## FEDERAL FUNDS

All federal grant funds are sought by the individual departments of the College. The College hired a grant writer to assist in this process in FY2010. These funds play a major role in the services that are provided to our students. As a result of Title III funds, the college has just begun renovations of a building on the Utica campus to allow for a health and wellness facility. This facility will provide the community and the campus with a modern facility for teaching and opportunities for the students and employees to improve their health in rural Hinds County.

The federal college work study program provides funds for many of our students, who might not be able to attend college, if this program was not available.

Our special services grant provides counseling and tutoring to the high school students on weekends and during the summer. In these sessions, the students are introduced to the college environment and are made aware of many programs available to these students.

## STATE SUPPORT SPECIAL FUNDS

The EEF and ARRA monies were very important to community colleges in these difficult times. The EEF funds allowed Hinds to continue without making significant cuts to employees and their salaries. The ARRA funds allowed the college to receive reimbursement for most of our utility payments. This allowed the College to have the resources necessary to handle a double digit spike in enrollment.

## **OTHER SPECIAL FUNDS**

The Appropriation of special funds for community colleges help allow us to offer many programs that would not be feasible without support. For example, our workforce development center and our sign lanugage interpreter programs would not be possible without those special funds. The special funds are needed to provide worthwhile programs for our many communities.

#### **TREASURY FUND/BANK**

These funds do include restricted funds which can only be used for the purposes outlined in the grant documents.

1 - INSTRUCTION PROGRAM NAME

#### I. Program Description:

Academic instruction includes formally organized instructional activities based on courses in the Mississippi Community/Junior College Uniform Course Numbering System and Associate Degree Nursing. This includes fall and spring semesters and summer terms and is frequently referred to as university-transfer or college parallel courses.

Career and Technical instruction includes organized programs of study at less than a baccalaureate degree level designed to provide occupational preparation for entry/advancement/reassignment in (to) the labor market. These programs are approved by the SBCJC, and typically lead to a Certificate of Completion or an Associate of Applied Sciences degree.

Community and Junior Colleges offer a number of instruction activities other than Academic, Technical and Vocational programs. These formally organized instructional activities include adult basic education and GED preparatory courses; industry services or start-up, up-grade or retraining; secondary school vocational courses, apprenticeships training, special interest and personal improvement courses.

#### II. Program Objective:

The objective of Academic Instruction is to provide affordable access to courses at the freshman and sophomore level, in the Associate Degree Nursing Program, for personal improvement and personal interest, and to award the associate degree to those who successfully complete the required courses of study. This objective is based on Secton 37-29-1, MCA.

The objective of Career and Technical instruction is to educate, train, and provide guidance for individuals who seek to develop knowledge, skill, and behavioral characteristics necessary for successful employment in occupations not requiring a baccalaureate degree. The program provides a unique opportunity to help students develop the characteristics of success that today's business and industry embrace: clarity of purpose, emphasis on quality, teamwork, a broad technical and academic foundation for effective problem solving, decision-making, and communicaiton at the work site.

In accordance with Section 37-29-1 - to provide to individuals and groups educational measures to help make them capable of living satisfactory lives, consistent with ideals of a democratic society. The instructional objective of the other programs noted above is to provide specially designed programs to targeted populations to meet educational and trainging needs of citizens.

III. Current program activities as supported by the funding in Columns 6-15 (FY 11 Estimated & FY 12 Increase/Decrease for continuations) of MBR-1-03 and designated Budget Unit Decisions columns of MBR-1-03-A:

## (D) Fund Shift Dt. Serv. to Fo:

The College request this shift from the debt service fund to the general funding formula since the debt has been retired.

## (E) Fund Shift ARRA to GF:

The College requests this special funding from the ARRA be added to the general fund appropriation.

#### (H) Workforce Development Cent:

The college requests funding for additional training opportunities and help offset some of the increased costs associated with providing training at the workforce development center.

#### (I) Workforce Equipment:

The college requests additional funding for our workforce centers to purchase the latest technology and training equipment to prepare our students for a changing workplace.

## (J) Advanced Training Centers:

The College requests additional funds for training opportunities and increased costs associated with the operations of the Advanced Training Centers.

## (K) High Cost Programs:

The College requests additional funding for high cost programs. In particular, the nursing allied programs face accreditation reviews on a regular basis and the college struggles to keep their equipment current and the program adequately supplied.

## (L) Train Additional ADN(s):

The College requests additional funding to hire new ADN instructors to increase the capacity of our ADN programs. In our district, we are still seeing the need for more graduates in this field. These additional funds would allow us to meet some of this demand and provide an excellent career for our students.

#### (M) Dropout Recovery Initiativ:

The College requests additional funding to have resources available to provide high school dropouts with training and support services. We believe the initiative would increase the likelihood for employment and education. We will use the resources to offer short term training, support services like childcare, transportation, stipends for fuel, and mentoring.

#### (N) Career & Tech Equipment:

The College requests additional funding to purchase updated equipment for many of our career and technical programs. These programs face accreditation reviews on a regular basis and the college struggles to keep their equipment current and the programs adequately supplied.

#### (O) MS Entreprenurial Alliance:

The College requests funding for a new position that would help entreprenuers find a way to start and run their own business. The position would partner with MDA and MDES to provide training and education to the community.

#### (P) New Career/Tech Program(s):

The College requests this funding to allow us to meet the current needs or our programs while developing career and technical program opportunities in areas of technology and job growth.

## (Q) Performance Based Funding:

The College requests funding for student incentives to take and complete national skills certification tests. The appropriation would be used to pay the costs of the National Certification tests and would provide rewards to institutions to prepare students with innovative ideas and the latest technology.

#### (R) Work-Based Learning - C&T:
