FEDERAL FUNDS

The Mississippi Gaming Commission is a participant in a Federal Equitable Sharing Agreement with the U.S. Department of Justice. When the MGC participates in a law enforcement activity in conjunction with the U.S. Department of Justice, we are entitled to an equitable-share of the federally forfeited assets. To remain in compliance with the agreement, the Commission must use such funds for law enforcement purposes only, in accordance with the statutes and guidelines that govern equitable sharing. It is further stipulated that these assets may only be used to augment the law enforcement budget and not to supplant it. Therefore, the fund balance due to seized and forfeited funds can only be used above and beyond our normal operating budget.

3187 Investigations

The Mississippi Gaming Commission has adopted regulations that authorize the Commission to charge monies for various work products that are necessary to carry out the duties given to the Commission and to comply with Statutes set forth in the Gaming Control Act. The MGC exclusively relies on Special Fund Revenues to fund the agency. These special funds are derived from each licensed casino paying an inclusive investigative fee on a quarterly basis. This inclusive fee covers all investigations, field verifications and audits of current casino operations. The MGC was given the authority to levy the above mentioned fee, beginning with FY 2011.

During the 2010 Regular Legislative Session, House Bill 1147 amended the Mississippi Code of 1972, Section 75-76-81 as follows: "The Mississippi Gaming Commission shall assess and collect all fees imposed under Section 75-76-33(2)(f) and shall deposit the funds received from the fees into the Mississippi Gaming Commission Fund. Unexpended amounts remaining in the special fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the State General Fund."

Any other special funds are derived from laboratory fees and tests, laboratory shipping fees, work permitting fees, self-exclusion forfeitures and investigations conducted outside current casino operations. The investigative fund balance at the end of each fiscal year is comprised of many different elements such as carried over fund balances, unused investigative deposits, and revenue in excess of estimates.

3188 Charitable Bingo

In the Gaming Control Act, the MGC is also tasked with the oversight & enforcement of the Charitable Bingo Laws. Along with this task, the Commission was given the authority to assess various fees associated with this oversight. These fees include but are not limited to License Fees, Bingo Revenue Fees, Pull-tab Fees, and Machine Fees.

Section 97-33-101 of the Charitable Bingo Law states:

"All fees and fines collected by the commission pursuant to Sections 97-33-51 through 97-33-203 shall be deposited into a special fund to be known as the "Charitable Bingo Fund," which is hereby created in the State Treasury. The monies in such fund shall be used exclusively to support the activities of the commission related to the regulation of the Charitable Bingo Law, upon appropriation by the Legislature. Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the State General Fund, and any interest earned on amounts in such special fund shall be deposited to the credit of the special fund."

Mississippi Gaming Commission Name of Agency

The Mississippi Gaming Commission (MGC) requests a budget of \$10,754,566 for Fiscal Year 2016. This request reflects a small 5.36% (\$548,016) increase from our Fiscal Year 2015 appropriation. The Agency seeks to maintain a high level of regulatory services to fulfill the responsibilities placed on the Agency in the Gaming Control Act. The increase requested is needed to sustain staffing capability and capacity in order to enhance and maintain the high level of integrity the State of Mississippi has established in the gaming industry's regulatory environment. A lack of funding leads to staffing turnover and shortages, limited travel and contractual funds to adequately train and develop law enforcement and auditing staff, and limited commodity funds interrupt the continuation of business.

No General Funds are requested for Fiscal Year 2016. The MGC exclusively relies on Special Fund Revenues to fund the Agency. These special funds are derived from investigative fees, permits, tests, and audits performed by the MGC. Each licensed casino also pays an inclusive investigative fee on a quarterly basis.

The Mississippi Gaming Commission requests to have language in the Fiscal Year 2016 appropriation bill to continue to have the ability to escalate and expend funds from any proceeds arising from the participation in seizures of illegal gaming activities. These monies will be awarded to the Agency by the county and municipal courts. The use of the funds is limited to law enforcement purposes, excluding salaries.

The Major Object Categories affected by the budget request are detailed as follows:

PERSONAL SERVICES:

The Mississippi Gaming Commission is requesting a \$548,016 increase in the Major Object Category Personal Services. The additional compensation of \$168,055 is requested for anticipated reclassifications of law enforcement pins, expected educational benchmarks, and anticipated reallocation of accounting positions to the next step in their career ladder.

