AGENCY NAME

The Office of Land and Water Resources (OLWR) is responsible for the management of the water resources in Mississippi. § 51-3-1 of the Mississippi Code requires that "...the water resources of the state be put to beneficial use to the fullest extent of which they are capable, that the waste or unreasonable use, or unreasonable method of use, of water be prevented, that the conservation of such water be exercised ..." To achieve this requirement, OLWR is pursuing a conjunctive water management approach that coordinates the use of the ground and surface water resources of the state is to satisfy desired water needs.

OLWR has numerous programs that support these requirements. These include the development and implementation of monitoring plans to facilitate the systematic collection, compilation, and management of data related to water wells, streams and lakes in the state; water use surveys and meter reporting tools; application of computer models to assist in making water management decisions; review and processing of applications for issuance, modification and enforcement of surface and groundwater use permits; and the monitoring of ground and surface water conditions in the state to forecast potential problems and to enforce applicable rules and regulations. OLWR is also responsible for licensing and regulating water well contractors operating in Mississippi; regulating the design, construction, and modification of certain dams in accordance with regulatory criteria to ensure that lives and property downstream from dams and reservoirs are protected; and assessing potential contamination threats to public, domestic and industrial water supplies.

MDEQ is currently engaged with the energy sector as it relates to hydraulic fracturing activities in the south-west portion of the state. OLWR is developing new permitting, monitoring and sampling protocols to manage both groundwater and surface water withdrawals integral to the hydraulic fracturing process. In an effort to balance water demands with available supplies, OLWR is developing permit special terms and conditions (STAC) to guide and assist compliance and enforcement of state regulations. As the energy sector ramps up production OLWR will be attempting to monitor and model surface water conditions in real-time. Developing baselines for water quantity, flow and quality are paramount to water management planning.

II. Program Objective:

A primary objective of OLWR is described in § 51-3-1 of the Mississippi Code, which states "to the fullest extent possible, the ground and surface water resources within the state shall be integrated in their use, storage, allocation and management." This is achieved by the coordinated interaction of numerous water quantity and quality programs and processes within the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ), inventorying and assessing the availability of water associated with the fresh water aquifers and major fresh water streams in Mississippi, and assuring the safety of high and significant hazard dams located in the state.

OLWR strives to ensure that the use, storage, allocation, and management of water resources of the state be accomplished to the fullest extent possible; that water pumped in Mississippi complies with applicable permit regulations; and that all dams in the state are identified, inventoried and classified. High hazard dams on inventory should be in compliance with appropriate design criteria or have had any identified deficiencies noted, reported and subjected to a remediation plan or action. Dams that were previously deemed Low or Significant hazard are reevaluated periodically to ensure proper classification.

PROGRAM NAME

I. Program Description:

The Office of Geology, as the state geological survey, is responsible for research into the geology, mineral resources, and geologic hazards of Mississippi and for publishing this information; for managing the development of MDEM, a digital land base computer model of the state; for managing the Mississippi Flood Map Modernization and Risk MAP programs; and for regulation of mining and reclamation in the state.

The Office of Geology serves a principal data-collection mission of the Department of Environmental Quality, conducting statewide investigations of surface and subsurface geologic features, which are the basis of the environment. The Office of Geology is the primary source of information and repository of data on the geology and mineral resources of the State of Mississippi. It serves as the state's voice and advisor on issues relating to basic and applied geology, economic mineral resources, and geologic hazards. Mineral resources of interest include oil, natural gas, building stone, clay, sand and gravel, coal and lignite, limestone, chalk, bentonite, water, and all other mineral substances of value. The Office of Geology prepares reports with illustrations and maps describing the geological and natural resources of the state. Credible technical information about our state's resources is a vital component of economic development.

In addition, the Office of Geology regulates the mining and reclamation of all surface mines in the state under two state mining laws. Staff is responsible also for development of the Mississippi Digital Earth Model (MDEM).

