A reduction in salaries and travel could result in a loss of several positions and a reduction in the amount of technical assistance provided to Level 1 and 2 school districts by the Office of Accreditation. A reduction in the contractual services category could result in the inability of MDE to meet the cost of statewide testing contracts or a reduction in the technical assistance provided to school districts. A reduction in commodities would result in a decrease in materials and information which could be shared with the local districts. A reduction in subsidies would impact the accountability system, and therefore have a direct impact on school districts.
