DPS-Crime Laboratory Name of Agency

FEDERAL FUNDS

The MCL receives federal grant funding specifically for the administartion of the DNA program as well as Crime Laboratory enhancement.

STATE SUPPORT SPECIAL FUNDS

The Mississippi Crime Lab applied for and received ARRA grant monies to enhance law enforcement services and prevent job loss of contractual employees and create additional DNA positions.

OTHER SPECIAL FUNDS

Fund 3713 is supported by fees assigned to agencies for forensic analysis. The MCL charges a \$50 fee for each case received by the lab. The MCL is also authorized to receive a \$300 assessment to a felon who has plead guilty or been found guilty.

Fund 371N received an assessment of \$100 for individual that enters into the Department of Corrections for the collection, processing and analysis of a DNA sample to be uploaded in the DNA database. This fund helps defer the cost of DNA analysis.

Fund 371E is a \$25 assessment collected on each DUI conviction and is used to support the blood and breath implied consent DUI program in the state.

1 - FORENSIC ANALYSIS PROGRAM NAME

I. Program Description:

Forensic Analysis is the primary service provided by the Mississippi Crime Lab (MCL). This program consists of eight (8) highly technical and specialized areas of expertise: Trace /Microanalysis, Impression Evidence, Firearms and Tool-Marks, Toxicology, Identification of Controlled Substances, Human Impairment and DUI Testing, Physical Evidence Analysis, Fire Debris Analysis, and Questioned Documents. The scientists in these areas of expertise employ the latest methodology using state-of-the-art technology to develop information from items of evidence from criminal activity; prepare official reports of those scientific findings; and provide testimony as an expert witness as required. MCL also provides training for law enforcement personnel in proper evidence collection techniques. The quality of the scientific analyses performed in this program is evaluated and accredited by the American Society of Crime Lab Directors - Laboratory Accreditation Board.

II. Program Objective:

The objective of this program is to provide accurate, timely scientific analysis to our clients. The results of those analyses provide the foundation for the criminal justice system to identify, apprehend, and adjuducate individuals responsible for criminal activity.

III. Current program activities as supported by the funding in Columns 6-15 (FY 13 Estimated & FY 14 Increase/Decrease for continuations) of MBR-1-03 and designated Budget Unit Decisions columns of MBR-1-03-A:

(D) Continuation:

The (MCL) Mississippi Crime Laboratory has requested a significant increase in funding for FY 14 due to a number of factors. In early 2014 the MCL anticipates moving from its current 1976 facility to the new 90,000 square foot facility in Rankin County. Significant costs associated with moving scientific equipment, reinstallation, and validation are included. Also the MCL is budgeting for other necessary items not included in the BOB building project funds such as grounds equipment, increase in utilities and contractual services for maintenance, computer and server additions, and scientific equipment. These items are critical in order to be able to move and continue to function.

2 - DNA ANALYSIS PROGRAM NAME

I. Program Description:

This program was mandated in 1994 by MCA 45-33-15. This statute established a forensic DNA testing laboratory which adheres to the federal guidelines established through the Quality Assurance Standards for forensic DNA testing issued by the Federal Bureau of Investigation. This same statute identified the MCL as responsible for the establishment of the sex offender database. This database was expanded by statute in 2003 to include forensic profiles of all known felons. By the end of FY 12 the MCL has uploaded over 70,000 convicted felon profiles. The MCL maintains this database under strict standards and requirements also having access to the national DNA database. This has resulted in solving numerous crimes where the suspect had yet to be identified. This system and the MCL DNA section has dramatically increased the crime-solving capabilites for law enforcement in the state.

II. Program Objective:

The objective of this program is to utilize a higher degree of scientific descrimination when identifying and individualizing biological stains. This testing allows evidence recovered from crime scenes to be linked to individuals rather than using less descriminating techniques.

III. Current program activities as supported by the funding in Columns 6-15 (FY 13 Estimated & FY 14 Increase/Decrease for continuations) of MBR-1-03 and designated Budget Unit Decisions columns of MBR-1-03-A:

(D) Continuation:

Federal funding that has supported the states DNA Convicted Offender Database (CODIS) is expected to end this fiscal year. Funding has decreased from \$1.1M, two years ago, to \$600,000 this past fiscal year to only \$300,000 for FY 13. This is a million dollar a year program that interacts with the National DNA database and the 49 other states. The MCL is federally and by state statute responsible for this program. Additional funding is requested to insure continued operation of this program which is essential. The MCL database has already had 100's of DNA hits solving crimes in not only our state, but numerous other states. Further additional funding is requested for the upgrade of DNA technology and instrumentation that will be required for DNA casework. Federal standards which are mandatory will be in place and are planned to be converted by the time the MCL takes possession of the new facility.

NARRATIVE 2014 BUDGET REQUEST

DPS-Crime Laboratory

Name of Agency

The (MCL) Mississippi Crime Laboratory has requested a significant increase in funding for FY 14 due to a number of factors. In early 2014 the MCL anticipates moving from its current 1976 facility to the new 90,000 square foot facility in Rankin County. Significant costs associated with moving scientific equipment, reinstallation, and validation are included. Also the MCL is budgeting for other necessary items not included in the BOB building project funds such as grounds equipment, increase in utilities and contractual services for maintenance, computer and server additions, and scientific equipment. These items are critical in order to be able to move and continue to function.

In addition, federal funding that has supported the states DNA Convicted Offender Database (CODIS) is expected to end this fiscal year. Funding has decreased from \$1.1M, two years ago, to \$600,000 this past fiscal year to only \$300,000 for FY 13. This is a million dollar a year program that interacts with the National DNA database and the 49 other states. The MCL is federally and by state statute responsible for this program. Additional funding is requested to insure continued operation of this program which is essential. The MCL database has already had 100's of DNA hits solving crimes in not only our state, but numerous other states. Further additional funding is requested for the upgrade of DNA technology and instrumentation that will be required for DNA casework. Federal standards which are mandatory will be in place and are planned to be converted by the time the MCL takes possession of the new facility.

The Mississippi Crime Laboratory (MCL) received level funding this past fiscal by utilizing \$870,000 from the budget contingency fund. The budget did not account for the increased cost of moving from trailers on the Gulf Coast to the new MCL facility in District Eight. The MCL had to make cuts in numerous areas to account for the increase in utilities and operating costs. In addition the MCL has seen a significant increase in the overall commodity cost of scientific supplies and contractual services. Service contracts alone for scientific instruments and computers are already in excess of \$400,000 annually.
