NARRATIVE OF FEDERAL FUNDS AWARDED TO MCVS

MCVS ADMINISTRATIVE FUNDS (100% cash/inkind match requirement - State General Funds). MCVS is awarded administrative funds annually by the Corporation for National & Community Service (CNCS) for the operation and management of national service programs in Mississippi.

MCVS is required to match 100% (pursuant to the 1993 National & Community Service Trust Act) from state monies for the administrative functioning of the agency. Federal funds allocated to Mississippi for January 1 - December 31, 2010 total \$292,814 which includes \$42,814 in supplemental funds.

PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE & TRAINING (PDAT) FUNDS (no match)

MCVS is awarded annually by the Corporation for National & Community Service funds designated for technical assistance, training events, conferences, and other educational activities. These funds are specifically targeted for Learn and Serve, AmeriCorps and Senior Corps programs. Training is offered on a wide variety of subjects-i.e., grant writing, stress management, financial management, volunteer recruitment and retention, etc. Annually the number of participants ranges from 500 to 1,200 or more. MCVS received \$129,600 in PDAT funds, plus carryover 0f \$16,730.

LEARN & SERVE AMERICA (School-Based) FUNDS (100% match)

Learn & Serve America School-Based funds are being applied for through the Corporation for National & Community Service. This committment was made to prevent jeopordizing the Learns & Serve School-based program in the State of Mississippi. MCVS will utilize these monies to sub-grant to local education agencies in support of service learning projects. Funds are dispersed to programs based on a Request For Proposals selection process performed by independent reviewers. MCVS anticipates being awarded funding in the amount of \$248,537 for local projects. The match requirement for these funds is 100% and will be derived from state general funds and support from the local education agencies. MCVS has requested a waiver of certain match requirements as it transitions this new program.

VOLUNTEER GENERATION (20% match)

Volunteer Generation funds are being applied for through the Corporation for National & Community Service. This committment will support the development of a comprehensive network of volunteer centers throughout the State of Mississippi. MCVS will utilize these monies to support local volunteer centers, connecting resources and information. Funds will be dispersed to programs based on a Request For Proposals selection process performed by independent reviewers. MCVS anticipates being awarded funding in the amount of \$296,712 for local centers. The match requirement for these funds is 20% and will be derived from state general funds and support from the local volunteer center agencies.

AMERICORPS COMPETITIVE & FORMULA FUNDS (24% match requirement)

CNCS allocates funds to MCVS annually for sub-granting projects throughout the state. MCVS is awarded funds on a population-based formula and through competitive application to CNCS. Funds are dispersed to programs based on a Request For Proposal selection process performed by independent reviewers. For FY 2010, \$6,888,604 (\$1,271,920 in formula funds and \$5,616,684) in competitive funds), was made available to MCVS, 99% of which is sub-granted to nonprofit organizations and governmental agencies to address unmet community needs in the areas of education, human needs, public safety/homeland security, and the environment. MCVS was awarded an additional \$729,698 (\$445,667 Competitive and \$284,031 Formula) American Recovery and Reinvestment Act funding to support additional AmeriCorps programs mat needs.

DISABILITY FUNDS (no match)

MCVS is an equal opportunity agency with a vested interest in furthering the ADA provisions as they relate to national service (PL 103-82) and volunteerism in general. With the availability of federal CNCS funds totaling \$281,787 (including \$193,787 supplemental funds), MCVS is able to provide a continuum of services and technical assistance

MCVS is charged with providing individuals with disabilities in local communities the skills, resources, and knowledge necessary to assure the successful integration and retention of AmeriCorps members with disabilities.

During FY2010, MCVS received \$45,000 from CNCS for its Volunteer In Service to America (VISTA) project whose focus is Disaster Preparedness and Response. There is a cost share provided by participating host sites.

Finally in FY2010, MCVS was tasked with piloting the Mississippi Case Management Consortium which assisted Hurricane Katrina victims. Case management services were provided to establishing permanent housing and job restoration for those impacted by the 2005 natural disaster. Funds totaling \$9,542,556 were expended to assist in this effort.

OTHER SPECIAL FUNDS

MCVS receives 1% in administrative funds for oversight of AmeriCorps grants. These funds are utilized for program monitoring, training and other related program charges.

Other special funds accounts are utilized for conferences, training or matching.