II. Program Objective:

The objective of the Office of Geology is to serve Mississippi's public, environmental community, industry, and academia with information on the geology and mineral resources of the state; to regulate surface mining and reclamation in the state; and to coordinate geographic information systems (GIS) activities in the state and develop MDEM. This is accomplished through geologic research, data compilation, and information dissemination by way of publications, online databases, and the map sales operation; through geospatial resources activities; and by permitting the surface mining and reclamation operations in the state. The administration of the Office provides support to the subprograms described below, edits and publishes all Office publications, and responds to inquiries by callers and visitors pertaining to general geology and economic mineral resources. The Publication Sales Office handles sales of Office of Geology publications and topographic maps.

The Geospatial Resources Division focuses on remote sensing and geographic information systems (GIS) activities. The division manages the Mississippi Flood Map Modernization Initiative (MFMMI), which is creating and maintaining Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) digital flood insurance rate maps (DFIRMs) for all of Mississippi's 82 counties, pending continued FEMA funding. The MDEQ Office of Geology is charged with development of the Mississippi Digital Earth Model (MDEM) and the Geospatial Resources Division manages data development / data collection of digital GIS layers for MDEM. MDEM consists of seven layers of digital information: (1) geodetic control, (2) elevation and bathymetry, (3) orthoimagery, (4) hydrography, (5) transportation, (6) government boundaries, and (7) cadastral. The division is responsible for delivery of these data sets to ITS for storage and distribution to public and private stakeholders by the Mississippi Geospatial Clearinghouse. The division maintains three Web sites and is planning to add others. One site has oil and gas related information: library.geology.deq.state.ms.us. Another contains coastal data collected in previous years of research: geology.deq.state.ms.us/coastal. The flood mapping program is at: geology.deq.ms.gov/floodmaps.

The Environmental Geology Division collects and archives geological data used by other programs in MDEQ and by mineral exploration and environmental industries. It operates a rotary drilling rig and an auger rig to collect subsurface geological samples for investigations, conducts work in applied geology and geologic hazards, and maintains a geophysical wireline logging program. The division also collects, maintains and archives subsurface samples from oil and gas tests drilled in the state. The sample library and services are used by geoscientists from all over the world. The wireline program performs logging operations and responds to over 100 inquiries annually about geological conditions and groundwater information.

The Surface Geology Division conducts field mapping and paleontological studies and compiles geologic maps and reports. This division locates and maps economic mineral deposits, maps surface geologic units, responds to public requests for information about the geology of Mississippi, and publishes reports for public dissemination. Geologic maps provide the foundation on which informed environmental and development decisions are made.

The Mining and Reclamation Division administers a regulatory program to enforce the Mississippi Surface Mining and Reclamation Act for all materials other than coal. It is responsible for reviewing approximately 200 applications for surface mining permits and exempt operations yearly. There are over 2,000 active mines, permitted and exempt,

I. Program Description:

AGENCY NAME

The Office of Administrative Services was created by statute under section 49-2-17 which states that the Executive Director of the Department of Environmental Quality shall appoint an assistant for administration and shall centralize under his office the following functions for the Department: (a) Accounting; (b) Payroll; (c) Purchasing; (d) Data Processing; (e) Motor Pool and Vehicles; (f) Maintenance; (g) Printing and Records; and (h) Public Relations. The Executive Director, the legal staff, the human resource staff, the community engagement staff and the administrative services staff are included under this program budget.

All of these functions are currently being carried out by the Office of Administrative Services for the entire Department.

The Office of Administrative Services can be simply described as the consolidation of all Departmental overhead administrative functions under a single office in order to avoid costly duplication of personnel, equipment and related expenses that would occur were the functions carried out by each Office within the Department. The centralization of these functions helps to provide coherent, equitable and consistent application of resources and policies within the Department.

Office of the Executive Director

This function is the support for the chief executive officer for the Department. This function consists of the Executive Director, the Commission on Environmental Quality, the department's Deputy Administrator, two Staff Officer III's, one Staff Officer II and one Environmental Engineer I.

