Name of Agency

FEDERAL FUNDS

DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR, NATIONAL PARK SERVICE

Historic Preservation - The Mississippi Department of Archives and History works in close partnership with the National Park Service. The Department is an active and integral participant in the national preservation programs administered by the National Park Service, including the National Register of Historic Places, the Rehabilitation Investment Tax Credit certification program, and the Certified Local Government grant program. The National Park Service also provides a substantial annual grant from the National Historic Preservation Fund to the Department to help fund the operation of the Historic Preservation Division.

Civil War Battlefield Protection Program - Grants using monies appropriated from the Land and Water Conseration Fund for the acquisition and restoration of Civil War Battlefield land to benefit futre interpretation and visitation.

HUD

HUD/MDA Mitigation - Grant to provide assistance to property owners of national register eligible properties that were affected by hurricanes Katrina and Rita, and to fund archaeology studies in the 6 coastal counties.

HUD/MDA Administrative - Funding to allow the department to create a dedicated staff for the purpose of review and evaluation of environmental data gathered pursuant to various projects funded by the HUD CDBG and meet all federal requirements concerning the National Historic Preservation Act.

Federal Highway Administration

Mississippi Mound Trail - Project created by the Mississippi Transportation Commission to use financial assistance provided by the FHWA to preserve the history of pre-Columbian Indian mound sites in Mississippi which will improve the knowledge of the citizens of, and visitors to, the State regarding the former inhabitants of the area and provide a boost for tourism in the State.

Institute of Museum and Library Services

Connecting to Collections - Funding will provide an informed base from which MDAH can develop improved collection conditions, viable emergency plans, better staff training, and stronger partnerships between institutions, governmental agencies, and the general public.

STATE SUPPORT SPECIAL FUNDS

Appropriated \$250,000 from the Capital Expense Fund.

OTHER SPECIAL FUNDS

TREASURY FUND/BANK

MDAH Gift Fund

This account is comprised of donations made by individuals in support of specific projects and related work of the department.

NARRATIVE OF SPECIAL FUNDS DETAIL AND TREASURY FUND/BANK ACCOUNTS

Mississippi Department of Archives and History

Name of Agency

This account comprises contributions made by individual and organizations to be used in enhancing the collections and furnishings of the historical portion of the Mississippi Governor's Mansion. The Friends of the Mansion program has been established by the Board of Trustees of the Department of Archives and History in accordance with the provisions of Chapter No. 349, Senate Bill No. 2550, Laws of 1980.

JUNIOR HISTORICAL SOCIETY

This \$20,000 fund was first established by the 1956 Mississippi Legislature as the Stonewall Jackson Memorial Fund, for the purpose of memorializing "Stonewall" Jackson by means of an essay contest for high school seniors. Senate Bill No. 2529, Laws of Mississippi 1990, abolished the Stonewall Memorial Board and provided that the Board of Trustees of the Department of Archives and History may spend interest derived from the principal of this fund for activities of the Junior Historical Society of Mississippi. The money market account and the certificate of deposit represent the interest that has been earned on the investments of the original \$20,000 appropriation.

ARCHIVES TRUST FUND

This fund is established by the legislature, section 39-5-27 of the Mississippi Code, and provides that the department can accept donations and that these funds can only be used for the purpose of acquiring, cataloging, conserving, and making available archival resources.

HISTORIC PROPERTIES TRUST FUND

This fund is established by the legislature, section 39-5-23 of the Mississippi Code, and provides that the department can accept donations. All monies in this fund are earmarked for Mississippi Landmark properties or can only be used for Mississippi Landmark properties, through the Landmark Grant Program. Also included is an endowment for the Eudora Welty house. This fund also includes donated funds such as the Dunbar Rowland Fund.

MUSEUM TRUST FUND

This fund is established by the legislature, section 39-5-29 of the Mississippi Code, and provides that the department can accept donations and that these funds can only be used for the purpose of acquiring, cataloging, conserving, and exhibiting artifacts.

STATE CAPITOL R & R FUND

This funding was established by the legislature, section 27-19-56.69 of the Mississippi Code, and it provides that these funds may only be expended by the Mississippi Department of Archives and History for the purpose of paying the costs of repair and renovation of the New Capitol, Old Capitol, Governor's Mansion and War Memorial Building.

1 - SUPPORT SERVICES PROGRAM NAME

I. Program Description:

The Department's finance office, human resources office, property control function, public information section, community relations, office of communication, and information systems office make up the Administration/Support Services Program. The finance office is responsible for the management of all fiscal matters, which include the annual budget preparation for Department programs; the maintenance of accounting records, budgetary allotments, and balances for all state appropriated funds, federal grants, and other special source funds; the processing of all purchase orders, requisitions, and vouchers in compliance with state regulations; and the preparation of the Department's monthly payroll. In addition the finance office oversees the property control function, which includes equipment purchases, repairs, and inventory of all buildings, properties, and/or sites owned or administered by the Department.

The human resources office is responsible for administering all personnel services, including interviewing prospective employees and maintaining personnel and employee leave records. A major responsibility of the human resources office is to issure that all transactions are in compliance with the rules and regulations of the State Personnel Board. In addition, the human resources director serves as the Department's Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Coordinator.