TREASURY FUND/BANK

TREASURY FUND/BANK ACCOUNTS

MCVS, in the past thirteen years, has generated funds through registration fees, donations, sponsorship of events, and private business support. MCVS hosts three annual training events which generate funds from registration and exhibitor fees. MCVS is also charged with hosting the annual Governor's Initiative for Volunteer Excellence (GIVE) Awards honoring exemplary state volunteers. This event attracts private businesses to donate and sponsor activities.

I. The funds generated from these events are accounted for and recorded in two separate fund accounts (1% Collections #3487, GIVE # 3478, and Donations/Contributions #3540). For FY2010, MCVS is expected to have a balance of \$99,291 in the two accounts. Since IHL is the fiscal agent for MCVS, the funds are maintained in the following account(s):

- II. MCVS, with the passage of House Bill No.1549 in the 1997 Legislative session, established a "Mississippi Commission for Volunteer Service Income Tax Check-Off Fund." Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the end of the fiscal year shall NOT lapse into the State General Fund, and any interest earned on amounts in the fund shall be deposited into the credit of the following fund: DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION/STATE TREASURER ACCOUNT #3262 Special Funds (Agency #251). Current balance is \$59,601.24. This fund is intended to promote charitable giving/donations to help local communities implement service activities to address unmet needs and implement the State Volunteer Income Tax Check-Off funds as stated and approved by HB #1549 of the 1997 Legistlative session.

I. Program Description:

In January 1994, the Mississippi Commission for National and Community Service was created by Executive Order to promote community service and volunteerism as a way to meet local needs more effectively. Through the enactment of Senate Bill 2447 in the 1996 legislative session, the Commission officially became the state office of volunteerism, to be known as the Mississippi Commission for Volunteer Service.

The mission of the Mississippi Commission for Volunteer Service (MCVS) is to engage and support Mississippians of all ages and backgrounds in service to their communities. MCVS is the official grant-making and service agency to volunteer and community service organizations in Mississippi. It administers federal funds under the National and Community Service Trust Act of 1993, which supports national and community service activities focusing on the four national/state priorities of education, health and human needs, public safety/homeland security, and environment, and under the Edward M. Kennedy Serve America Act of 2009, which reauthorized and strengthened national service laws.

To achieve this mission, MCVS promotes coalitions and collaborative efforts among public, private, nonprofit, state, and local agencies. Also, through the advancement of community service programs and resource sharing initiatives throughout the state, MCVS addresses state and local needs in education, public safety/homeland security, health, and the environment. Since Hurricane Katrina, MCVS has also played a large role in volunteer programming for the recovery of the Gulf Coast and in providing volunteer coordination support to local agencies and the State in times of disaster. Direct and demonstrable results are being achieved through fostering civic responsibility, strengthening the ties that bind us together as Mississippians, and providing educational opportunities for those who make a substantial commitment to service.

II. Program Objective:

MCVS-IHL FY2011-2015 goals as outlined below will establish a foundation on which to build a unified service delivery approach which will enhance the educational, economic, and societal outcomes of the state of Mississippi. The IHL Goals and priorities that MCVS will foster and implement are as follows:

Goal 1 - Secure stable funding from the state.

This goal will be implemented through collaboration with IHL during the Legislative Budget Hearings and 2010 Legislative Session. Funding coordination with IHL will enhance a unified approach to the Legislature.

Goal 2 - Implement the Ayers settlement.

This goal does not apply to MCVS.

Goal 3 - Provide high quality instructional programs that are affordable, accessible and student-centered. This goal will be implemented through our AmeriCorps Education Awards, which provide \$5,350 scholarships for a full year's service in AmeriCorps. National service members serving in Mississippi in the 2009-2010 program earned \$2,257,239 for use at colleges and universities or to repay existing student loans.

Goal 4 - Provide support programs and services that enhance student recruiting and retention, of degrees, and attainment of student goals.

This goal will be implemented through our various national service programs in the state that foster student service initiatives, including the Learn & Serve America program and the YES! Program curriculum, as well as though member attainment of AmeriCorps Education Awards.

Goal 5 - Encourage research and creative activities to enhance instruction, generate new knowledge, and contribute to economic development.

This goal will be implemented through our various national service programs, especially the Learn & Serve America program, the AmeriCorps VISTA project which empowers members to fight poverty with passion, and the numerous training and technical assistance workshops conducted by our office.

Goal 6 - Provide informal education, technical assistance, and other public services that respond to societal needs. This goal will be implemented through our various national service programs, the numerous training and technical assistance workshops conducted by our office, and the network of community-based volunteer centers across the state.

This goal will be implemented through MCVS' existing policy of creating local partnerships, fostering joint ventures/programs, leveraging human and fiscal resources amongst partners, and building a unified service delivery approach. This approach has proven effective in hurricane recovery efforts on the Gulf Coast.

