Consumer Protection Division - To administer the terms and conditions of the Weights and Measures Law and Regulations; Food Sanitation Law; Egg Marketing Law and Regulation; Section 79-22-35 of the Mississippi Aquaculture Act of 1988 (Tilapia Labeling Law); Honey and Honey Products Law; Syrup Containers Law and Catfish Law of 2002; promulgated and adopted for the enforcement of such laws for which the division of the Bureau of Regulatory Services is responsible. In addition, the division has a contractual agreement with USDA - Food Safety Inspection Service, in conjunction with the MDAC Meat Inspection Division, to perform USDA meat compliance inspections and a USDA-AMS Cooperative Agreement to perform country of origin labeling inspections in designated retail food establishments.

Inspection and Licensure - This program includes all our regulatory functions. These regulatory activities are: Fruit and Vegetable Inspection; Weights and Measures Inspection and Testing; Grain Warehouse Licensing; Petroleum Testing and Calibration; Consumer Protection and Meat Inspection, Catfish Processors Registration, Egg Marketing Board

Petroleum Testing - The purpose of this program is to administer and enforce the laws in the Petroleum Products Inspection Law of Mississippi, sections 75-551-1 thru 75-55-41, thereby insuring quality products to the consuming public.

Fruits and Vegetables Inspection has a cooperative agreement with USDA to conduct fresh fruit and vegetable inspections and to conduct Good Agricultural Practices and Good Handling Practices food safety audits.

Organic Certification - This division oversees the certifying of fruits, vegetables, and herb growers in Mississippi that want to be certified "organic".

### II. Program Objective:

Meat Inspection Division - The Meat Inspection Division provides regulatory coverage and inspection of all establishments engaged in the slaughter of food animals and poultry, and the further processing of meat, meat-food products, poultry and preparation into items for wholesale intrastate commerce. The Meat Inspection Division has also entered into a Federal State Cooperative Inspection program which allows state inspectors to conduct inspections in Federal Plants engaged in interstate commerce. Under the program we also provide surveillance throughout formulation, packaging, labeling, and distribution to retail outlets. Custom operations are exempt from continuous inplant inspection, however, each receives periodic inspection and reviews for sanitation, adequate facilities and acceptable procedures in the production of unadulterated products. Meat by-product disposal plants and the vehicles used to transport slaughter house offal and waste over the highways of this state are licensed and under the surveillance of the Meat Inspection Division.

Consumer Protection Division - To assure that the consumer receives a quality, wholesome, safe product and gets the quantity paid for on those products that are subject to the terms and conditions of the above laws and regulations.

Weights & Measures - To maintain equity in the market place for the consumer by enforcing the above laws, rules and regulations.

Inspection and Licensure - The basic objective is to regulate a wide range of activities through licensing, inspecting, weighing and other monitoring of transactions in agriculture and general commerce.