The information systems office is responsible for coordinating the data processing function with all divisions and assisting the division data processing staff with network adminstration. The director serves as the Department's data processing manager and as chairman of the Department's Information Management Committee.

The Office of Communication comprises the public information section and the community relations section. The public information section promotes the work of the Department, enhancing programming, outreach, and community engagement. The section sends press releases and arranges for staff appearances and advertising with local, statewide, and national media outlets in print, television, and radio. The section produces content for the Department website and social media, such as Facebook. The quarterly Mississippi History Newsletter and Journal of Mississippi History are created by this section, as well as brochures, rack cards, invitations, and other printed pieces.

The community relations section connects the Department with the community. The section coordinates the 2Mississippi Museums Campaign, which is raising \$14 million for exhibit costs (matching state funds) and endowments for the Museum of Mississippi History and Mississippi Civil Rights Museum. The section also manages the Twenty-Star Flag initiative to conserve and exhibit the historic 1818 flag. The section also produces events and coordinates the Department speakers' bureau.

II. Program Objective:

The overall objective of the Administration/Support Services Program is to provide administrative support to the other five (5) programs of the Department of Archives and History. Support is given in the areas of accounting and finance, human resources, property control, public information, information systems, and special projects.

AGENCY NAME

I. Program Description:

The Department's original enabling legislation of 1902 and the Archives and Records Management Act of 1981 provide the mandate for the Archives and Library Division's selection, cataloging, and preservation of the archival information of state government, as well as the responsibility for making this information accessible to the public and to state government agencies. In addition, the founding act of 1902 provides the mandate for the selection, cataloging, preservation, and making available of non-governmental archives, including private papers, books, newspapers, maps, photographs, audiovisual materials, and electronic records relating to the prehistory and history of Mississippi.

I. Program Description:

The Historic Properties Division administers the Grand Village of the Natchez Indians, Historic Jefferson College, and Winterville Mounds, which have been preserved and developed as official State Historic Sites. Administration of these three sites with museums includes the presentation of educational programs for school and adult groups, development of educational public events and workshops, coordination of exhibits, maintenance of museum buildings and historic structures, and the management of 252 acres of property in Adams and Washington Counties. The Division staff also provides research assistance in response to inquiries from the public regarding Winterville Mounds, Mississippi Delta archaeology, the Natchez Indians, the French colonial period in the Lower Mississippi River Valley, and Mississippi's territorial period.

The Historic Properties Division also oversees the following undeveloped cultural properties: Assembly Hall Site, Adams County (2.2 acres); Windsor Ruins, Claiborne County (1.84 acres); Jackson Landing-Mulatto Bayou Prehistoric Earthworks, Hancock County (10.86 acres); the Jaketown Archaeological Site, Humphreys County (13.7 acres); the Leist A Archaeological Site, Sharkey County (3.28 acres); the Providence Mound Site and Providence Farm Properties, Holmes County (425.2 acres); the Hollywood Archaeological Site, Tunica County (21.7 acres); the Shaifer House and Old Magnolia Church Site, Claiborne County (14.5 acres); the Coker House, Hinds County (5 acres); portions of the Champion Hill Civil War Battlefield, Hinds County (825 acres); and a portion of the Big Black River Bridge Battlefield, Hinds County (28.071 acres). The Division coordinates archaeological and historical research at these properties and, where feasible, leases properties to private hunting and fishing clubs that assist in their protection and maintenance.

II. Program Objective:

The objective of the Historic Properties Division is to administer the educational programs of the Grand Village of the Natchez Indians, Winterville Mounds, and Historic Jefferson College and to manage and preserve the undeveloped cultural properties owned by the Department of Archives and History.

I. Program Description:

The Historic Preservation Division functions as the official historic preservation office for the State of Mississippi and carries out the responsibilities that have been delegated to the states by Congress under the provisions of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended in 1980 and 1992. The division identifies historic properties and archaeological sites; nominates eligible properties to the National Register of Historic Places; reviews rehabilitation work on National Register properties for both federal and state investment tax credits; monitors federally assisted projects to determine effects on culturally significant resources; consults with agencies and private property owners on the conservation of historic buildings and sites; provides technical and educational assistance to local historic preservation commissions; administers both federal and state grants for restoration of historic properties; and offers educational programs and publications. The Historic Preservation Division also administers the State Antiquities Law, the State Abandoned Historic Cemeteries Program, the State Historical Marker Program, and the Mississippi Mound Trail Program.

II. Program Objective:

The Historic Preservation Division's objective is to survey and inventory cultural resources; maintain a Historic Resources Inventory database for cultural and historic resources; administer the State Antiquities Law; conduct archaeological research and survey on public lands; nominate properties to the National Register of Historic Places; perform cultural and environmental reviews; implement and manage Hurricane Katrina relief grant programs for the National Park Service and MDA/HUD; partner with private, non-profit organizations to acquire Civil War battlefield properties; manage the Archaeological Research, Certified Local Government, Community Heritage Preservation, and Mississippi Landmark Grant programs; oversee the Mississippi Mound Trail project; research and erect appropriate State Historical Markers; administer the Abandoned Cemetery Program; and provide educational programs on historic preservation to the public.