Goal 10 - Enhance public awareness and support of IHL programs and services. This goal will be implemented with MCVS' existing outreach efforts through public service announcements, media advertisements, state and local presentations, newsletters, website (www.mcvs.org), and other promotional activities.

MCVS program priorities focus on the six current major categories of Finance & Administration; Program Management & Development; Communication & Training; Resource Development; Volunteer Center Development; and Disaster Preparedness, Response, and Recovery. These areas are defined as follows:

Finance & Administration will include conducting sub-grantee fiscal monitoring and evaluations; preparing quarterly financial reports on program activities in a timely and accurate manner; maintaining appropriate financial management systems to disburse funds and track commission and program expenditures according to legal and grant requirements; processing and reviewing monthly program reimbursements; evaluating whether programs comply with legal, reporting, financial management, and grant requirements and ensuring follow through on issues; reviewing audit reports on programs and ensuring that programs take appropriate and timely action; providing ongoing fiscal training and technical assistance to programs; ensuring grant compliance with federal, state, and local guidelines; and other grant administration duties.

Program Management & Development will include coordinating the grant review process to select high quality national service programs utilizing peer and staff grant reviewers; conducting sub-grantee programmatic monitoring and evaluation; assessing impact/outcome results of programs' goals and objectives; writing and disseminating progress reports of program activities; conducting program site visits and review of records at least annually; providing ongoing technical assistance to programs; ensuring grant compliance with federal, state, and local guidelines; acquiring and disseminating national, regional, and local "best practices," innovative service models, and/or information to Mississippi programs; and other program management activities.

Communication & Training activities include coordinating observances of national volunteer recognition days on a statewide level; strengthening volunteer service infrastructure and maximizing resources in the state by collaborating with other governmental, private, and nonprofit organizations; developing and distributing a monthly eNewsletter on service activities in the state; developing and implementing communication and marketing strategies; creating high-quality communication and marketing materials; assisting national service programs, volunteer centers, and other partners in identifying and accessing local and national training and technical assistance resources; establishing and maintaining a comprehensive updated website (www.mcvs.org) for resource sharing, information dissemination, data collection, and training opportunities; and coordinating conferences and other training and technical assistance events for national service programs and other volunteer groups.

Resource Development activities include developing and implementing Board governance policies and plans; securing and sustaining corporate sponsors for MCVS programs such as the Governor's Initiative for Volunteer Excellence (GIVE) Awards, conferences, and other MCVS efforts; strengthening volunteer service infrastructure and maximizing resources in the state by collaborating with other governmental, private, and nonprofit organizations; assisting the Board of Commissioners in hosting the annual "Tee It Up for Mississippi Volunteers!" golf tournament benefiting Mississippi volunteer coordination infrastructure; building strong and lasting relationships through personal contacts with the traditional volunteer sector, the nonprofit sector, (local, state, and national) government, businesses,

foundation communities, and the public; promoting the income tax checkoff to benefit MCVS as provided by the Legislature in the 1997 session; marketing the "Volunteer Y'all" license plates which also benefit MCVS; and acting as a catalyst for positive community change, encouraging innovative ideas and programs that address community needs through service and volunteerism.

Volunteer Center Development will include marketing the concept and benefits of community volunteer centers to nonprofit and government entities across the state, assisting interested entities in developing proposals for new volunteer centers, coordinating training and technical assistance for volunteer center staff and AmeriCorps VISTA members, assisting volunteer centers in meeting standards set by the Points of Light Foundation/Hands on Network's Volunteer Center National Network, assisting volunteer centers with implementation of volunteer management systems, and conducting site visits and program review to assure the development of high-performing volunteer centers.

Disaster Preparedness, Response, and Recovery activity centers on the appropriate use of volunteers and donated goods in times of disaster in Mississippi. Activities include ensuring that all volunteer agencies working in a disaster setting comply with all local, state and federal orders and regulations, working in a coordinated and collaborative effort with responding non-governmental organizations and local agencies, and efficiently and equitably distributing donated goods and funds; ensuring that MCVS is internally prepared for a disaster that debilitates primary personnel, office space, equipment, data, and services; coordinating the establishment of a permanent State disaster Recovery Fund; working in other states through the Emergency Management Assistance Compact should disaster assistance be requested; and ensuring that all MCVS national service resources and programs are compatible with any disaster deployment plans of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency, the Federal Emergency Management Agency and the Corporation for National and Community Service.

