The Office of Land and Water Resources (OLWR) is responsible for the management of the water resources in Mississippi by collecting and compiling data related to water wells, streams and lakes in the state. This information is entered into a statewide water resources database for easy access. The office also collects and analyzes basic water resources information and compiles water use and water level data that can be used in developing computer models and making water management decisions. Other duties include the review and processing of applications for issuance and modification of surface and groundwater use permits and the monitoring of surface and groundwater conditions in the state to forecast potential problems and to enforce applicable rules and regulations. The OLWR staff is responsible for licensing and regulating the water well contractors operating in Mississippi. In addition, the office regulates the design, construction and modification of certain dams in accordance with regulatory criteria to ensure that lives and property downstream from dams and reservoirs are protected.

## II. Program Objective:

The objective of the Office of Land and Water Resources (OLWR) is to inventory and assess the availability of water associated with the fresh water aquifers in Mississippi and the major fresh water streams. Another objective is to assure the safety of the high hazard dams located in the state. The OLWR staff intends to ensure that 98% of the relevant volume of water pumped in Mississippi complies with applicable permit regulations, and that 95% of all high hazard dams on inventory as of July 1, 2002 are either in compliance with appropriate design criteria or have had any deficiencies of note identified.

#### I. Program Description:

The Office of Geology, as the state geological survey, is responsible for research into the geology, mineral resources, and geologic hazards of Mississippi and for publishing this information; for managing the development of a digital land base computer model of the state; for managing the Mississippi Flood Map Modernization program; and for regulation of mining and reclamation in the state.

The Office of Geology serves a principal research mission of the Department of Environmental Quality, conducting statewide investigations of surface and subsurface geologic features, which are the basis of the environment. The Office of Geology is the primary source of information and repository of data on the geology and mineral resources of the State of Mississippi. It serves as the state's voice and advisor on issues relating to basic and applied geology, economic mineral resources, and geologic hazards. Mineral resources of interest include oil, natural gas, building stone, clay, sand and gravel, coal and lignite, limestone, chalk, bentonite, water, and all other mineral substances of value. The Office of Geology prepares reports with illustrations and maps describing the geological and natural resources of the state. These reports are provided in sufficient number for distribution to the educational institutions of the state, the state library, and as demand may otherwise justify. Credible technical information about our state's resources is a vital component of economic development.

In addition to its research function, the Office of Geology regulates the mining and reclamation of all surface mines in the state. Staff are responsible also for coordination of remote sensing and geographic information systems in the state and development of the Mississippi Digital Earth Model (MDEM).

#### II. Program Objective:

The objective of the Office of Geology is to serve Mississippi's public, environmental community, industry, and academia with information on the geology and mineral resources of the state; to regulate surface mining and reclamation in the state; and to coordinate geographic information systems (GIS) activities in the state and develop MDEM. This is accomplished through geologic research, data compilation, and information dissemination by way of publications, online databases, and the map sales operation; through geospatial resources activities; and by permitting the surface mining and reclamation operations in the state. The administration of the Office provides support to the subprograms, edits and

publishes all Office publications, and responds to inquiries by callers and visitors pertaining to general geology, economic mineral resources, and miscellaneous requests outside the purview of other divisions. The Publication Sales Office handles annual sales of hundreds of Office of Geology publications and thousands of topographic maps.

The Geospatial Resources Division focuses on remote sensing (RS) and geographic information systems (GIS) activities. The division manages the Mississippi Flood Map Modernization Initiative (MFMMI), which is creating new county-wide digital flood insurance rate maps (DFIRMs) for 80 of Mississippi's 82 counties, pending continued funding by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). The division acts as staff for the Mississippi Coordinating Council for Remote Sensing and Geographic Information Systems. The Council exists to set and assure enforcement of policies and standards that will promote the sharing of information, as well as facilitate cost-sharing. The Council is charged with oversight of development of the Mississippi Digital Earth Model (MDEM). The Office of Geology is responsible for MDEM's data development / data collection, and it is the Geospatial Resources Division that handles the assignment. MDEM consists of seven layers of digital information: (1) geodetic control, (2) elevation and bathymetry, (3) orthoimagery, (4) hydrography, (5) transportation, (6) government boundaries, and (7) cadastral. The division is responsible for the development / collection of 1-foot and 6-inch orthophotography, as well as mapping / GIS data development from that orthophotography for MDEQ's Mississippi Gulf Regional Mapping Project covering five of the six coastal area counties. The developed data will meet MDEM requirements for accuracy. The division maintains three Web sites and is planning to add others. One site has oil and gas related information: library.geology.deq.state.ms.us. Another contains coastal data collected as a result of previous years of research: geology.deq.state.ms.us/coastal. The flood mapping program is at: geology.deq.ms.gov/floodmaps. Additional Web sites are under development for posting geological data.

The Environmental Geology Division maintains one rotary drilling rig capable of gathering information for geologic investigations, conducts special field studies, and maintains a geophysical logging program. The geophysical logging program conducts field studies on an average of 170 days per year and receives and responds to more than 200 requests for information during an average year. The division emphasizes applied geology and research into geologic hazards. The drilling and logging programs support the work of other programs of the Office and the Department.

