The Public Employees' Retirement System (System) is responsible for the administration of four defined benefit and one defined contribution public employee retirement plans, as well as a deferred compensation plan: Public Employees' Retirement System (PERS) Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol Retirement System (MHSPRS) Municipal Retirement System (MRS is comprised of 19 separate retirement systems) Supplemental Legislative Retirement Plan (SLRP) **Optional Retirement Plan (ORP)** Government Employees' Deferred Compensation Plan (MDCP&T)

II. Program Objective:

The purpose of the Public Employees' Retirement System (System), which was established by legislation in 1952, is to provide retirement benefits for all state employees and other public employees whose employers have elected to participate. All services provided by the staff are performed in order to meet that objective.

(C) Non-Recurring Expenses:

Capital Outlay - The amount of \$185,500 will be expended prior to the end of FY 2015.

(D) Administration:

Salaries, Wages and Fringe Benefits - Continuation funding consists of the SPB salary projection of \$9,682,407, \$979,546 for SPB-recommended agency realignments, \$13,200 for MIS special compensation, \$127,957 for reallocations, \$167,694 for reclassification of positions, and \$42,000 for the PERS Board of Trustees' payroll. PERS is also requesting \$30,000 for educational benchmark salary increases and \$187,298 for new hire and agency head flex.

Travel - PERS is seeking \$85,000 in funding for agency travel to be used by staff and members of the Board of Trustees.

Contractual Services - PERS requests \$4,283,000 to maintain existing contracts, fees and software maintenance, as well as implement new GASB reporting requirements and provide for software maintenance contracts under the new pension technology system.

Commodities - PERS requests total funding of \$325,000. This request is equal to our 2015 appropriation and is the minimum amount needed to fund major initiatives in printed communications. Our request also encompasses normal growth in operating expenses associated with office and equipment supplies.

Capital Outlay - Our total continuation request in this category is \$22,750, which includes funding for video and sound equipment to create a video library for education of members and employers. Continuation funding also includes memory upgrades and expanded disk space.

- IV. Additional program activities that will result from increased funding requested in Columns 16-25 (MBR-1-03) and specified Budget Decision Unit Columns (MBR-1-03-A):
- (E) Admin & Pension Expansion:

Salaries, Wages and Fringe Benefits - Funding of \$285,469 is requested for six new positions. Two of the positions are necessary due to the increasingly complex agency-specific legal issues, expanding nature and complexity of investment portfolios. The accounting position is required to support the new financial system implemented in the pension administration system. Three account analyst positions are requested to adequately provide counseling for the increasing retiree population.

Capital Outlay - PERS requests \$9,000 to purchase new PCs for six new positions.

The total 2016 budget request of \$16,240,921 for Public Employees' Retirement System is an increase of \$2,100,127 or 14.9 percent above approved funding for fiscal year 2015. PERS continues its commitment to align our staff, business processes, and technology to implement and oversee quality pension benefit services for our participants, all at the most economical cost.

#### Salaries, Wages & Fringe Benefits-

We are submitting a total budget request for salary expenditures of \$11,515,571, an increase of \$1,733,325 over approved funding for 2015.

Realignments-PERS is requesting \$979,546 in SPB-recommended agency realignments. Each year SPB conducts a salary survey to determine deficiencies between current MS state salary levels and prevailing salary levels in adjoining states for similar jobs. The most recent salary realignment appropriated by the Legisature was July 1, 2007. PERS is requesting funds sufficient to implement salary adjustments as recommended by SPB for FY 2015.

Reallocations - PERS is requesting \$127,957 for positions identified that substantial differences exit between actual job performance, experience, and educational requirements versus the job title currently utilized by the agency.

PERS is requesting the reallocation of three positions to the PERS-Deputy Director classification to more accurately reflect the agency-wide duties currently assigned to those positions. As the agency has grown in staff size and technical complexity the Finance Director, Human Resources Director and Management Information Systems Director have been elevated to a senior management level of authority and responsibility within the agency. The incumbents of these three positions are routinely called upon to provide counseling, advice, and high-level professional expertise to the Executive Director and to the Executive Staff. Two of the positions are already non-state service, and the third would also be classified as non-state service in conjunction with implementation of the reallocations. The requested classifications are necessary to 1) retain competent staff with the professional skills and expertise to fulfill these assigned duties; 2) to provide succession planning for the agency; and 3) to recruit suitable replacement staff in the event of the departure of the incumbent employees.