III. Current program activities as supported by the funding in Columns 5-12 (FY09 Estimated & FY10 Increase/Decrease for continuations) of MBR-1-03 and designated Budget Unit Decisions columns of MBR-1-03-A:

Administration, PDAT & Disability: MCVS is awarded federal dollars through the Corporation for Naitonal and Community Service (CNCS) for Commission Administration, Program Development, Assistance, and Training (PDAT), and Disability Inclusion. 2010 MCVS commission administration funds total \$292,814, with a total 1 to 1 non-federal match requirement of \$292,814; the commission administrative performance objective is to engage in outreach to organizations that may be interested in operating AmeriCorps programs, and convene and collaborate with volunteering and service entities within the state as outlined in the Mississippi state service plan, a partnership of MCVS, the Mississippi State Program Office of the Corporation for National and Community Service, the Mississippi Department of Education, Campus Compact, the Mississippi Center for Nonprofits and the AmeriCorps National Civilian Community Corps (NCCC) Southern Regional Campus. CNCS routinely selects a certain number of states each year to undergo an audit by its Office of the Inspector General. The audit includes not only examination of the State Commission systems, but those of its sub-grantees as well. MCVS was selected for an audit which began in late 2006 and concluded in May, 2008, with MCVS receiving a clear management decision.

In 2010, PDAT funds awarded to MCVS in the amount of \$144,600 are supporting planning sessions of the newly-formed Mississippi National Service Cross-Stream Council comprised of Mississippi state service plan partners and national service stakeholders, a series of public information and listening sessions held around the state to increase access to national service resources, customized training experiences for AmeriCorps, Learn & Serve AmeriCorps and Senior Corps program staff, and educational conferences promoting personal and professional development for national service members.

Disability inclusion funds totaling \$281,787 for 2010 are obligated for the convening of a statewide Disability Inclusion Team, planning and implementation of the fourth annual Connect One Disaster Summit bringing together disability agencies, first responders and health care providers for preparedness planning and resource sharing, an evaluative assessment of Mississippi national service programs regarding accessibility issues in partnership with the Institute for Disability Studies at Mississippi's University Center for Excellence in Developmental Disabilities, training for a variety of audiences in disability inclusion practices, and administration of mini-grants for organizations enhancing Make a Difference Day projects through disability inclusion.

AmeriCorps State & National: As a grant-making entity, MCVS administers federal dollars devoted to AmeriCorps, the domestic Peace Corps program, which provides full-time members working to "get things done" in local

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communities with a modest living stipend and an education award of \$5,350 upon completion of 1,700 hours of service. In the 2010-11 program year, there will be over 1,173 AmeriCorps members serving in communities all over the state (all 82 Mississippi counties were served in 2009-10); a minimum of 673 of these AmeriCorps positions will be operated under direct MCVS administrative oversight. MCVS is awarded funds on a population-based formula and through competitive application to the CNCS. Funds are disbursed to programs based on a Request for Proposals selection process performed by independent reviewers. For the 2010, 11 program year, MCVS has been awarded.

selection process performed by independent reviewers. For the 2010-11 program year, MCVS has been awarded \$10,947,635 (\$1,755,944 in formula funds and \$9,191,691 in competitive funds), 99% of which is sub-granted to nonprofit organizations and governmental agencies to address unmet community needs. The remaining 1% is used to administer, monitor, and support these local programs.

AmeriCorps VISTA (Volunteers in Service to America): The Mississippi Disaster Preparedness and Response Project is the AmeriCorps VISTA project managed by MCVS, with a team of 49 VISTAs sited throughout the state serving at faith-based and community organizations (FBCOs), institutions of higher education, and local government agencies. VISTA is a federal anti-poverty program administered by the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS). VISTA provides full-time volunteers (VISTAs) to support projects at nonprofit, grassroots organizations and local government agencies that operate programs to help alleviate poverty in the United States. VISTAs strengthen and support these organizations by improving their infrastructure, expanding community partnerships, securing long-term resources, training program participants, and developing other activities that help build long-term sustainability for overcoming poverty. The project is coordinated by MCVS staff with the assistance of two VISTA Leaders. VISTAs placed with this project engage their communities and local leaders in preparing for and responding to disasters, and implement volunteer generation and management programs. Launched in 2005 in response to Hurricane Katrina, the Mississippi Disaster Preparedness and Response Project has deployed over 100 VISTAs across the state, who've left a tremendous impact by recruiting over 11,152 volunteers who have served almost 258,000 hours in their communities, an economic contribution estimated by Independent Sector at \$3.6 million. MCVS AmeriCorps VISTAs have also leveraged \$1.2 million through writing grants, fundraising, and securing in-kind donations. Federal support for MCVS AmeriCorps VISTA members serving in Mississippi totals \$764,045, in the form of modest living stipends and educational awards; \$45,000 of operating support dollars are granted to MCVS for project management, which cover most of the salary and fringe benefits for one staff program manager; and MCVS contributes a non-federal program match of \$14,953.