Office of Administrative Services

This function is responsible for the supervision of the following areas: Accounting, Human Resources, Budget, Information Technology and Support Services. It is also responsible for the oversight of Internal Controls.

Legal

This function provides staff legal support services to the Department, Commission on Environmental Quality and the Permit Board.

Information Center

The Information Center manages the Web Page and all public information and media relations functions for the department.

Human Resources

This function provides personnel, training and employee benefits services to the Department's employees.

Office of Community Engagement

This function is responsible for facilitating, coordinating and advancing agency-wide community engagement.

Environmental Resource Center

The Environmental Resource Center coordinates regulatory assistance and technical assistance outreach activities for the department. In addition, this unit receives and triages complaints from the public about environmental issues, guiding complainants to the technical regulatory staff in the agency who can respond to the complaints.

Accounting

This function provides fiscal reporting, purchasing, accounts payable, fees accounting, and payroll administration services.

Budget

This function provides budgeting and grants accounting for the Department. It also provides contractual procurement functions for the Department.

Information Technology

This function is responsible for the overall planning and management of information system development, technology software migration, software selection, system integration and agency-wide information technology vision of the department's Enterprise Infrastructure. These infrastructure include information systems (developed in-house and

Support Services

This function provides support to the Department for property inventory, building maintenance, print shop, mail, switchboard, motor pool functions and security.

II. Program Objective:

Executive Director

To provide all requirements of the Executive Director's Office.

Office of Administrative Services

To provide supervision to Accounting, Human Resources, Budget, Information Technology, Support Services and Internal Controls in the most effective and efficient manner possible, consistent with compliance with all federal and state laws and regulations.

Legal

To provide the Department staff, the Commission on Environmental Quality, the Permit Board and the regulated public with the best possible legal services through the handling of all matters pertaining to the drafting, interpretation, administration and enforcement of environmental laws within the state of Mississippi. The Legal division also provides legal representation to the Department, the Commission on Environmental Quality, and the Permit Board in contested matters and litigation.

Information

Center

To provide public information regarding the department's activities and to coordinate (news) media relations for the department.

Human Resources

To provide the Department with the personnel, employee benefit services and training in the most effective and efficient manner possible while maintaining compliance with federal and state laws and regulations.

Office of Community Engagement

To facilitate the use of environmental resources to support existing partnerships and engage new partners to contribute to the educational, social and economic progress of the community, region and state.

Environmental Resource Center

To support the department's regulatory and technical programs in providing information to the entities that the agency regulates so that those regulated entities can better understand how to comply with the laws and regulations enforced by the department.

Accounting

To provide the Department support and state level reporting requirements through the services described in Section I. in the most efficient manner possible while maintaining financial control and compliance with all federal and state laws and regulations.

Budget

To provide the Department support and federal reporting requirements, as well as contractual procurement functions, through the services described in Section I. in the most efficient manner possible while maintaining budgetary control and compliance with all federal and state laws and regulations.

Information Technology

To provide the efficient and timely delivery of information and services to the Department staff and the served public through computerization.

Narrative Explanation:

A 3% General Fund Reduction in the Office of Land & Water Resources would reduce the D-2 Equipment budget \$5,115 for the office. This would hamper our ability to replace out-dated personal computers and equipment used by scientists in the field.

The remainder of the reduction, or \$62,486, would be taken in the category of Contractual Services. This would reduce the stream gage monitoring portion of the USGS contract. This information is critical to stream low flow conditions and enables us to monitor conditions and take corrective action as needed, especially during drought and heavy pumping conditions. We would reduce our contract with FTN to provide development and implementation of groundwater monitoring studies and plans. Additionally we would reduce our contract with Tetra Tech to continue developing and documenting our regional groundwater model.

A 3% General Fund Reduction in the Office of Geology would be taken in the categories of Contractual Services (\$35,462) and Commodities (\$6,000). The areas affected by a 3% reduction would include the following:

- 1) Reduce vehicle repair/maintenance
- 2) Reduce training costs
- 3) Reduce critical repairs to drilling equipment which could potentially impede the work of the Environmental Geology Division.
