The Enforcement Division of the Mississippi Highway Patrol is responsible for enforcing all traffic and drug laws on state and federal highways. The enforcement program includes strengthening the Enforcement Division to reduce the number of fatalities on state and federal highways and improve highway safety overall. Along with highway safety and enforcement, the Mississippi Highway Patrol is statutorily a support agency to all local municipalities and/or county law enforcement agencies. Due to recent national violent incidents, the Mississippi Highway Patrol received various calls to service requesting additional enforcement troopers to specific regions of the state in order to maintain order. Based on the aforementioned calls to service, up to 46 percent of Mississippi Highway Patrol troopers are being called from all over the state outside of their normal duties to support law enforcement agencies and the communities they are tasked to serve. The Department of Public Safety requests such additional funding in order to responsibly forecast and/or prepare for social uprising incidents, state wide emergency related incidents, and also to support training ensuring preparedness for carrying out all calls to service.

II. Program Objective:

The Enforcement Division of the Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol's objective is to increase the number of DUI arrests, seat belt citations, speeding citations and other citations for moving-hazardous violations in an effort to reduce fatalities and other high-injury producing motor vehicle crashes. The Mississippi Highway Patrol will continue its Lifesaver program which is a series of enforcement details set up in high-risk areas where unsafe drivers are ticketed and/or arrested. "Call back" details, where officers work specialized details when they would ordinarily be off-duty, will be held monthly, especially during major holiday periods. All of these programs are designed to reduce fatal and injury-producing motor vehicle crashes on state and federal highways.

The Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol has sixty (60) law enforcement officers eligible for the special compensation plan for law enforcement officers cited in FY2016 SB2500 for FY2022.

The Division of Support Services exists to support the functions of all Public Safety sub agencies. Support Services provides that support through the various offices that are part of Support Services. The various offices include Management Information Systems, Human Resources, Comptroller's Office, Asset Management, Internal Security and Print Operations and Maintenance.

More detailed information regarding the Support Services Division is found in the following areas of responsibility:

Management Information Systems

The MIS organization is responsible for day-to-day IT operations supporting approximately 1200 employees, a wide range of central site servers, storage, network communications and several large information systems that serve 50 locations throughout the state including:

The Mississippi Criminal Information Center (CIC): maintains criminal data, investigation case information and processes law enforcement inquiries across the state, nationally and internationally. MIS supports this criminal justice communications messaging function with a wide variety of systems. The messaging links all municipal, county, state, federal and international agencies for exchange of criminal justice information.

Mississippi Criminal History System (MCHS): records misdemeanor and felony arrests. This system also applicant fingerprints annually for many other state agencies and employment background checks for education, childcare, casino, banking, health care and others.

AFIS Software

The Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS) is a complex biometric identification system that provides automated computerized categorization of fingerprint information for identification (or exclusion) of individuals with criminal records. This system is at the core of information stored at the State's Criminal Information Center. The system ensures:

- a) Each individual has a single identity, regardless of name, date-of-birth, license number, social security number, etc. provided at each arrest or recorded incident.
- b) Enables CIC to provide a comprehensive rap sheet of criminal activity by linking all arrests to the single fingerprint identity.
- c) Allows MCL latent fingerprints to be compared to known criminals in the process of solving crimes.
- d) The system links into the federal FBI system for recording and searching national arrest records. Enables CIC to process applicant (non-criminal) fingerprint-based background checks that are not dependent on name, date of birth, license number, social security number, etc.
- e) These applicant transactions are background checks used to clear certain classes of government workers for employment as well as teachers, healthcare workers, social services personnel, corrections personnel, elder homecare workers, nursing home workers, daycare workers, bankers, physicians, pharmacists, nurses, casino workers and other critical positions in industry.
- f) The current AFIS has been in place since 2008 is in urgent need of replacement. Some repair hardware components are no longer available, the agency is undertaking a short-term risk mitigation project to replace those components that are replaceable. This is funded thru a federal NCHIP grant for \$283,894 with state matching funds of \$31,544.
- g) The replacement of the AFIS system has been bid and contracted, the new system will cost \$375,000 per year for eight years. The federal NCHIP grant funding will be \$337,500 with state matching of \$37,500 in FY2021 and FY2022, thereafter the state will pay the full \$375,000 per year.
- h) Support Services is requesting continued authority in Contractual Services line item for this expenditure in the amount of \$1,392,625.

Sex Offender Registry Tracking (SORT): This system manages information and compliance requirements for sex offenders required to be registered per state law. In addition to managing the offenders, this system provides offender data to the public through state and national websites and through special links to law enforcement agencies nationwide.

Uniform Crash Reporting System (Report Beam): Used law enforcement officers across the state to submit uniform crash reports involving vehicles per year.