Youth Programming: MCVS's Youth Engaged in Service (YES!) Program launched a redesigned comprehensive curriculum in 2009. YES! Is a year-long, intense civic engagement and service learning program for high school students. MCVS has made the YES! Curriculum available online at www.mcvs.org at no charge for other youth programs to utilize, adapting it to suit their needs. Additionally, at the request of the Mississippi Department of Education, in the 2010-11 program year MCVS will begin administration of population formula-based Learn & Serve K-12 funding designated for sub-granting to school districts to engage students in service activities linked to academic achievement and civic responsibility. (See Section IV. Additional Program Activities)

Volunteer Generation Program: In fall 2010, MCVS will join the first round of recipients nationally awarded a Volunteer Generation Fund grant, authorized by the Kennedy Serve America Act and administered by CNCS. The Mississippi Volunteer Generation program is designed to significantly increase the state's volunteer rate by strengthening and/or developing regional volunteer connector organizations (volunteer centers) who operate as local volunteer hubs for their communities. Investment in volunteer infrastructure generates a substantial return for the state; in 2009, 457,500 volunteers served 61.1 million hours in Mississippi, valued by Independent Sector as an economic contribution of \$1.2 billion. This impressive re-investment in Mississippi communities has been achieved with just 6 volunteer centers functioning in varying degrees of efficiency as a connector organization, and there is much opportunity for further development of valuable volunteer resources, as Mississippi ranks just 47th in the national volunteer rate index. Volunteer centers in less populated, poorer regions of the state have struggled to continue their original purpose of connecting volunteers; while volunteer centers in more heavily populated areas, where funding was more accessible through Katrina Disaster Recovery efforts, have continued to connect and manage volunteers while offering capacity-building training to local partners. The federal award to MCVS of \$270,000 requires a non-federal match commitment of \$99,018. The majority of funds (67%) will be sub-granted to community-based volunteer centers, through a competitive request for proposals process, for increasing capacity to engage more volunteers. 33% of funds will be spent for direct support of volunteer center efforts through personalized monitoring, training, consulting, and statewide volunteerism promotion.

Disaster Preparedness & Response: MCVS has been designated by the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency (MEMA) to be the responsible agency for the Emergency Support Function (ESF) #6 (Mass Care, Housing, and

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Human Services) Volunteers and Donations Management Annexes of the Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan (CEMP) for the State of Mississippi. On the morning of April 24, 2010, an F-4 tornado tore through Central Mississippi causing extensive damage to Issaquena, Warren, Yazoo, Attala, Holmes, Monroe, Oktibbeha, and Choctaw counties. MCVS was on the scene in Yazoo City that afternoon to evaluate the damage. On Sunday, a Volunteer Reception Center (VRC) was opened at the former Yazoo Motors. MCVS partnered with many faith-based and non-profit disaster response groups from all across the country to work the tornado disaster, and tapped into our network of national service partners, mobilizing AmeriCorps State members (from Mississippi, Missouri & Washington), AmeriCorps NCCC teams, AmeriCorps VISTA members, Senior Corps participants. Assemblies of God Mississippi Disaster Response shared space for the VRC in their Command Center. Monday afternoon, God's Pit Crew, a disaster response team from Virginia, began mass distribution of goods to the public. Over the next 5 days, 300,000 lbs. of goods (ice, water, tarps, non-perishable foods, etc.) were distributed to the citizens of Yazoo and surrounding counties, and other distribution staging areas were soon established. Also on Monday, prior to volunteers being allowed into disaster areas, MCVS began registering volunteers and accepting requests for assistance from affected residents. Once search and rescue operations were completed and roads were clear enough to allow volunteers to begin work, volunteer crews began working in the Yazoo county area. MCVS staff members expanded volunteer coordination operations into Holmes, Attala and Choctaw counties, setting up VRCs in Holmes and Choctaw. One week later, another tornado went through several counties in Northern Mississippi. MCVS deployed to Tippah and Benton counties and set up a VRC at the Ashland Volunteer Fire Department to register and deploy volunteers. This VRC was open from May 6-14 and then MCVS staff, volunteers and national service members moved directly to Corinth, setting up the VRC in that area for two additional weeks of service due to flooding. As the immediate response to the tornado and flooding evolved into the long term recovery phase, MCVS convened faith-based and community organizations and local agencies to facilitate the formation of an on-going Long-Term Recovery committee. From April 24, 2010 to May 25, 2010, MCVS deployed volunteers to work in the affected counties as follows:

