PROGRAM NAME

I. Program Description:

The Public Employees' Retirement System (System) is responsible for the administration of four defined benefit and one defined contribution public employee retirement plans, as well as a deferred compensation plan:

Public Employees' Retirement System (PERS)

Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol Retirement System (MHSPRS)

Municipal Retirement System (MRS is comprised of 19 separate retirement systems)

Supplemental Legislative Retirement Plan (SLRP)

Optional Retirement Plan (ORP)

Government Employees' Deferred Compensation Plan (MDCP&T)

II. Program Objective:

The purpose of the Public Employees' Retirement System (System), which was established by legislation in 1952, is to provide retirement benefits for all state employees and other public employees whose employers have elected to participate. All services provided by the staff are performed in order to meet that objective.

- III. Current program activities as supported by the funding in Columns 6-15 (FY 14 Estimated & FY 15 Increase/Decrease for continuations) of MBR-1-03 and designated Budget Unit Decisions columns of MBR-1-03-A:
- (C) Non-Recurring Expenses:

Capital Outlay - The amount of \$167,000 will be expended prior to the end of FY 2014.

(D) Administration:

Salaries, Wages and Fringe Benefits - Continuation funding consists of the SPB salary projection of \$9,166,911, \$28,619 for MIS special compensation, \$51,830 for reallocations, \$94,541 for reclassification of positions, and \$42,000 for the PERS Board of Trustees' payroll. PERS is also requesting \$42,410 for educational benchmark salary increases.

Travel - PERS is seeking \$85,000 in funding for agency travel to be used by staff and members of the Board of Trustees.

Contractual Services - PERS requests \$4,300,000 to maintain existing contracts, fees and software maintenance, as well as implement new GASB reporting requirements and provide for software maintenance contracts under the new pension technology system.

Commodities - PERS requests total funding of \$325,000. This request is equal to our 2014 appropriation and is the minimum amount needed to fund major initiatives in printed communications. Our request also encompasses normal growth in operating expenses associated with office and equipment supplies.

Capital Outlay - Our total continuation request in this category is \$178,600 which includes equipment funding for an HP disk to disk backup system, MICR reader verifier check qualifier, a Palo Alto Network PA-2050 Appliance for network protection, and authorization for replacement of PDAs for Field Representatives. Continuation funding also includes memory upgrades and expanded disk space.

IV. Additional program activities that will result from increased funding requested in Columns 16-25 (MBR-1-03) and specified Budget Decision Unit Columns (MBR-1-03-A):

(E) Investments & PensionIT:

Salaries, Wages and Fringe Benefits - Funding of \$401,121 is requested for six new positions. (Please note that funding for three positions was included in the FY 2013 budget appropriation; however the positions could not be filled due to the accompanying PINs were not authorized. These three positions were resubmitted, along with three additional positions in the 2014 budget request. All six positions are being resubmitted in the 2015 budget request.) Two of the positions are necessary due to the expanding nature and complexity of investment portfolios. The remaining four positions are required to support the new pension administration system.

Capital Outlay - PERS requests \$7,500 to purchase new PCs for six new positions.

The total 2015 budget request of \$14,726,532 for Public Employees' Retirement System is an addition of \$1,032,830 or 7.5 percent above approved funding for fiscal year 2014. PERS continues its commitment to align our staff, business processes, and technology to implement and oversee quality pension benefit services for our participants, all at the most economical cost.

Salaries, Wages & Fringe Benefits-

We are submitting a total budget request for salary expenditures of \$9,830,432 an increase of \$368,330 over approved funding for 2014.

Reallocations - PERS is requesting \$51,830 for positions in which it has been determined that a substantial difference exits between actual job performance, experience, and educational requirements versus the job title currently utilized by the agency. There are four positions in the MIS department where job requirements have significantly exceeded the current job titles due to the shifting focus and change in skill sets necessary for the technology project. One Investment Accountant position has also substantially exceeded the current job title requirements due to supplementary training, achievement of proficiency, and experience in a new group of complex investment securities.

Reclassifications - Our request includes \$94,541 for reclassification of positions under authority granted by the State Personnel Board to establish a career ladder to promote successful job performance, job training, and tenure in positions. Incumbents in these job classifications are required to successfully complete prescribed training, perform successfully in the PERS job series, and meet the requirements defined in the PERS Career Ladders Guidelines for Auto-Reclassification/Promotion. There are 25 positions within the Retirement Services Division where incumbents have qualified, or will qualify, for salary increases by 2015 under the intensive career ladder requirements. Career ladders offer PERS employees a long-term career plan and have shown proven success in producing higher performing, better-trained, and knowledgeable employees.

