NARRATIVE 2016 BUDGET REQUEST

Name of Agency

The past several years, the Commission on Judicial Performance has reiterated its lack of funding for basic operations and has continually requested additional funding sources as well as appropriation increases.

In 2006, the Commission began receiving criminal assessments pursuant to MCA Section 99-19-73 (6) in the sum of \$2.00 for other misdemeanors. Even though the Commission has oversight of all state court judges, from justice court to supreme court, it does not receive a share of the revenues derived from other criminal assessments in cases involving traffic violations, implied consent law violations, game and fish violations, speeding, reckless and careless driving violations, other felonies, railroad crossing violations and drug violations.

The other misdemeanor fines were to augment the Commission's General Fund appropriation. This source of revenue was not originally intended to replace General Funds but over the ensuing ten years, the General Funds have gradually been reduced.

The fact that the criminal assessments continued to decline has not been taken into effect. Since 2008, the revenue from the criminal assessments has declined each year. In FY08 the Commission's revenue from assessments and the General Fund totaled \$563,990; in FY14 the total revenue was only \$455,237. The Commission cannot meet its basic operational expenses with only this amount of revenue. If all positions are filled, salary and fringe cost alone total \$430,650.00. Currently the Commission has one vacancy which cannot be filled at present since the departing employee requested payout of the 240 hours accumulated leave. This was an FY14 expenditure which had to be held until FY15 due to a lack of cash.

The Commission will be required to seek a deficit appropriation just to meet its basic operational expenses for FY15. At the current projections, we anticipate that the deficit request will be \$19,700. Although the legislature has provided the authority for the Commission to escalate its spending they did not provide the funds necessary for this to occur. If the Commission used its escalation authority for FY15 to meet its current obligations, the deficit request would exceed \$100,000.

In addition to requiring a deficit for FY15, the Commission will have no cash balance in its Special Fund for FY16; we are therefore, seeking additional General Funds for the next year.

Since the Commission has continually had cash issues, it has been required to implement austere measures. These measures have included conducting investigations via telephone in lieu of face-to-face interviews, reducing monthly Commission meetings to bi-monthly; purchasing a used vehicle with an excess of 100,000 miles in order to reduce travel costs; and relocating offices to reduce fees paid for rent. Some of these cost cutting measures have significantly hampered the functions of the agency. The lack of investigations and Commission meetings further reduces revenue as fines are not imposed when hearings are not held.

The Commission has had no excesses in its budget for years and no additional cuts can be made as all current expenses are for fixed costs such as rent, utilities, services from other state agencies, and salaries. It should also be noted that some of these costs have risen in the past year and are projected to increase for FY16. One such example is the fees charged by the Department of Finance and Administration for accounting services. In FY14, the Commission's DFA fees were \$1,311 but DFA has projected that they will be \$4,123 for FY16; this is a 300% increase within a two year period.

We are requesting to be fully funded for FY16. In order for this to occur, our budget will require increases in every category.

SALARIES

The Commission employs five individuals, three of whom are attorneys. The staff attorneys are not compensated anywhere near the same levels as other attorneys working for governmental entities. The Senior Attorney with 18 years of experience is currently compensated \$76,000. An Assistant District Attorney coming to work with no experience currently makes \$88,678 and is slated to be increased to \$94,699 in January, 2015. We are not requesting anywhere near this level of compensation but we are requesting a \$4,500 increase for this senior level attorney. This will bring the compensation of the current employee to the \$81,000 level of the previous person who held this position.

The second attorney positon in our Office has a salary of \$68,000. We are requesting that this position be granted a salary increase of \$7,000. However, the budgetary effect will be closer to \$24,000 as this position is being held vacant for at least 3 months in FY15 in order to meet current operating expenses.

The Commission's long time Executive Assistant retired in FY14 and was replaced at a salary much lower than the retiring employee was making. This provided a \$14,000 savings; however, it does not afford the Commission to compensate the employee adequately. We are requesting this salary be increased by \$4,000, which still provides \$12,000 in savings from the previously salary paid. When the \$12,000 savings is applied to all positions, the net effect of the salary increases are only \$3,500.

The total Salary line item from FY15 to FY16 reflects a higher increase; however this is due to the fact that a terminating leave payout from FY14 was made in FY15 and the position was held open for almost 25% of the year.

TRAVEL

Over the last few years the Commission has significantly reduced travel costs. This has been due in a large measure to reducing the number of Commission meetings, thereby reducing the amount spent in this category. The Commission is requesting an increase in funding in the travel category in order to fully function as the Judicial Watchdog of the state with thorough investigations and monthly Commission meetings. Full funding will also allow the staff to attend seminars conducted by the Association of Judicial Disciplinary Counsel where they can receive required continuing legal education credits in the field related to the agency's purpose.

CONTRACTUAL

The FY15 budget does not come close to meeting the current obligations in contractual expenses. In FY13 the Commission spent \$76,182 in this area and spent \$85,933 in FY14. The deficit request will be used in a large measure to add authority in the contractual line items to meet basic operating needs in order to meet fixed expenses such as rent, telephones, computer maintenance and court costs. To be fully funded, the Commission is seeking \$94,703 in contractual line items for FY16. This is only a 10% increase from the FY14 spending levels and as we have already noted, DFA has raised its fees by 300%.

COMMODITIES

In order to meet budget reductions and declining revenue, the Commission has expended funds for only essential office supplies and fuel. In FY14, the cost for fuel was down due to the fact the car had to be parked when funding for repairs was not available. The repair cost was higher than the savings in fuel.

The agency has only \$5,000 budgeted in commodities again for FY15 which does not fund the needs of the agency. The agency is requesting full funding in Commodities in order to fund rising fuel costs and increased fuel consumption due to more investigations. The increase will also allow the agency to purchase supplies that have not been able to be purchased for the past several years due to the underfunding in this category.

CAPITAL OUTLAY

The Commission did not have any equipment expenditures in five of the last eight years. There were no funds budgeted in FY14 for equipment but the Commission was required to purchase three new computers when the office machines were no longer able to be turned on, or otherwise crashed due to failing operating systems and the age of the machines. There is still a dire need to replace equipment. On average, the Commission has spent only \$607 annually for equipment for the past six years. The Commission is seeking funding for the replacement of the three remaining computers, purchasing a standalone server and the purchase of 2 heavy duty printers. The total equipment cost is \$7,750.

VEHICLES

Four years ago the agency purchased a used vehicle from another state agency for \$3,500. This vehicle greatly reduced the in-state travel costs and saved almost \$30,000 annually. However, this vehicle now has nearly 200,000 miles on it and is greatly increasing the agency's cost of repairs. The agency requested replacement of this vehicle in FY15 but this was not granted. Without the replacement of the vehicle in FY16, the agency may be required to return to reimbursing individuals for use of their Privately Owned Vehicles (POV) which will more than triple the travel costs reflected in this budget. The vehicle will pay for itself in less than two years based on the current mileage rates for POV travel.

In order to fund this request, the Commission is seeking to be total funded with a General Fund appropriation. Any Special Revenue collected would be used in subsequent years or would be used to escalate its FY16 budget for costs associated with mandated hearings.