The Deepwater Horizon Oil Spill has presented a uniquely challenging set of circumstances for volunteer coordination, and the Mississippi Commission for Volunteer Service (MCVS) has responded by providing systems, infrastructure, and personnel allowing for the organization and tracking of volunteers and their work. MCVS, in coordination with MEMA, has been designated by BP and the United States Coast Guard (USCG) as the Coordinating Agency for volunteers. MCVS has accepted the task of registering, coordinating, and mobilizing volunteers in response to the oil spill. The complex nature of this incident coupled with the health and safety concerns limits the roles of volunteers. Volunteers will not be engaging in any activity that puts them directly in contact with oil or oil-contaminated material. MCVS is coordinating with state and local government and non-government stakeholders to ensure volunteers are effectively utilized and deployed for appropriate volunteer activities conducive with oil spill response efforts. MCVS has partnered with the United Way of South Mississippi and Hands On Mississippi to operate three Volunteer Response Centers in the coastal counties. MCVS has daily staff representation at the Unified Command post in Mobile and coordinates regularly with the BP Volunteer Coordinator for MS. All volunteer activity is cleared through Unified Command and local emergency management agencies. Daily volunteer tracking reports are submitted for the ICP Mobile Situation Brief. www.mcvs.org is designated as the principal venue for people interested in volunteer activities in Mississippi associated with the Oil Spill and offers links to the volunteer registration and tracking software utilized for the response. More than 5200 individuals have registered as of July 2010 to serve in the Mississippi response. One feature program recognized by an oil spill veteran USCG Captain as a replicable model is the Mississippi Coast Watch program, whereby over 100 trained volunteers are coordinated and deployed for daily dawn beach surveys to observe

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and report signs of oil. Coast Watch volunteers have covered a cumulative total of 1474 miles of observed shoreline, over a total of 3393 hours. Oiled shoreline and oiled/distressed wildlife incidents are reported each morning through a dedicated line at Unified Command and directly to local Emergency Management Agency directors for the swiftest deployment of clean-up and rehabilitation workers to affected areas. Over ten other volunteer activities are currently on-going and under development in support of the Oil Spill response. MCVS has sponsored four AmeriCorps NCCC teams for Volunteer Response Center operations support and Coast Watch volunteer coordination, some of which will be active on the Mississippi Gulf Coast in volunteer coordination through October 2010. Additionally, four AmeriCorps VISTA members are scheduled to enter one year terms of service to confront long term issues generated by the Oil Spill. These members will be involved in community outreach, volunteer coordination, and program development through September 2011. MCVS has received \$100,000 in direct funding from BP as reimbursement for costs related to volunteer efforts in response to the oil spill. Of this, \$20,000 is designated as sub-grant money for Volunteer Response Center operational costs incurred by partner nonprofits. Expenditures are tracked and reported to BP bimonthly. Expenditures to date include sub-grants to nonprofit partners, staff salaries, travel, and limited supplies/technology services. As of July, MCVS will be utilizing the BP government claims process for staff and travel expenditures in any ongoing response efforts.

MCVS has relied almost exclusively on federal and private funding for highly active period of disaster response activity from April 2010 to the present. Designated state funding to support one disaster response staff position and a modest budget for training and convening stakeholders will ensure continued excellence in effective volunteer coordination for local and state disaster preparation and response.

AmeriCorps NCCC: The National Civilian Community Corps (NCCC) is a branch of AmeriCorps which is a residential program at five campuses across the country. Members travel to communities in an assigned eleven state region, performing services in a wide variety of areas including environmental projects, tutoring, housing, and disaster response. In the years post-Hurricane Katrina, NCCC members have maintained a constant presence along the Gulf Coast and have been invaluable to those communities. Since early in its history, the former MCVS Executive Director advocated strongly with Congress to create a campus in Mississippi, primarily because its proximity to the Gulf would allow members to be available for disaster response literally within hours. In the 2008 Labor-HHS Appropriation, Congress did include \$2.5 million in renovation/constructing funding for a campus to be located in Vicksburg. A total of 160 members have resided at the AmeriCorps National Civilian Community Corps Southern Regional Campus during the 2009-10 program year; that number will double for next year. These teams have provided many valuable services with many nonprofit sponsors across the state and have become an integral part of Mississippi's emergency response resources, with seven teams of 10-13 members each responding to the April tornado in central Mississippi and the flooding immediately thereafter in the northeast of the state. Additional disaster response activity in Mississippi by AmeriCorps members, including NCCC, is discussed in the previous disaster preparedness and response section of this narrative.

