I. Program Description:

The Mississippi Arts Commission (MAC) serves as the state's public arts partner, supporting creativity in communities throughout the state. One of the primary ways MAC accomplishes this is through its grants programs. The agency utilizes state and federal funds to support a wide range of artistic and creative activity, including projects taken on by local governments, non-profits and individual artists.

MAC provides support to organizations and local government entities through a few different programs. The Operating Grant program provides support to active professional level arts organizations. The Project Grant program supplies funds for a wide range of artistic activities hosted by arts and non-arts organizations. The Minigrant program provides a smaller level of funding to support artist performances or professional development. All of MAC's grants to organizations require cash matches, insuring that there is local investment in a proposed project.

The agency accepts applications from organizations through four program areas. The Arts Industry Program supports organizations that are focused on presenting a specific art form (like an arts museum, theatre, or dance group). The Arts Education Program works to create arts opportunities for K-12 students. The Community and Economic Development Program assists groups who are using the arts to improve life in their community. Finally, the Folk Arts Program focuses on Mississippi's folk and traditional art forms, like blues, gospel music, and traditional quilting.

The agency also offers grants to professional-level artists. MAC's Artist Fellowship program awards grants to artists who demonstrate high artistic quality. The Artist Minigrant program provides a smaller grant to artists to use for professional development or purchase of supplies for a specific project. These awards assist working artists in expanding their abilities as professionals and their status as small businesses.

MAC staff work hard to identify projects throughout the state that would benefit from MAC support. Since many of the organizations that apply for funds are run by volunteers, the staff provides extensive technical support to applicants. In addition to one-on-one meetings, MAC hosts annual "Grants 101" workshops in multiple regions throughout the state, providing an overview of the grants programs and tips on how to put together a competitive application.

Each of MAC's grant programs has a set of published criteria that are used to assess the applications. The criteria also provide applicants with a guide on the types of information that needs to be included in their applications. The criteria focus on artistic quality, community involvement, how the program is assessed, and other factors.

The applications go through an extensive review process, including peer review panels in which arts professionals and community members assess each application based on the program criteria. The panels are open to the public and applicants are encouraged to attend. The comments by the panel are available to the applicants after the grant awards are announced. The panel's recommendations are presented to MAC's Board of Commissioners who make the final decisions on funding.

MAC staff travel throughout the state to evaluate funded programs on an ongoing basis. MAC grantees also serve as "gateways" for the agency into communities, often uncovering artists and other activities that would benefit from a connection to MAC.

- Support the development of Mississippi communities through the arts
- Strengthen PreK-12 education in and through the arts
- Increase the knowledge of the state's folk and traditional artforms
- Improve the capacity of the state's arts industry

I. Program Description:

As the primary advocate for the arts in Mississippi, the Mississippi Arts Commission (MAC) works to increase creative activity in the state through its grant and non-grants activities. While the grants programs provide support to a range of activities, MAC also recognizes there are a number of ways that the agency can assist communities and individual artists through professional development, technical support and other non-grants activities.

MAC is an experienced presenter of professional development workshops for artists and staff from cultural non-profits. The agency presents ongoing workshops for different types of individual artists. MAC has been a partner in presenting an annual professional development conference for festival presenters since 2005. The agency also offers a wide array of training opportunities for educators through its Whole Schools and Arts Education programs.

These training opportunities also frequently allow for building informal networks and connections between artists and arts organizations. In many situations attendees are often the only person in their community who is involved in a specific project (such as presenting a festival). The trainings or workshops allow them to connect and share information with others doing similar work in different parts of the state.

MAC staff also serve as advisors for a wide range of cultural and community development efforts in the state. Staff members have served as advisors to the Blues Commission, community assessment projects, and other more informal meetings with groups and artists. They are also frequently asked to serve on committees for local and regional cultural projects, such as the Delta National Heritage Area project.

MAC also works hard to build awareness for the arts in the state in a number of ways. The agency hosts "The Mississippi Arts Hour," a weekly arts interview radio show broadcast statewide on Mississippi Public Broadcasting. The show features in-depth interviews with artists and others involved in creative projects in the state. The agency has recently re-launched its Mississippi Visual Arts Directory (www.msvisualarts.org), a web-based directory of individual visual artists working in the state. MAC also hosts the Folk and Traditional Arts Directory (www.arts.ms.gov/folklife), an "online file cabinet" of information on different folk artists and community traditions.

The agency also presents the Poetry Out Loud program, a poetry recitation program for high school students. POL is a national program of the National Endowment for the Arts, but MAC provides resources and hosts local and a state level contest for the program in Mississippi.