Driver License Issuance System: This system supports customer transactions across the DPS's permanent locations and travel teams.

Driver License Administrative System: This system supports the Driver Records and Safety Responsibility divisions of the Driver Service Bureau in servicing Mississippi license and ID card holders. The system maintains all current and historical driving information, processing driving record requests for the insurance and transportation industries.

Electronic Citation Processing (eCite): MHP Officers issue approximately 250,000 citations annually. Officers are able to write multiple violations on a single entry, print the citizen a copy, and then automatically transmit the citation to the appropriate court for adjudication. This system has been expanded to include DUI citations, general affidavits, Officer Daily Activity Reporting and special shift reporting. 2017 legislation mandated the implantation of an online DUI tracking system to allow officers, district attorneys and courts to better track DUI offences.

Human Resources

Personnel transactions involving employees of the Department of Public Safety are conducted by the Central Personnel Office located at DPS Headquarters. Functions of the HR Office include advertising job openings and promotional opportunities within the organization in print, broadcast media, as well as with the State Personnel Board and the Mississippi Department of Employment Security.

Comptroller's Office

The Comptroller's Office is subdivided into offices with specific functional responsibilities. These include Payroll, Procurement, Budget and Grants, Accounts Receivable, Accounts Payable and a small administrative staff. The Comptroller's office is responsible for ensuring compliance with applicable Federal and State statutes, rules and regulations in addition to providing financial review, supervision and advice. The office provides direct support to the Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol, Support Services, the Mississippi Law Enforcement Officers' Training Academy, the Mississippi Forensics Laboratory, the Mississippi Medical Examiner's Office, the Mississippi Office of Homeland Security and Public Safety Planning with all its sub agencies. Support Services provides indirect support to the Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics.

Asset Management Office

The Asset Management Office is the custodian of the Department of Public Safety's asset records and is responsible for proper control, maintenance, use and dissemination of those records. This office is also responsible for coordinating and conducting periodic physical inventories of all assets and reporting the results of those physical inventories to the Office of the State Auditor. Currently, DPS has three employees maintaining, tracking and auditing well in excess of \$100 million in inventory statewide.

Internal Security, Printing and Mail

Internal Security is responsible for maintaining electronic access systems, security monitoring and the procurement and maintenance of the Agency's mobile phone program. The Printing and Mail Branch are further described below.

Printing Branch

The MDPS Printing Branch is a service that provides a timely and cost-effective way to fulfill the needs of the agency by supplying Driver License Manuals as well as Commercial License Manuals. Other diverse printing needs are also immediately available for the various divisions and bureaus within the Department of Public Safety.

Mail Branch

The Mail Branch processes all incoming and outgoing mail at the Department of Public Safety headquarters complex. Personnel pick-up, sort and distribute incoming mail to the agency's different branches and bureaus.

Maintenance Branch

The employees of this branch are responsible for maintaining the grounds at DPS properties, which includes but is not

The scientists in these areas of expertise employ the latest methodology on state of the art technology to develop information from items of evidence from criminal activity. Analysts prepare official reports of their scientific findings and present expert testimony in courts for the criminal justice system. The MCL analysts provide training to law enforcement officers in evidence collection techniques. The quality of scientific analyses performed in this program is evaluated and accredited by the American Association of Crime Laboratory Directors- Laboratory Accreditation Board under the international ISO 17025 standards.

The objective of this program is to provide accurate, timely scientific analysis to our clients. The results of those analyses provide the foundation for the criminal justice system to identify, apprehend, and adjudicate those individuals responsible for criminal activity.

I. Program Description:

This program was mandated in 1994 by M.C.A. 45-33-15. This statute established a forensic DNA testing Laboratory which adheres to the federal guidelines established through the Quality Assurance Standards for DNA testing issued by the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The same statute identified the MCL as responsible for the establishment of the sex offender database. This database was expanded in 2003 to include forensic profiles of all known felons. By the end of FY 19 the MCL has uploaded over 130,000 DNA profiles which syncs with the National DNA Database (NDIS). This has resulted in providing critical information in over 860 crimes not only in our State but across the country. The MCL was mandated to add all-arrestees in 2017 to this crime solving database.

II. Program Objective:

The objective of this program is to utilize a higher degree of scientific discrimination when identifying and individualizing biological stains. The testing allows evidence recovered from crime to be linked definitively to those involved in a crime.

MLEOTA teaches the students the skills necessary to accomplish these objectives.

The objective of the Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics is to reduce the availability of drugs in Mississippi, protect the State's borders by reducing the transportation in and through Mississippi, strengthen intelligence and information sharing, enhance coordination and cooperation among law enforcement agencies, strengthen the management infrastructure for State drug enforcement, and establish an effective partnership with the State Legislature and other State agencies.