Budget increases necessary to continue on-going services across the MCVS program portfolio include non-federal match requirement dollars; additional travel for staff training purposes and more grantee monitoring; more contractual services to support services that can not be provided by MCVS staff such as database development; additional supplies for training and services; upgraded equipment for use by office staff; and grants to volunteer centers and youth programs to build capacity of needed programs.

IV. Additional program activities that will result from increased funding requested in Columns 13-20 (MBR-1-03) and specified Budget Decision Unit columns (MBR-1-03-A):

The 2009 passage of the Serve America Act has offered a number of opportunities to bring federal dollars to Mississippi communities to address unmet needs. MCVS has submitted several successful proposals this year for new and re-aligned funding anticipated to generate in the 2010-11 program year 6 Volunteer Generation Fund sub-grants for community organizations, enhancing and continuing the MCVS volunteer center development program, and 10 service learning sub-grants for K-12 school districts. (See Section III. Current Program Activities for Volunteer Generation Fund activity.)

Learn & Serve America: This CNCS initiative provides an on-ramp to a lifetime of civic engagement for over 7,700 Mississippi students each year. At the request of the Mississippi Department of Education and CNCS, in the 2010-11 program year MCVS will begin administration of population formula-based Learn & Serve K-12 funding designated for sub-granting to school districts to engage students in service activities linked to academic achievement and civic

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responsibility. Service learning improves communities while developing the lifelong habit of service in young people. There is a one to one match for these federal funds. The resulting program budget of \$497,074 will offer a total of \$364,285 in direct sub-grants for approximately 10 Mississippi school districts (inclusive of sub-grantee match). Learn & Serve America program efforts will be aligned with MCVS' state service plan partners, Campus Compact (Mississippi's Learn & Serve America - Higher Education grantee) through representation on the Mississippi National Service Cross-Stream Council, and the Mississippi Department of Education, through representation on the MCVS Board of Commissioners by statute.

MCVS serves three major functions for the State of Mississippi.

- 1. National Service Funding: AmeriCorps, Learn and Serve, Senior Corps. MCVS is the agency responsible (either thorough direct fund management or through indirect coordination) for the \$25M in Federal funds that Mississippi received this year through our parent federal agency, the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS.) These programs and services include AmeriCorps, Senior Corps, and Learn and Serve America. [**1-By comparison, the State of Alabama only received \$12M from those same funding sources this year.] On a per capita basis, this makes Mississippi number five in the nation for successfully securing CNCS dollars in support of communities in our state. Most assuredly, this is related to the confidence that CNCS has in MCVS to utilize these funds effectively. (Each year MCVS receives supplemental federal dollars from CNCS-these are generally funds that other states could not accept, often due to either lack of ability to provide required match or lack of staffing resources to manage the funds.) The confidence that CNCS has in MCVS is directly related to the importance that the Mississippi legislature gives to supporting MCVS through state funding. [**2-Critical to note is that the general fund level of approximately \$500,000 that MCVS receives from the Mississippi legislature brings about \$50 return for every dollar that Mississippi puts into MCVS.] [**3- These federal funds support a wide array of important community programs including Teach for America, Boys and Girls Clubs, Habitat for Humanity, Learn and Serve programs in MS schools, America Reads Mississippi, various university programs, and the new AmeriCorps*NCCC Vicksburg campus-one of only five in our nation.]
- 2. Disaster Preparedness and Response. MCVS has been increasingly called upon to direct and coordinate disaster preparedness and response activities through volunteerism and national service (AmeriCorps). MCVS has been actively deployed seven days a week since the April 24th tornado that affected a large portion of our state. We have operated, supported and coordinated nine different Volunteer Response Centers, including three on the coast that are still serving the oil spill response needs in our three coastal counties. [The management of the volunteer response for the tornado counties results in direct reimbursement value to those affected communities of over \$500,000.] MCVS is a critical element of Mississippi's Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan (CEMP) with an active seat at the Emergency Operations Center to coordinate both volunteers and the management of emergency donations.
- 3. State-wide Volunteer Coordination. MCVS is the state agency responsible for supporting and coordinating volunteerism throughout the entire state. Under the Serve America Act, Mississippi was the very first state to hire a state Volunteer Officer, and is among the very first states in the nation to receive notification of funding through the Volunteer Generation Fund (an appropriation made possible by both Presidential support and the support of Senator Cochran.)