New Positions - PERS requests \$404,121 to fund six new agency positions.

- ~ A PERS Deputy Chief Investment Officer is needed to provide additional management and oversight of PERS increasingly diverse and complex investment portfolios.
- ~ A Programmer Analyst II is required in the MIS Department to operate, maintain, and support the new PERS pension system.
- A Senior Systems Administrator is needed in the MIS Department to operate, maintain, and support higher level functions in the new PERS pension system. The technology vendor recommended an MIS staff increase of 80 percent to support the new system, validated by ITS and our technology consultant. However, PERS has determined that through careful planning, restructuring and cross-training, we can substantially lower the overall 2015 budget requirements through a request for only an eight percent staff increase. Approval of this eight percent increase, or two positions, represents the least possible staffing to maintain high quality production in the MIS Department.
- ~ A PERS Investment Accountant is necessary to accommodate the increasing number and complexity of international and global investment managers and transactions. The number of countries in which PERS invests has more than doubled since fiscal year 2008, to a current total of 91 countries, with no corresponding increase in PERS staff. Approval for this position is essential to continue accurate, complete, and timely accounting for PERS investments.
- ~ An Accountant/Auditor, Professional is required for new functional duties, as well as to accommodate a significant increase in reconciliation processes available through the new pension system.
- ~ A Project Officer IV is requested to manage the changing content and layout of the PERS website.

MIS Special Compensation in the amount of \$28,619 is requested to attract, retain, and develop competent information technology professionals to support the unique and changing information technology business needs of PERS.

Educational Benchmark funding of \$42,410 is requested for those PERS staff members who have completed, or will

complete by 2015, eligible educational achievements.

Board of Trustees Payroll - Funding of \$42,000 is requested for the ten-member Board of Trustees' payroll, currently paid from Salaries (Base) but not included in the SPB's projection of salary costs.

Travel-

PERS is requesting an increase to a total of \$85,000 in this category. This increase is necessary to maintain adequate professional development for staff and board members, as well as provide for educational services to agencies, members, and retirees.

Contractual Services-

PERS requests \$4,300,000 in funding for fiscal year 2015, an increase of \$641,000 or 17.5 percent over approved funding for 2014. This request represents the lowest amount necessary to fund major initiatives in printed communications including annual membership statements, retiree/member newsletters, and member handbooks. Additional funding is requested to implement GASB Statement Nos. 67 and 68, applicable to pension plans and employers participating in pension plans. Much of the required information for employer financial reporting resides at the plan level and must be supplied by the PERS consulting actuary and audited by our independent auditing firm. Our request also includes increases that apply to software maintenance contracts under the new pension technology system.

Included in the 2013 expenditures are building repair services totaling \$125,464 that are funded by escalation authority within the PERS Building Repair and Maintenance Fund (3533).

Commodities-

PERS requests that funding for the 2015 budget remain the same as the fiscal year 2014 approved budget amount. Our request in this category represents the lowest amount necessary to continue funding major initiatives in printed communications including annual membership statements, retiree/member newsletters, and member handbooks.

Capital Outlay-

PERS requests a total of \$186,100 to fund Capital Outlay expenditures in fiscal year 2015, an increase of \$18,500 from our 2014 appropriation. Equipment requests total \$185,500 and Wireless Communication Devices total \$600.

MICR Check Reader - \$15,000 is requested to purchase a reader/verifier check qualifier, including maintenance for two years.

HP Disk-to-Disk Backup System - \$125,000 is requested for a high-speed disk backup system which is a key component in the disaster recovery plan for our new line-of-business technology solution.

New PCs - \$7,500 is requested to fund the purchase of PCs for the six new positions requested in the 2015 budget proposal.

Memory Upgrade, Disk Space and Equipment - \$22,000 is requested to manage escalating processing and storage capacity requirements of the System and to secure equipment for emergencies and/or unplanned projects. The need for expanded disk space and memory is expected to continue as the number of retirees increases each year.

Palo Alto Network PA-2050 Appliance - \$16,000 is requested to purchase this unit which provides front line protection against malware threats and delivers web content filtering. This appliance would replace the IPRISM network device.

Wireless Communications Devices - \$600 is requested to provide for emergency replacement of PDAs for PERS Field

Included in 2013 is an equipment expenditure of \$1,350 for building repairs, which is funded by escalation authority within the PERS Building Repair and Maintenance Fund (3533). For the 2015 budget, PERS requests an increase in escalation authority of \$200,000, for a total of \$400,000. The additional funds are needed to purchase a backup generator to power the entire PERS building.