- (D) Arch. Review:

Funding is requested for a new position of Historic Resource Specialist I to serve as project review staff for archaeology. The employee would be responsible for expediting requests for archaeological assessments for economic development and other projects requiring a cultural resources review. The staff person would work with the Review and Compliance Officer and would assist with the input of GIS data from cultural resource survey reports.

(E) Survey and Nomination:

With the ongoing interest in the preservation of historic schools in Mississippi, many of the most historically significant schools need to be nominated for listing in the National Register of Historic Places. Due to staff and budget limitations, funding is requested for contractual assistance to hire a Secretary of Interior-qualified person(s) to conduct a survey of individual National Registor of Historic Places-eligible schools and prepare National Register nominations for each property. In addition to providing formal NPS recognition of the school's significance, listing in the NRHP is a necessary qualification for historic preservation tax credits. The amount requested provides for the nomination of ten (10) schools, including travel.

I. Program Description:

AGENCY NAME

The Museum Division comprises the Manship House Museum, the Eudora Welty House and Garden, the curatorial function of the historic section of the Governor's Mansion, the Old Capitol Museum, and the administration of collections, exhibits, educational programming, field services, the Mississippi History Store. The division director supervises site directors, who are responsible for interpretation and day-to-day operations at each site; and section heads and other administrative staff, who administer and facilitate their sections.

Planning for the construction of the Museum of Mississippi History and the Mississippi Civil Rights Museum continues.

The Old Capitol Museum, a National Historic Landmark, is a civics and government museum. Educational programming and public access educates the public about the history, people, and architecture of the building, the governmental processes of the state, and the importance of historic preservation.

The Manship House Museum, a National Register property, is accredited by the American Association of Museums, and has been widely recognized as one of the finest historic house museums in the nation. The Museum mission is to interpret the daily life of the Charles H. Manship family, an interesting 19th-century middle-class family. Closed since 2010, the Museum has undergone major foundation repair, with additional interior and exterior work ongoing. The Museum plans to reopen in February 2015 to provide limited tours and special events.

The Eudora Welty House and Garden is a National Historic Landmark. Educational programming and public access to the House, Education and Visitors Center, and the gardens perpetuate the knowledge and understanding of Miss Welty's literary legacy.

The Governor's Mansion, a National Historic Landmark, is both a home to Mississippi's governor, who has private quarters behind the historic section, and a finely furnished house museum in the historic section. The curator is responsible for the care of the historic section, its furnishings, internal fabric, and its interpretation to the public through educational tours.

II. Program Objective:

The objective of the Museum Division is to educate the public in the social, political, economic, and cultural history of Mississippi by collecting, researching, cataloging, preserving, and interpreting artifacts and objects relating to persons, eras, and events in Mississippi history as related to each site.

(D) 2 Mississippi Museums:

Marketing Plan - \$90,000

MDAH needs funds to launch a marketing initiative to expand the public's awareness of services offered by the agency and to increase visitation to current sites. The funds will also allow early marketing of the 2 Mississippi Museums to ensure strong initial visitation.

Information Technology - \$145,454

Funding is requested for software and services to replace our existing email solution, and annual maintenance for firewall, network, backup, antivirus, and managed print services applications, and new equipment and services to replace old and slow technology in keeping with the goal of replacing 20% a year for 5 years.

Historic Preservation Division

Archaeology Review - \$39,235

Authorization is requested for a new position of Historic Resource Specialist I to serve as project review staff for archaeology. The employee would be responsible for expediting requests for archaeological assessments for economic development and other projects requiring a cultural resources review. The staff person would work with the Review and Compliance Officer and would assist with the input of GIS data from cultural resource survey reports.

Historic Schools Survey and Nomination - \$50,000

With the ongoing interest in the preservation of historic schools in Mississippi, many of the most historically significant schools need to be nominated for listing in the National Register of Historic Places. Due to staff and budget limitations, however, we need contractual assistance to hire a Secretary of Interior-qualified person(s) to conduct a survey of individually NRHP-eligible schools and prepare National Register nominations for each property. In addition to providing formal NPS recognition of the schools' significance, listing in the NRHP is a necessary qualification for historic preservation tax credits. The amount requested provides for the nomination of ten (10) schools, including travel.

Museum Division

2 Mississippi Museums (2 MM) - \$389,996

Funds requested will cover costs for eleven (11) new positions and IT support, which are critically needed to perform the advance work required before the legislatively mandated public opening in 2017. One additional Public Information position was added to this unit by Administration.

Manship House Museum Operating Budget - \$131,502

Funds requested will cover costs for annual operating expenses to sustain the Manship House Museum's re-opening to the public.

20-Star Flag Statewide Travel - \$16,440

Funds requested will cover costs for statewide travel of the rare 20-star flag before and during the Mississippi Bicentennial year of 2017. Costs include truck rental, contractual worker assistance, hotel, meals, gas, and other