PERS is requesting the reallocation of three positions to address critical staff deficits in the agency's Management Information Systems (MIS) division. The requested classifications are 1) Lead Business Systems Analyst, 2) Programmer Analyst II, and 3) Network Specialist I. In 2010 PERS embarked on a \$25 M project to update the aging pension administration to a state-of-the-art Oracle/PeopleSoft-based system. Project planning and implementation discussions among PERS, ITS, the project vendor Sierra-Cedar, Inc., and the outside information technology consulting firm L.R. Wechsler, Ltd., have revealed a need for changes to the current staffing structure and skill sets. Both PERS and Sierra-Cedar, Inc., have provided extensive training for the current MIS staff at a cost of more than \$550K. The reallocations of these positions are necessary for the successful implementation and operation of the new pension system.

PERS is requesting the reallocation of three positions to address critical staff deficits in the agency's Investment Accounting division. The requested classificiations are 1) PERS-Investment Accountant II and 2) PERS-Investment Accountant Lead. Beginning in fiscal year 2011, the investment accounting staff took on more responsibility for calculating manager fees and following up with managers who call regarding the fees on a quarterly basis. Investment accounting has also increased in volume and complexity as shown below:

" PERS had 17 active manager accounts in FY1994; as of  $\overline{6}/30/2014$ , PERS has 64 active portfolio accounts " In 1994 there were less than 4,000 securities to account for; as of  $\frac{6}{30}/14$ , PERS has nearly 10,000 security positions.

" As of 6/30/14, PERS has a \$25.3 billion total portfolio with \$8.8 billion in foreign holdings, invested in 91 countries.

PERS is requesting reallocation of one position to Staff Officer III, to appropriately reflect current duties being

performed by the incumbent in a multi-billion dollar pension fund. In addition to budgeting and financial reporting responsibilities, the incumbent has become responsible for special financial projects such as developing policy and work product to communicate and implement comprehensive Governmental Accounting Standards Board pension accounting and financial reporting changes for PERS and its 900 participating employers. The incumbent routinely completes financial projects of a complex nature assigned by the Executive Director, Deputy Administrator, and Finance Director. The requested classification is necessary to retain competent staff with the specialized technical skills and expertise to fulfill these assigned duties and to recruit suitable replacement staff in the event of departure of the incumbent employee.

PERS is requesting reallocation of one position to Accountant/Auditor IV, Professional, to address the results of a substantial increase in the specialization and volume of work due to the new line-of-business technology project. The incumbent has assumed responsibility for developing and maintaining the reporting structure and closing processes of the new accounting software system within the technology system. Additionally, the incumbent has assumed responsibilities which are highly technical and have significant monetary implications for the agency such as tax reporting, discrepancy resolution, and other ongoing communications with the Internal Revenue Service. The reallocation is necessary to retain proficient staff with the professional experience and depth of knowledge to fulfill assigned duties, as well as to recruit suitable replacement staff in the event of the departure of the incumbent employee.

PERS is requesting reallocation of one position to Staff Officer I, to address the increase in volume and complexity of responsibilities such as contracts, supplier relationships, and meeting oversight requirements. The incumbent is responsible for a greater number and wider diversity of agency contracts with more complex terms not only monitored by the incumbent, but for which the incumbent is responsible to coordinate with other oversight entities. In addition, the incumbent is now responsible for implementing new Governmental Accounting Standards Board pronouncements as they relate to capital assets. The requested classification is necessary to retain competent staff with the specialized technical skills and expertise to fulfill these assigned duties and to recruit suitable replacement staff in the event of departure of the incumbent employee.

PERS is requesting the reallocation of one position to Staff Officer II. The incumbent is the Maintenance Director and is responsible for the electrical system, plumbing systems, HVAC systems, general maintenance and structural integrity of the PERS main building, parking garage and secondary building. The requested classification is necessary to retain competent staff with the technical skills and expertise to fulfill these assigned duties and to recruit suitable replacement staff in the event of the departure of the incumbent employee.

PERS is requesting the reallocation of 20 positions to the PERS-Retirement Benefit Analyst I classification. Due to advances in technology and the implementation of the new line-of-business system, scheduled to go live this fall, the requested title is more reflective of the duties and responsibilities actually assigned to entry level staff. This title will be used in various units within the agency.

