MISSISSIPPI ALCOHOL SAFETY EDUCATION PROGRAM (MASEP)

Budget Request, FY 2012

This budget request represents the estimated costs of operation for the Mississippi Alcohol Safety Education Program (MASEP) for FY 2012. This FY 2012 request represents an increase of \$29,095 (2%) over the FY 2011 budget. Each budget category was examined carefully in an effort to realize maximum program efficiency. Some adjustments, however, were made within categories in order to continue program activities at a maximum level of performance.

Approval of this budget will allow MASEP to continue to function as a mandated element of the DUI control system in Mississippi.

A. PERSONAL SERVICES

 Salaries, Wages, and Fringe Benefits MASEP is requesting \$1,087,964 in its personnel category. No increase is requested for FY2012.

An increase of 17.31% is requested in this category over the estimated expenses of FY2011.