Mentioned in number 1 (above) was the funding for K-12 through the Learn and Serve Grant. This grant provides approximately \$\frac{1}{4}M\$ for Mississippi that supports teachers throughout our state who find innovative and meaningful ways to combine classroom learning with opportunities for students to engage in giving back to their communities. Mississippi was in danger of losing this program this year (previously coordinated by the Mississippi Department of Education) if MCVS had not agreed to take over and manage the program. The grant requires a 1:1 state funding match.

A final critical element for our lawmakers to consider is that through all of the programs mentioned above, there is over \$8.5M allocated directly for colleges and universities this year. These are funds received as education awards for people who participate in volunteering and service, and they can be used either to pay back student loans or for continuing education.

In the spring of 2010, the leadership team of MCVS, along with the 23 Commissioners from around the state was facing a dilemma. We had reached the elastic limit of stretching the \$516K that Mississippi appropriates to MCVS in terms of match dollars and administration activities that had resulted in a one year increase from \$18M (last year) to \$25M (current year). In addition, our federal appropriators had provided funding for growth of all of these programs (to the states that could provide the required match dollars.) Add to this the request that MCVS take over the Learn and Serve grant for Mississippi classrooms (requiring additional match), and the opportunity for Mississippi to coordinate a Volunteer Generation Fund grant (requiring a 20% match) that would support nonprofits, libraries,

volunteer fire departments and other community organizations. Add once again to this equation the fact that the same staff that was working on these important developments was now tasked to work well beyond a normal work week to support the disaster and oil spill response needs across our state-and you can begin to see the challenge that MCVS faced.

The one disaster that the agency could never have prepared for was the possibility that the state budget level of approximately \$516,000 would be cut by a full 30%. There is no contingency plan for such a small agency, running so very lean, and already tasking its employees (and its Commissioners) to give well over 100%. MCVS works under state fiscal calendar and Federal fiscal calendar cycles, as well as numerous program and grant cycles throughout the year, meaning that our leadership team and Commissioners must assume something close to standard funding levels in advance budgeting and strategic planning. When we learned of the drastic cut, we had already committed to supporting volunteers through the Volunteer Generation Fund grants; we had already been notified that Mississippi classrooms would lose \$250,000 if MCVS did not take over the Learn and Serve grant; and as servants of our fellow Mississippians, we had no choice but to work the long hours, giving up Mother's Day, Father's Day, Memorial Day and Independence Day with our families to meet the needs of dozens of communities in the wake of back-to-back disasters.

Based on the dedication and services that MCVS staff and Commissioners have provided in connecting diverse community needs with volunteers and federal service programs to meet those needs, MCVS will forge through the drastic budget cut for 2011 and exhaust all available resources to support community activities with minimal disruption of services to those communities. We have requested the maximum allowable waiver for Federal funds from CNCS. The decision to move forward without cutting services places MCVS in a precarious position, however. While still providing the taxpayers of the State of Mississippi with nearly a 50 to 1 return on investment for state general fund dollars, continued operations for the agency for 2012 (without program loss and return of federal funds) will require a General Fund allocation for 2012 in the amount of \$708,309.

Justification for this request is as follows:

\$516,213 for minimum funds required to operate at 2009 level.

\$124,268 for required federal match for the \$250,000 Learn and Serve Classroom Funding. (match to be reduced in subsequent years.)

\$34,099 for required match of \$270,000 in Federal Volunteer Generation Grant Funding.

\$33,729 for administrative fees to IHL for fiscal and overhead support.

This results in a total funding need of \$708,309 for operations in 2012.

You will note that minimal amounts are applied to salary, travel and commodities. The majority of the funding will be contractual, allowing MCVS to obtain

a competitive "best return on investment" for such required services as web and database development, etc. The slight increases in salary and travel are required portions for support of the Federal grants.

Salary costs would increase by \$45,739 to provide staff support for increased federal programs (Learn & Serve America and Volunteer Generation). Travel costs would increase by \$15,020 to provide travel dollars for increased federal program staff. Contractual costs would increase by \$89,792 to provide services (evaluation, assessments other) for the increased federal programs. Finally, subsidy costs would increase by \$63,750 to provide support for increased federal program participants.
