provides cost sharing assistance to eligible forest landowners for establishing and or improving their timberland. The federal government provides a stewardship grant to the state to partially fund this program. The agency is requesting \$1,750,000 in budget authority for this program.

In addition, we are seeking budgetary authority for \$737,475 grants to be awarded to Urban and Community Forestry Program, the Forestry Stewardship Program other similar programs which provide assistance to governmental entities and private landowners in forest management and protection activities.

The agency's total Subsidies request is less than the FY12 expenditures.

TOTAL

The FY14 request is only \$627,178 higher than its FY12 expenditures. This is almost exactly the amount of the agency's \$600,000 General Fund reduction between FY12 and FY13. The FY14 request provides a realistic picture of the funding needs of the agency. We are seeking full support of this request.

This new position is required for Continuation of Existing Programs due to re-evaluation of manpower and workflow.

The Accountant/Auditor III request is the result of a workload analysis that indicated the need for another accountant level position to ensure that the financial services division work is distributed evenly and no conflict arises in approval of services/payments. The Accountant/Auditor III position will be responsible for accounting functions as it relates to generally accepted accounting practices as well as cash receipts, and entry into SAAS and MERLIN. Our goal is for this financial position to provide an equitable division of work within the financial services division.

II. Funding for Existing Vacant Positions (0)

Each of our District Offices is assigned two Forester III's, a total of 14, that perform duties at a level that can best be described as that of an Assistant District Forester. These positions have district wide responsibilities for Forest Management & Inventory, Fire Services & Information, Public Outreach (at a local level), and Safety & Training (at the local level). These positions assist the Deputy State Forester (District Forester) in the operations of the district programs and personnel. These positions also represent their supervisory administrator in his absence, at meetings, workshops, training sessions, as well as acts as liaison between the field personnel and the district level staff. They also have extensive contact with the individual and industry landowners.

There are 11 other Forester III positions that have program responsibilities on a statewide level and detailed with administration of the Safety & Training Program (2), Public Outreach Program (2), Urban Forestry Program (1), Minority Outreach for Underserved Landowners Program (1), the Firewise Program (1), a fire prevention program designed to educate communities and homeowners on how to make their cities/towns, homes, and property safer from wildland fire, Wildland Arson Investigation (1), and the Forest Inventory and Spatial Technology Team (3). All of these individuals administer statewide programs whose duties and responsibilities require them to travel across the state on a daily basis conducting training, program audits, meeting with the public, television reporters, district administrators, employees, as well as personnel from the federal government and other state agencies just to mention a few.

We feel that due to the level of administrative and program responsibility all 25 of these positions should be classified as Forester IV's. This would certainly provide our field level foresters a career path that will increase their knowledge base and expertise.

The request for the Division Director II to Forester IV will bring this position up to the same level as the position in the southern part of the state performing the same duties. This agency feels it is to our advantage to split the state with these programs due to an evaluation of work being performed.