The Surface Geology Division conducts field mapping and paleontological studies and compiles geologic maps and reports. This division locates and maps economic mineral deposits, maps surface geologic units, responds to public

requests for information about the geology of Mississippi, and publishes reports for public dissemination.

The Mining and Reclamation Division administers a regulatory program to enforce the Mississippi Surface Mining and Reclamation Act. It is responsible for reviewing approximately 200 new applications for surface mining permits and exempt operations yearly. There are over 2,000 active mines, permitted and exempt, which must be regulated. Inspections, investigations and performance bond release petitions are the responsibility of the division.

The objective of the Coal Mining Division is to review all applications for a lignite mining permit and make recommendations to the Permit Board on approval or denial, and to make timely and correct inspections of all permitted lignite mines. This enforces the Mississippi Surface Coal Mining and Reclamation Act

#### I. Program Description:

The Office of Administrative Services was created by statute under section 49-2-17 which states that the Executive Director of the Department of Environmental Quality shall appoint an assistant for administration and shall centralize under his office the following functions for the Department: (a) Accounting; (b) Payroll; (c) Purchasing; (d) Data Processing; (e) Motor Pool and Vehicles; (f) Maintenance; (g) Printing and records; and (h) Public Relations. The Executive Director, the human resource staff, and the legal staff are included under this program budget.

All of these functions are currently being carried out by the Office of Administrative Services for the entire Department.

The Office of Administrative Services can be simply described as the consolidation of all Departmental overhead administrative functions under a single office in order to avoid costly duplication of personnel, equipment and related expenses that would occur were the functions carried out by each Office within the Department. The centralization of these functions helps to provide coherent, equitable and consistent application of resources and policies within the Department.

#### Legal

This function provides staff legal support services to the Department, Commission on Environmental Quality and the Permit Board.

#### Office of the Executive Director

This function is the support for the chief executive officer for the Department. This function consists of the Executive Director, the Commission on Environmental Quality, the department's Deputy Administrator, 2 Staff Officer III's, and one Special Projects Officer IV.

#### **Information Center**

The Information Center manages the Web Page and all public information and media relations functions for the department.

#### **Business Services**

This function provides fiscal reporting, accounts payable, fees accounting, and payroll administration services.

#### Budget

This function provides budgeting and grants accounting for the Department.

#### Human Resources

This function provides personnel, training and employee benefits services to the Department's employees.

#### **Information Services**

This function is responsible for the overall planning and management of information system development, technology software migration, software selection, system integration and agency-wide information technology vision of the department's Enterprise Infrastructure. These infrastructure include information systems (developed in-house and third party software), data network (WAN and LAN), and operating systems (desktop, servers and network).

#### **Facilities Support**

This function provides support to the Department for property inventory, building maintenance, mail, switchboard, motor pool functions and security.

#### **Environmental Resource Center**

The Environmental Resource Center coordinates regulatory assistance and technical assistance outreach activities for the department. In addition, this unit receives and triages complaints from the public about environmental issues, guiding complainants to the technical regulatory staff in the agency who can respond to the complaints.

#### II. Program Objective:

The objective of the Office of Administrative Services is to provide the staff of the Department with the functions described in Section I. in the most efficient and effective manner possible, consistent with compliance with all applicable federal and state laws and regulations.

- Reduce flexibility to support TMDL development and restoration projects.
- Limit the ability to make vehicle repairs. Loss of a vehicle would limit staff efficiency and increase response time for inspections and complaints.
- Affect staff's ability to travel for training opportunities which are critical to maintaining quality work products.
- Result in delays in responding to requests from the public.
- Reduce ability to conduct as many inspections or compliance assurance reviews and, therefore, be at risk of not fulfilling EPA commitments.
- Limit the amount of water quality monitoring performed and limit the amount of non-typical sample analyses provided in hazardous waste investigations.
- Restrict the ability to perform active equipment maintenance and keep lab equipment in top operating condition. This could increase the amount of lost sample analyses and down-time from analyzing samples.
- Result in the termination of some contract workers which would reduce the ability to respond promptly to stormwater and other citizen complaints. Also, increase the workload on other staff inhibiting the ability to meet ambient air and water monitoring program goals.
- Damage Co-Op program and future recruiting of qualified engineers.
- Hinder the timely review and approval of plans and specifications for new developments.

A 3% General Fund Reduction in the Office of Land & Water Resources would be taken in the category of Contractual Services. The areas affected by a 3% reduction would include the following:

- 1. Reduce vehicle repair/maintenance
- 2. Reduce training costs which would affect all employees, but mainly the Dam Safety Division
- 3. Reduce our contract with the U. S. Geological Survey. We would reduce the stream gauge monitoring portion of the contract. This information is critical to stream low flow conditions and emables the Office of Land & Water Resources to monitor conditions and take corrective action as needed, especially during drought conditions.
- 4. Reduce the number of water wells sampled as a part of the ambient groundwater monitoring program.

The reduction in funding would adversely impact the groundwater monitoring program, making it more difficulf for the Office of Land & Water Resources to assist homeowners in determining safe drinking water supplies. Not only would this reduction hinder the number of water wells we could sample, but it, also, would limit the types of analytical tests we could perforn on collected samples.