Reclassifications - Our request includes \$167,694 for reclassification of positions under authority granted by the State Personnel Board to establish a career ladder to promote successful job performance, job training, and tenure in positions. Incumbents in these job classifications are required to successfully complete prescribed training, perform successfully in the PERS job series, and meet the requirements defined in the PERS Career Ladders Guidelines for Auto-Reclassification/Promotion. There are 39 positions within the Retirement Services Division where incumbents have qualified, or will qualify, for salary increases by 2016 under the intensive career ladder requirements. Career ladders offer PERS employees a long-term career plan and have shown proven success in producing higher performing, better-trained, and knowledgeable employees.

New Positions - PERS requests \$285,469 to fund six new agency positions.

An Attorney Senior and

" A Paralegal Specialist are needed for advanced legal counsel to conduct research and analysis required to address the increasingly complex agency specific legal issues. These positions will report to and provide legal assistance to the Executive Director related to tax law changes, public pension system legal updates, freedom of information act requests, contract administration, and other legal actions involving PERS.

" An Accountant/Auditor III, Professional is required for new functional duties, as well as to accommodate a significant increase in reconciliation processes available through the new financial and pension systems.

" Three PERS-Account Analysts are necessary to accommodate the increasing number of retirees to whom PERS provides services. These positions are required for adequate staff staffing necessary to provide counseling, respond to inquiries, and to process application in a timely manner.

MIS Special Compensation in the amount of \$13,200 is requested to attract, retain, and develop competent information technology professionals to support the unique and changing information technology business needs of PERS.

Educational Benchmark funding of \$30,000 is requested for those PERS staff members who have completed, or will complete by 2016, eligible educational achievements.

Board of Trustees Payroll - Funding of \$42,000 is requested for the ten-member Board of Trustees' payroll, currently paid from Salaries (Base) but not included in the SPB's projection of salary costs.

Other-PERS requests New Hire Flex in the amount of \$50,000 for hiring candidates with qualifications that exceed the minimum requirements. Under new SPB rules, PERS must request funding in order to have and use this flexibility.

Other-PERS requests Agency Head Flex in the amount of \$137,298 to retain and adequately compensate executive staff that reports to the agency head or senior management who advocate substantive agency policy. Under new SPB rules, PERS must request this funding in order to have and use flexibility in compensation for expert staff members.

Travel-

PERS is requesting that funding for this category remain at the 2015 level of \$85,000. We believe that the current funding level is adequate to maintain professional development for staff and board members, as well as provide for educational services to agencies, members, and retirees.

#### Contractual Services-

PERS requests \$4,283,000 in funding for fiscal year 2016, an increase of \$520,552 or 13.8 percent over approved funding for 2015. This request represents funding for existing contracts, fees, and software maintenance. Additional funding is requested to implement GASB Statement Nos. 67 and 68, applicable to pension plans and employers participating in pension plans. Much of the required information for employer financial reporting resides at the plan level and must be supplied by the PERS consulting actuary and audited by our independent auditing firm. Our request also includes increases that apply to additional software maintenance contracts under the new pension technology system and to provide for escalating investment consultant fees.

Included in the 2014 expenditures are building repair services totaling \$112,500 that are funded by escalation authority within the PERS Building Repair and Maintenance Fund (3533). For the 2016 budget, PERS requests escalation authority of a total of \$500,000.

#### Commodities-

PERS requests that funding for the 2016 budget remain the same as the fiscal year 2015 approved budget amount of \$325,000. Our request in this category represents the lowest amount necessary to continue funding major initiatives in printed communications including annual membership statements, retiree/member newsletters, and member handbooks.

Included in the 2014 expenditures are commodities totaling \$662 that are funded by escalation authority within the PERS Building Repair and Maintenance Fund (3533).

Capital Outlay-

PERS requests a total of \$32,350 to fund Capital Outlay expenditures in fiscal year 2016, a decrease of \$153,750 from our 2015 appropriation. The decrease is primarily in data processing equipment. Equipment requests total \$31,750 and Wireless Communication Devices total \$600.

New PCs - \$9,000 is requested to fund the purchase of PCs for the six new positions requested in the 2016 budget proposal.

Memory Upgrade, Disk Space, and Equipment - \$19,750 is requested to manage escalating processing and storage capacity requirements of the System and to secure equipment for emergencies and/or unplanned projects.

Video Camera - \$2,000 is requested for a video camera equipment for the purpose of establishing a video library for education of PERS members and employers.

Sound Equipment - \$1,000 is requested for sound equipment to complement the video camera equipment for the purpose of establishing a member and employer educational library.

Wireless Communications Devices - \$600 is requested to provide for emergency replacement of cellular devices for PERS Field Representatives.