For FY 2015 we were able to enact a new Accounting Auditor job class series which allows for a better career ladder for our accountants. We hope to be more competitive with other state agencies and to see a lower vacancy rate among our accountants. In planning for FY 2016, we seek to reallocate twenty-one (21) Gaming Accountants. In addition to the accountants, the Agency also seeks to reclassify twelve (12) Gaming Agents. Retaining qualified agents is also important to the Mississippi Gaming Commission, as we must compete not only with the private sector but also with other agencies who hire numerous certified law enforcement personnel. A small movement on our career ladder significantly helps this agency recruit and retain accountants and agents.

The MGC also has five (5) staff members who should be eligible for their CPM Educational Benchmark, six (6) staff members who should be eligible for their CSM Educational Benchmarks, five (5) for their BSC Educational Benchmarks, and five (5) awaiting their Stennis 1% benchmark.

The remaining increase of \$379,960 MGC is requesting in Personal Services will help cover small increases in staff salaries that have occurred over the past seven years. The increases were the result of career ladder movements, better career ladders for both our agents and accountants, and other legislatively approved salary increases. Over the course of time, the accumulate cost of these small increases has been absorbed within the spending authority provided. However, the Agency has reached a point of saturation in our spending authority. The Agency seeks to remedy this. The Mississippi Gaming Commission is not asking for any cash, but is seeking assistance with spending

authority and compliance language. The MGC is proud to be 100% Special Funded for several years now, but as a small agency our biggest hurdle for personal services remains compliance. Your consideration is greatly appreciated in this category.

TRAVEL:

The Mississippi Gaming Commission requests no increase/decrease in the Major Object Category Travel for Fiscal Year 2016. Much of the Special Fund revenue is generated from the travel and investigations conducted during that travel. The Investigations Division is charged with investigating all gaming, manufacturer and distributor's licenses, findings of suitability, key employee licenses, other Commission approvals, and reporting all material facts to the Commission. The investigative process is ongoing and continuous by virtue of industry employee turnover, management changes, acquisitions and mergers in the gaming industry. This division travels more than any other and is responsible for all trips outside the United States and most of the trips outside of Mississippi. Limitation of this category will severely hamper the agency's ability to generate funds.

CONTRACTUAL SERVICES:

The Mississippi Gaming Commission requests no change in the Major Object Category Contractual Services for Fiscal Year 2016. As with any agency comprised of law enforcement officers, specific training is mandatory in order for certifications to be maintained. The MGC also maintains several data bases that will require professional assistance in maintaining or upgrading. There are two specific data bases that will require replacement as proper maintenance service is no longer available due to the age of the technology. These items will not expand the MGC, but will only allow for maintaining the level of regulatory services necessary to carry out the responsibilities placed on the MGC in the Gaming Control Act. However, the Agency feels that any increases can be offset and absorbed by decreases and conservation in other areas within this category.

COMMODITIES:

The Mississippi Gaming Commission requests no increase or decrease in the Major Object Category Commodities. The Agency will be fiscally responsible and this amount will continue to allow the MGC to operate all necessary functions to carry out its mission.

CAPITAL OUTLAY:

The Mississippi Gaming Commission requests no increase/decrease in the Major Object Category Capital Outlay for Fiscal Year 2016.

VEHICLES:

The Mississippi Gaming Commission requests no increase in the Major Object Category Vehicles for Fiscal Year 2016. However, in order to carry out the responsibilities placed on the Agency by the Gaming Control Act, enforcement agents, auditors, and compliance officers must frequently drive to both casinos and charitable gaming facilities for regulatory purposes. These facilities are spread throughout all parts of our State. Many vehicles in the Agency's fleet have reached high mileages, which in turn, increase the amount necessary for repairs and maintenace that have to be done. The monies requested for Fiscal Year 2016 will allow the Agency to purchase approximately six vehicles to replace some that are in disrepair or approaching eight to twelve years old with high mileages. Until the past six years the MGC had not replaced any vehicles in a routine way. The Agency recognizes the need to keep cars in a constant rotation and annually rid itself of older high mileage vehicles needing costly maintenance.