(D) MBN Worker's Comp:

MBN agents and civilians put their lives on the line for citizens of the State of Mississippi. By law, MBN is required to comply with the Workers Compensation Law of Mississippi.

(E) MBN Reclassisification SWORN:

Based on SB 2500, MBN has 22 sworn agents who meet the requirement to be reclassed within the LE-Agent job class series. By reclassing these agents, this will allow MBN to achieve retention of its current employees.

MBN Sworn officers work tirelessly to protect the State's residents from drug trafficking as well as related crimes against person and property; and in doing so, they work many hours beyond their normal work hours. Therefore, MBN request funding for FLSA overtime.

The MS Bureau of Narcotics' Administrators wish to compensate Sworn personnel in the same fashion as the majority of the Sworn personnel at DPS under the David R. Huggins Act by allowing these employees to be compensated for the eleven (11) hours between 160 and 171.

(H) MBN Travel:

MBN is requesting level funding in travel and plan to use special funds to support the travel needs of administration and field personnel.

(I) MBN Contractual:

The training encompasses all jail officers in the state (county, municipal and youth detention). The Board develops and administers the curriculum and approves training delivery systems. In support of the jail officer training effort, the Board monitors compliance with the law, conducts research to ensure program applicability and assist agencies by funding of the mandated training.

II. Program Objective:

In 1999 the Legislature found that the administration of county jails (including municipal jails and youth detention facilities in the year 2000) are of statewide concern and that the activities of jail officers are important to the health, safety and welfare of the people of this state and are of such nature as to require education and training of a professional nature for jail officers.

The objective of the Board is to ensure that jail officers are selected according to high standards. Once selected, the Board intends that jail officers have the best preparation feasible to enable them to carry out their duties in a manner that protects the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of this state.

I. Program Description:

Training is the single program activity supported by the Board on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Training (BLEOST). Activities of the Board are either involved directly with training or in support of training. This training encompasses all law enforcement officers in the state including full-time and part-time officers. The BLEOST administers the curriculum at seven (7) approved full-time training academies in the state. The Board also establishes the curriculum for parttime, auxiliary/reserve officer training throughout the state. There are fifteen (15) part-time training academies in the state.

Effective July 1, 2004, the Board was charged with the responsibility for approving and reimbursing eight (8) hours of mandated in-service training for all municipal law enforcement officers in the state as well as forty (40) hours of training for new chiefs of police and twenty (20) hours of executive training for existing chiefs of police. The mandated in-service training for municipal officers increased to sixteen (16) hours per officer effective July 1, 2006 and increased to twenty-four (24) hours per officer effective July 1, 2008. Effective July 1, 2014, the Board was charged with approving and reimbursing the expense of twenty (20) hours of training for all Sheriffs.

In support of the training effort, the Board monitors compliance with the requirements of the Law Enforcement Officer Training Program (LEOTP), conducts research to ensure applicability and assists law enforcement agencies by funding a portion of the mandated training requirement.

In FY 2004, the Board began development of an agency accreditation process. This activity has assisted agencies in developing and maintaining policies and procedures, training procedures, appropriate documentation activities, etc.

II. Program Objective:

In 1981 the Legislature found that the activities of law enforcement officers are important to the health, safety, and welfare of the people of the state. Within many communities, the law enforcement officer represents government and may in fact be the only contact for a large segment of the population. As a result, the modern law enforcement officer has a far reaching, complex role in society. The scope of duties performed by law enforcement officers in our communities has been greatly expanded in recent years by changing demographic factors, rising crime rates and society's expectations.

The objective of the Board is to ensure that law enforcement candidates are selected according to high standards of education, fitness, and morals. Once selected, the Board ensures that these candidates have the best preparation feasible to enable them to carry out their duties in a manner that protects the health, safety, and welfare of all citizens of this state. By coordinating and developing training programs both at the beginning of and during an officer's career, the Board strives to keep the law enforcement officer abreast of current developments and capable of satisfying the ever-increasing needs of society.

The Board certifies law enforcement officers after they meet the hiring standards set by the Board. This certification gives the officer the powers of a peace officer. The Board monitors the actions of officers and is responsible to cancel certification if the need arises.

- Gather data to be used by legislators in the creation of future legislation regarding the operation of facilities and future improvements in juvenile detention.

- Provide leadership to assist in the direction of the juvenile detention facility and to phase in new programs and services as they become either available or necessary.
- Maintain effective public relations with other local and state agencies as well as the general public.
- Investigate incidents of mistreatment, abuse, and serious injuries or death.