II. Program Objective:

The Arts Commission offers its non-grant technical and assistance programs in order to:

- Expand the reach of MAC to communities where there may not be an eligible grant applicant
- Provide professional development and networking opportunities for artists and organizations who present cultural activities
- Build the awareness of the arts in Mississippi

Mississippi Arts Commission Fiscal Year 2016 Budget Narrative

The Mississippi Arts Commission (MAC) was established by the Mississippi Legislature in 1968. MAC is the official grant making and service agency for the arts in the state of Mississippi. It provides grant funds and technical assistance for arts programming throughout the state. The agency works directly with a variety of groups, including arts organizations, educational institutions, local governments, as well as individual artists throughout Mississippi.

Guided by the agency's current strategic plan, MAC works to support the arts in Mississippi through four primary program areas: Community and Economic Development, Arts Industry, Arts Education and Folk and Traditional Arts. This work includes:

- Helping to guide community groups in developing a vibrant economy and improving the quality of life by using the arts and culture as a catalyst for economic development.
- Supporting and expanding the capacity of the arts presenting organizations in the state, including museums, symphony orchestras, opera companies, dance companies, and theatres. .
- Building the awareness of Mississippi's folk and traditional art forms, such as traditional fiddling, quilting, Native American traditions, woodcarving, gospel and the blues.
- Increasing the arts in schools, including expanding arts opportunities for students and providing professional development for classroom teachers on utilizing the arts to increase student achievement.

MAC is requesting a total increase of \$293,379 in General Funds for Fiscal Year 2016 to support staff position re-alignments and salary increases, funding for initial work for the state's 2017 bicentennial celebration, an increase in grant funds for communities and artists, and an estimated increase in fees from the Mississippi Management and Reporting System (MMRS).

Salaries

The greatest need in the agency is the retention of qualified and experienced staff that possesses specific training and skills for their positions. MAC is comprised of a small staff and each person performs multiple functions statewide. These staff members are underpaid for the multiple responsibilities and functions they perform. By re-classifying staff positions to provide a career ladder within the agency, staff members will have a more appropriate salary that is equivalent with the jobs and tasks they perform. MAC's Board of Commissioners voted at their spring 2014 meeting to request reclassification of 10 staff positions using existing State Personnel Board position descriptions. The positions they have requested to re-classify are:

- (1) Deputy Director I to Deputy Director II
- (1) Branch Director II to Staff Officer II
- (5) Branch Director I to Branch Director II
- Arts Industry Program Director
- Arts Education Program Director
- Community and Economic Development Program Director
- Folk & Traditional Arts Program Director
- Whole Schools Director
- (1) Fiscal Officer II to Chief Fiscal Officer
- (1) Administrative Assistant IV to Administrative Assistant V

MAC's Board also voted to request a salary increases for the Executive Director and Public Relations Director positions, which were not included in the proposed re-alignment. They were not included in the re-alignment request because sequential positions for a career ladder do not exist for the positions. These individuals also perform multiple functions encompassing several job descriptions in addition to their current job description.

Executive Director

In the spring of 2013, the MAC Board ran a search for the Executive Director position. This was to replace Malcolm White who had left the position in January of that year. The salary range for the position was advertised as \$95,000 to \$107,000. When the current Executive Director was selected and accepted the position, the salary amount was limited by SPB to a top salary of \$85,000. This came as a surprise to the new Executive Director and the Board. At the 2014 Spring Commission meeting, the Board voted unanimously to request legislative authority to uphold the original advertised salary for the Executive Director, which requires an increase of \$26,672 (fringe included).

Public Relations Director

MAC's Public Relations Director not only carries out the responsibilities of day-to-day public relations work, but also functions as the staff videographer, video editor, interviewer, and website manager. In addition to those duties, the Public Relations Director is also an event planner, organizing the Governor's Arts Awards and the Arts Day at the Capital programs. No career ladder exists for this position to be re-aligned, therefore MAC's Board is requesting a salary increase for this position of \$4,180 (including fringe).

Total Requested Salaries Increase; \$81,662

Contractual

MAC is requesting \$143,000 in the contractual object line to develop and establish an educational curriculum and presentation program in preparation for the 2017 Bicentennial of Mississippi's statehood. The funds will be used to prepare and document a history of 200 years of art and culture in Mississippi with at least five presentations across the state. The agency will also develop an in-depth curriculum on this history for use by Mississippi teachers. MAC will have multiple partners in the project including Mississippi artists, Mississippi higher education institutions, Mississippi Public Broadcasting (MPB), and community partner organizations across the state.

The Mississippi Management and Reporting System (MMRS) has informed MAC that projected contractual system fees for FY16 will increase by \$8,265. This amount is included in the total increase request for contractual items.

Total Contractual Increase Request: \$151,265

Commodities

As a part of the educational curriculum and presentation to be developed for the Bicentennial project, MAC is requesting an additional \$4,000 for printing of materials for distribution across the state for demonstrations, professional development for teachers, and instructional presentations.

MAC is requesting the continuation of a \$40,000 Transfer of Funds from MDE to support the MAC Whole Schools Summer Institute.

MAC is also requesting the continuation of \$450,000 Educational Enhancement Funds for MAC Arts in Education and Community Learning Grants and Services.
